While the State Governments compile this data at the district/ State level, Directorate General of Employment (DGE) compiles and publishes the data at national level.

The present publication, 20<sup>th</sup> in series, contains annual and time series data on various fields of activities of the Employment Exchanges such as registration, placement, live register, submission, etc. Efforts have been made to make the publication as up-to-date as possible. I hope this will meet the growing need of manpower planners, job-seekers, employers and other users.

3. The publication has been possible only with the active support and co-operation of the State Governments/Union Territory Administrations. I am grateful to the Directors/Officers-in-charge of Employment of various States/Union Territories and their officials in the Employment Exchanges for furnishing the information in the prescribed format.

## HIGHLIGHTS

This report is based on the information collected through various statistical returns of different periodicity from Employment Exchanges located across the country. Some of the key findings are stated below:

### A) EMPLOYMENT EXCHANGES

- According to the report, there were 997 Employment Exchanges including University Employment Information and Guidance Bureau at the beginning of January, 2016.
- Among 997 Employment Exchanges, 42 were Special Employment Exchanges for Differently abled and 38 were Special Cells dealing with Differently abled.
- Out of 997 Employment Exchanges, 76 were University Employment Information and Guidance Bureau.
- There were 14 Employment Exchanges for Professional and Executive (P&E) and 5 Employment Exchanges were exclusively for women.

### B) LIVE REGISTER

- According to the report, 433.76 lakh persons were reported to be total job seekers on the live register of employment exchanges in the country at the end of December 2016. Among 433.76 lakh job-seekers, 157.31 lakh job-seekers were women.
- Among 435.03 lakh job seekers as on 31.12.2015, 70.48 lakh job seekers belonged to Scheduled Castes, 25.22 lakh job seekers to Scheduled Tribes and 113.99 lakh to Other Backward Classes.
- Total differently abled job seekers on the live register were 6.89 lakh at the end of December 2015.
- Total job seekers belonging to youth (15-29 years) on the live register were 279.33 lakh at end of December, 2015.
- Total job seekers belonging to Minority Communities on the live register were 60.47 lakh at the end of 2015.



### **C) EDUCATED LIVE REGISTER**

- Total 397.09 lakh educated job seekers (10<sup>th</sup> standard and above) were registered on live register of employment exchanges at the end of December, 2015.
- Among 397.09 lakh educated job-seekers, 137.75 lakh were women.
- Among educated job seekers, the Scheduled Castes were 62.20 lakh and the Scheduled Tribes were 21.10 lakh.

### **D) VACANCIES NOTIFIED**

- Total numbers of vacancies notified during the year 2016 (January to December) were 1401.4 thousand.
- Total numbers of vacancies notified during the year 2015 were 810.3 thousand. The vacancies notified for Scheduled Castes were 25.7 thousand, for Scheduled Tribes 13.5 thousand and 10.3 thousand for Other Backward Classes.

### **E) PLACEMENT OF JOB SEEKERS (ALL CATEGORIES)**

- About 4.06 lakh job seekers were placed during the year 2016.
- Among the 4.06 lakh job seekers placed through employment exchanges during 2016, 59.7 thousand were women. As against total placement of 3.95 lakh during the year 2015, 26.7, 28.1, 11.3 and 12.5 thousand were from Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes and Minority communities, respectively.

### **F) PLACEMENT OF EDUCATED JOB SEEKERS**

- Total number of educated (10<sup>th</sup> standard and above) job seekers placed through the Employment Exchanges during the year 2015 (January to December) were 252.2 thousand.
- Among these 252.2 thousand, 38.5 thousand were women, 16.9 thousand Scheduled Castes and 18.4 thousand Scheduled Tribes job-seekers.

## FRAME WORK FOR DATA COLLECTION

### 1.1 Introduction

National Employment Service in the country functions in the legal framework of Employment Exchange (Compulsory Notification of Vacancies) Act, 1959 through a network of Employment Exchanges located in various parts of the country. The services rendered by the Employment Exchanges include registration & placement, vocational guidance and career counseling and collection of Employment Market Information, etc. National Employment Service covers all the States and Union Territories with a network of 997 Employment Exchanges as on 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2016 (*Except Sikkim, since there is no employment exchange is functioning in this State*). Administrative and financial control of Employment Exchanges lies with the respective State/U.T Governments. As part of their administrative functioning, Employment Exchanges collect data on various aspects of employment and unemployment and submit it to the respective State Directors of Employment and to the Directorate General of Employment (DGE). State Governments are required to compile this data at the State level, While Directorate General of Employment (DGE) compiles and releases this data at all India level.

Directorate General of Employment is responsible for laying down the policies, standards, norms and guidelines for coordination of the National Employment Service at all India level. In addition, it also evaluates and monitors employment and unemployment situation at all India level using various sources of employment data such as Census, Labour Force Surveys conducted by National Sample Survey Office (NSSO) and Employment Market Information (EMI) Programme, etc. **In this publication, data on job-seekers registered with the Employment Exchanges has been analyzed to evaluate incidence of unemployment in the country.**

### 1.2 Reference Period

Employment Exchanges furnish data through 9 returns known as Employment Exchange Statistical Returns covering a specific field of activity like registration, placement, etc. of different periodicity. The data presented in the report refer to the year 2015 and 2016 (from 1<sup>st</sup> January to 31<sup>st</sup> December). There are 4 annual, 4 half-yearly and 1 monthly return. Name and brief description of Statistical Returns is as follows.

### 1.3 Concepts and Definitions

For the sake of clarity, some of the important terms, relevant to the administrative records generated in the Employment Exchanges are explained below:-

**Applicant:-** A person who voluntarily registers at an Employment Exchange and is eligible for employment and other assistance in accordance with the prescribed procedure.

**Apprentice:-** A person who is undergoing apprenticeship training in a trade in pursuance of a contract of apprenticeship.

**Apprentices Act:-** The Apprentices Act, 1961, provides for the regulation and control of training of apprentices in trades and matters connected therewith.

**Dead Register:-** Systematic arrangement of Index Cards of applicants who for various reasons are not entitled to placement assistance.

**Displaced Person:-** A person who, on account of the setting up of India and Pakistan or on account of civil disturbances or fear of such disturbances in any area which formed part of the erstwhile Pakistan had been displaced from or left his place of residence in such an area after **1<sup>st</sup> day of March, 1947**, and who has subsequently been residing in India (Government of India Ordinance No. XX of 1948). Where, however, State Government has evolved a system of registration of Displaced Persons only those persons who are in possession of evidence if such registration should be regarded as "Displaced Persons" by Employment Exchanges for purposes of employment under that State.

**Differently Aabled:-** A person who on account of injury, disease or congenital deformity is substantially handicapped in obtaining or keeping employment or in undertaking work on his own account of a kind which apart from the injury, disease or deformity would be suited to his age, experience and qualifications.

**Educated:-** A job seeker who is having qualification of the level of 10<sup>th</sup> standard and above.

**Group Discussion:-** A discussion with a homogenous group of applicants or students involving detailed information on job opportunities, training facilities and such other matters pertaining to career planning or choosing appropriate to the group.

**Group Guidance:-** All group activities conducted for guidance purposes.

**Index Card:-** means a card on which particulars pertaining to and action in respect of an applicant are recorded.

**Live Register:-** Systematic arrangement of Index Cards pertains to applicants who are in need of employment assistance.

**Placement:-** An employer's acceptance of a person into a remunerative job through the Employment Exchange. This includes: acceptance by employers of applicants submitted by Exchanges for training/apprenticeship with the object of their becoming paid employees on completion of their training/apprenticeship.

**Registration:-** The process of recording the particulars of an employment seeker according to prescribed procedure with a view to render him employment assistance.

**Registration Guidance:-** Brief counseling given to an applicant at the time of registration.

**Renewal of Registration: -** The process of extension of the period for which registration is valid for purposes of rendering employment assistance.

**Submission: -**Forwarding of applicant's particulars to an employer for consideration against a notified, advertised or speculative vacancy.

**Vocational Guidance: -** Assistance given to an individual in solving problems related to vocational planning and to occupational choice and profession with due regard for the individual characteristics and their relation to occupational opportunities.

## **1.4 Limitations of Data**

Data flowing from the Employment Exchanges suffers from some limitations. These limitations arise out of the fact that the Employment Exchanges are mostly located in urban areas. The job seekers from the rural areas may find it difficult to register their names with the Employment Exchanges. Further, the registration of applicants with the Employment Exchanges is voluntary in nature. As such, the following limitations of the data may be kept in view while using the information contained in the publication: -

- The job seekers who are registered with the Employment Exchanges, all of whom may not necessarily be unemployed.
- All the job seekers who are unemployed do not necessarily register themselves with the Employment Exchanges.
- In some exceptional cases, there is a chance of duplication of registration.
- The job-seekers, after finding employment through agencies other than Employment Exchanges, do not intimate the Employment Exchanges for deletion of their names from the Live Register.
- Employers do not always intimate the Employment Exchanges about the selection of candidates even when selection is made from the list supplied by Employment Exchanges.
- There can be cases when job seekers could not renew their cards within the stipulated period and by virtue of their non-renewal, their names get deleted from the live register.

- A number of registrants do have some employment or the other, but are registered for better jobs, particularly, in the Public Sector.

## 1.5 National Career Service Portal

Ministry of Labour and Employment has been implementing National Career Service (NCS) Project as a Mission Mode Project for transformation of the National Employment Service to provide a variety of employment related services like career counselling, vocational guidance, information on skill development courses, apprenticeship, internships etc. Under this project, the NCS Portal (NCSP) has been made functional at the URL ([www.ncs.gov.in](http://www.ncs.gov.in)). The portal was dedicated to the Nation by Hon'ble Prime Minister of India on 20.07.2015. The NCSP is supported by a dedicated helpdesk (multi-lingual) available from Tuesday to Sunday (8.00 AM to 8.00 PM) on 1800-425-1514 for assisting users. The services under NCS are available online and can be accessed directly, through Career Centres, Common Service Centres, post offices, mobile devices, cyber cafes etc. The various stakeholders on the NCS platform include job seekers, industries, employers, employment exchanges (career centres), training providers, educational institutions and placement organizations.

The NCS Project also envisaged setting up of Model Career Centres (MCCs) to be established in collaboration with States and other institutions to deliver employment services. The Government has approved establishment of 107 Model Career Centres (including 7 non-funded MCCs) in the first phase. The Government provides financial assistance to these centres based on the proposals and scheme guidelines. These Model Career Centres can be replicated by the States from their own resources. The Government now, keeping in view the importance of employment as a thrust area and to provide employment related services to maximum job seekers and other stakeholders has decided to establish 100 more Model Career Centres (MCCs) thereby extending the geographical coverage of the scheme and increasing the number of Government funded MCCs to 200 during 14th Finance Commission period (2017-2020). 39 MCCs have been approved in the second phase. In addition, the NCS project has a component of interlinking of employment exchanges with NCS and provides central funding to States for up-gradation of infrastructures in employment exchanges and organizing Job fairs. The Government provides part financial assistance based on the proposals received from States and scheme guidelines.

**Statistics given in this publication are exclusively received through employment exchanges of States/UTs in the country. The job-seeker's data available on National Career Service Portal (NCSP) is not included in this report.**

## EMPLOYMENT EXCHANGE STATISTICS: AN ANALYSIS

In this Chapter, Employment Exchange Statistics pertaining to the year ending December 2015 and 2016 have been presented. The number of job seekers on the live register of Employment Exchanges in the country has been classified according to several variables such as age, gender, education level, etc. and analyzed with a view to understand the labour market formation.

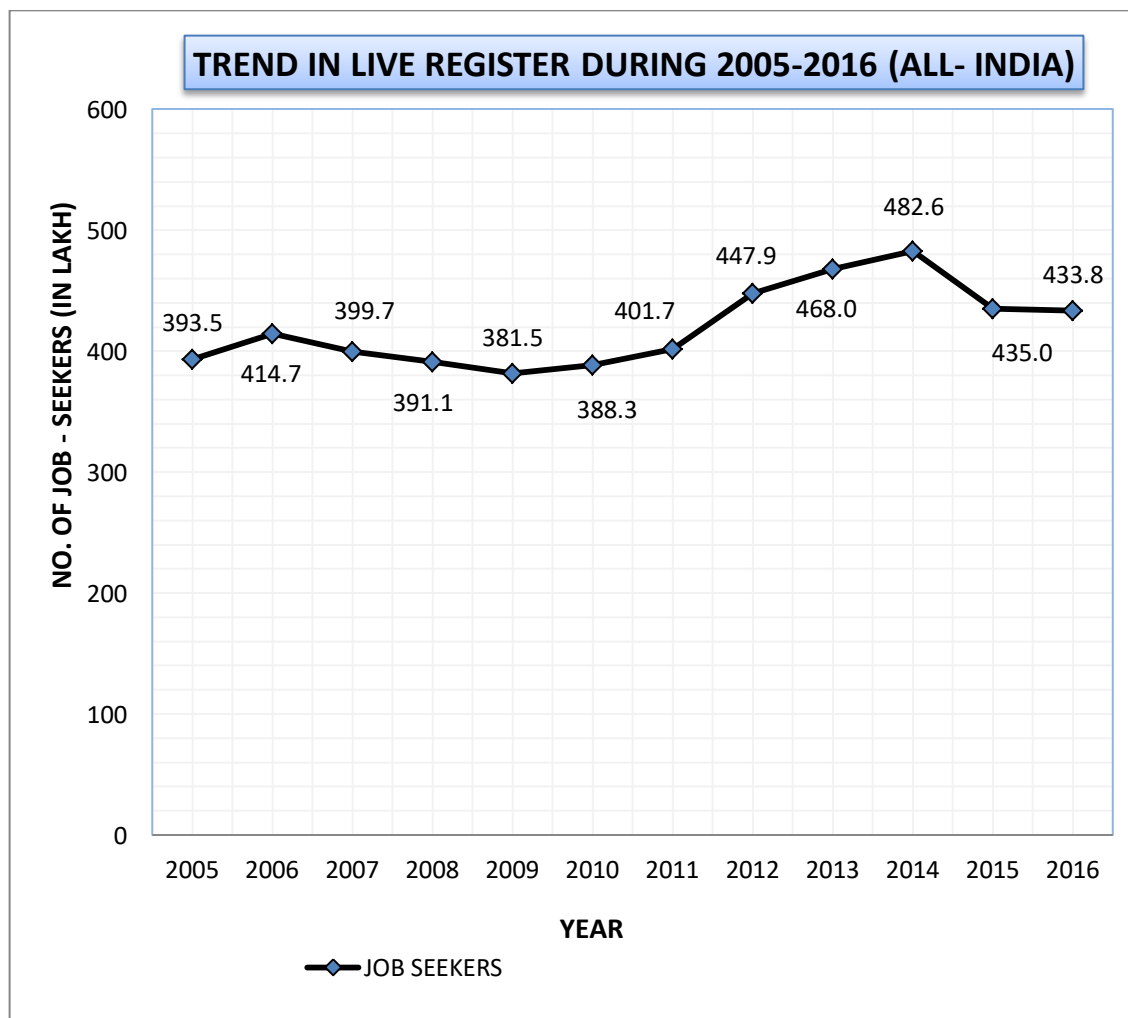
### 2.0 LIVE REGISTER

Live Register means systematic arrangement of Index Cards pertaining to applicants who are in need of employment assistance. Live Register, therefore, provides the total number of persons waiting for job as on a particular day. The number of job seekers on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges is often taken **as an indicator of the level of unemployment in the country.**

Annual time-series data on total number of job-seekers registered with the Employment Exchanges, placement effected against the vacancies notified, along with the number of job-seekers waiting for the job at end of the year (Live Register) for the period 2005-2016 are indicated in Table-1. The salient features of the trends observed in Table No. 1 are given as under:

- As on 31<sup>st</sup> December 2016, 433.76 lakh persons were registered on live register with employment exchanges as compared to 435.03lakh during previous year.
- On an average, around 63 lakh job seekers get registered with the Employment Exchanges per year during the last ten years.
- The total number of vacancies notified during each of the years between 2005 and 2015 varied between 3.5 and 14.01 lakh. The highest was in 2016 and lowest was in 2005.
- Number of vacancies notified to the Employment Exchanges has increased to 14.01lakh in 2016 from 8.1 lakh in 2015.
- The placement has increased to 4.05 lakh in 2016 from 3.95 lakh in the year 2015.
- Out of the total number of vacancies notified during 2016, around 29% were filled through the Employment Exchanges.
- Placement to submission ratio was around 10.4% at the all- India level during 2016.

- Decrease in job-seekers on live register has been observed in the year 2016 in comparison to the year 2015, the registration of job-seekers was lower than previous year. There were large number of job-seekers in the category of job-seekers removed from Live Register for reasons other than transfer to other exchanges (which were not active), which has decreased the number of job-seekers in overall Live Register.



### Live Register: State wise

The State-wise distribution of Job-seekers registered with Employment Exchanges for the year 2016 is indicated in Table-2. From the table, it is observed that:

- Maximum number of Employment Exchanges are in Uttar Pradesh (100) followed by Kerala (89) & West Bengal (77).
- The maximum number of job-seekers were in West Bengal (77.67 lakh) followed by Tamil Nadu (77.32 lakh), Maharashtra (36.76 lakh), Kerala (35.60 lakh), and Uttar Pradesh (32.52 lakh).



- Number of vacancies notified to the Employment Exchanges during the year 2016 were maximum in Gujarat (4.09 lakh) followed by Uttar Pradesh (3.32 lakh), Maharashtra (2.75 lakh) and Uttarakhand (2.0 lakh). In other States, the vacancies notified varied between 0.01 and 0.37 lakh.
- 39.06 lakh job seekers were sponsored by the Employment Exchanges and out of these 4.06 lakh could find the placement which is less than the vacancies notified (14.01lakh)during the year 2016.
- Registration during the year 2016 is largest in Tamil Nadu (12.16 lakh) followed by Maharashtra (6.28 lakh).
- Placement during the year 2016 was highest in Gujarat (3.30 lakh).

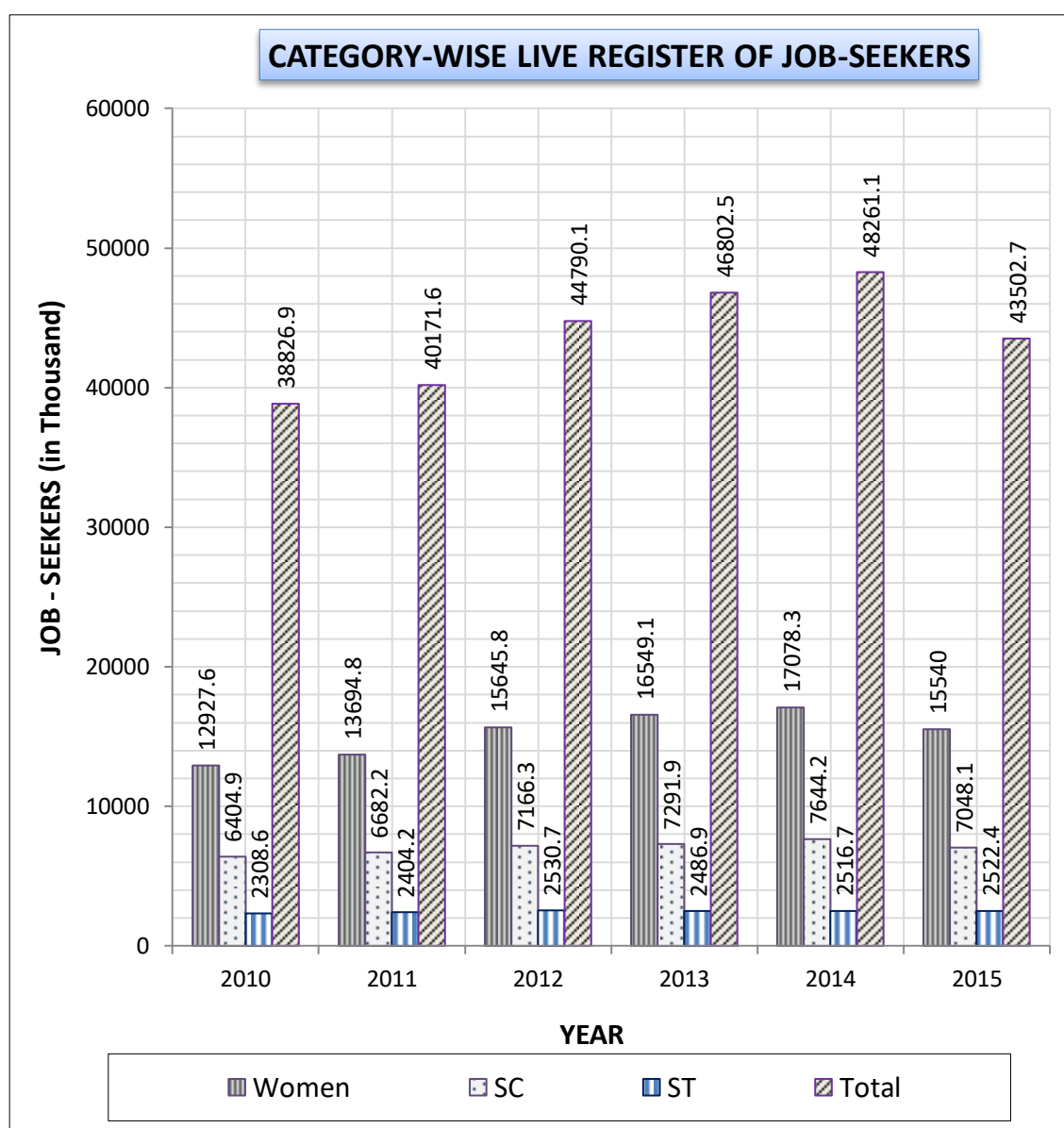

- The number of women job seekers has increased from 129.28 lakh in 2010 to 155.40 lakh in 2015.
- The percentage of women job seekers to the total job-seekers has increased gradually from 33.3% in 2010 to 35.7% in 2015.
- The Live Register of SC Job-seekers has increased from 64.05 lakh in 2010 to 70.48 lakh in 2015 and that of ST Job-seekers has also increased from 23.09 lakh to 25.22 lakh during the same period.

- The Live Register of differently abled persons has increased from 6.64 lakh in 2010 to 6.89 lakh in 2015.
- The percentage of live register of differently abled to total live register is around 1.6% in 2015.

## 2.1 AGE-WISE DISTRIBUTION OF THE JOB SEEKERS

Age-wise distribution of the job seekers on the Live Register for the years 2010-2015 and its State-wise distribution for the year 2015 are given in Table-3 and Table-4

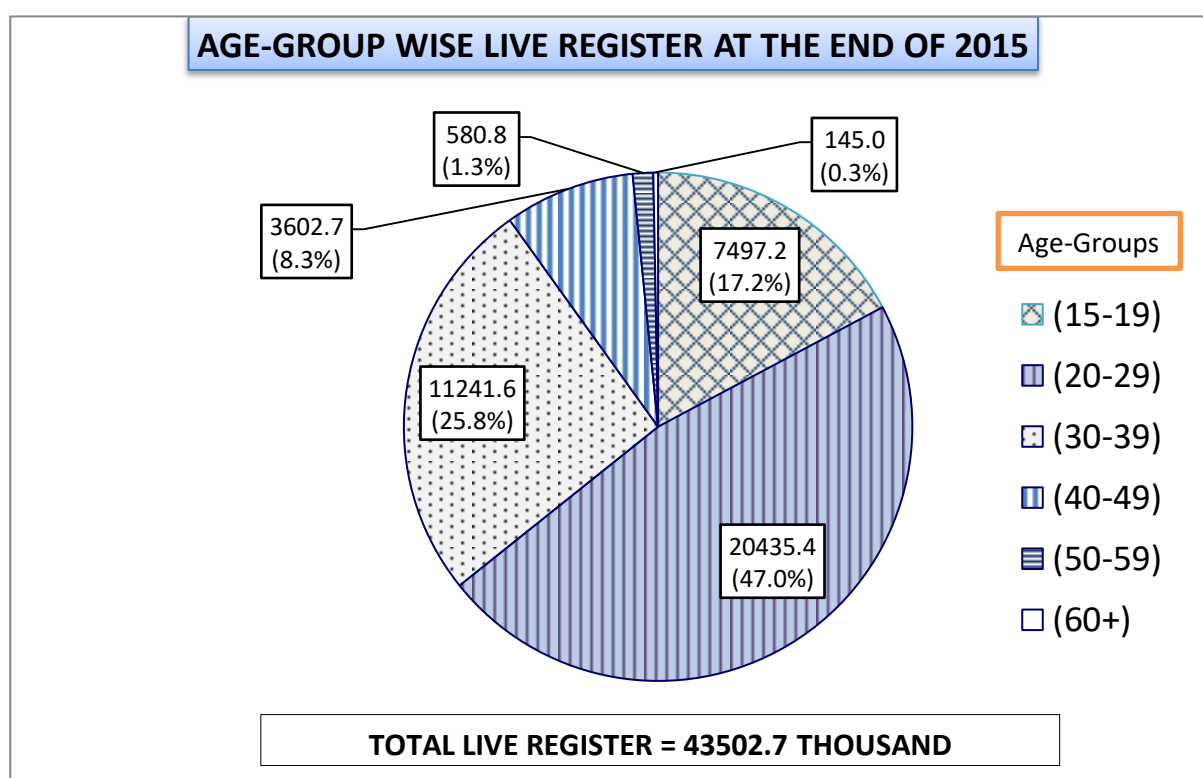
respectively. The age-wise distribution of job-seekers on Live register for different years reveals the following: -

- Approximately 64.2 % of the job-seekers were up to the age of 29 years.
- The absolute number of job seekers in the age group of 20-39 years, which was approximately 71.1% of total number of job seekers in the year 2010, has increased to 72.8 % in 2015.
- The number of job seekers in the age group of 30 years & above has marginally decreased during the year 2015 as compared to 2014. The percentage of job-seekers in the age group of 30 years & above to the total number of job-seekers which was of the order of 35.8% in 2014 has gone down to 35.7% in 2015.

A glance at the State-wise details for the year 2015 shows that: -

- 4684.1 thousand persons in the age group of 15-29 years were on the live register in West Bengal followed by 4406.1 thousand in Tamil Nadu and 2620.6 thousand in Maharashtra at the end of 2015.
- Around 145 thousand job-seekers in the age group of 60 year & above were found to be on the Live Register. Most of them were registered in the states of Tamil Nadu, West Bengal, Jammu & Kashmir and Kerala.

Graphical representation of age-group wise number of job-seekers at the end of the year 2015 is given below:



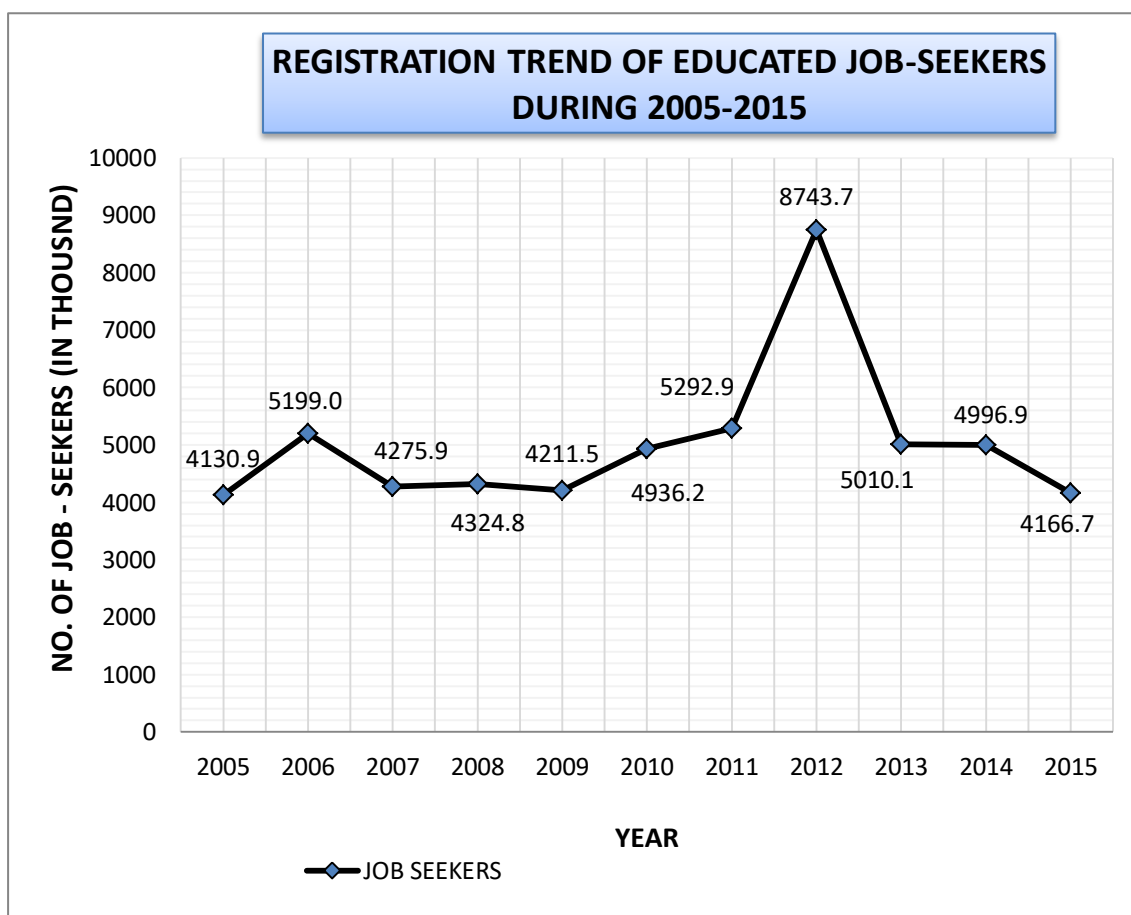
## 2.2 EDUCATED JOB-SEEKERS (10<sup>th</sup> Standard & above)

The major share of job-seekers awaiting jobs in the Employment Exchanges was that of educated persons. Year-wise details of the educated job-seekers are given in Table-5.

- Around 42 lakh educated job-seekers got registered themselves with the Employment Exchanges during the year 2015.
- The percentage of educated job-seekers to the total job-seekers has increased from 71.0 % at the end of 2005 to 87.1% at the end of 2015. This is an indicative of the fact that over the year's educational profile of job-seekers is continuously improving.
- While educated Live Register is around 87.1 % of the total live register, educated placement is around 63.85% of total placements during the year 2015.
- A graphical presentation of year wise registration trend of educated job-seekers for the period 2005-2015 is given on next page.

Table-6 shows the number of educated job-seekers according to their levels of education for the year 2015. It is clear from the table that:

- The maximum number of job-seekers (155.40 lakh i.e. 41 %) was educated upto 10<sup>th</sup> class.
- Higher Secondary or 12<sup>th</sup> passed accounted for 122.27 lakh (32.3%), Graduates, Post-Graduates and Diploma Holders & Others were 63.49 lakh (16.7%), 17.86 lakh (4.7%) and 20.06 lakh (5.3%) respectively.
- Among the total educated women (137.75 lakh) register on live register, 53.61 lakh were 10<sup>th</sup> class passed, 43.12 lakh were 12<sup>th</sup> passed and Graduates and Post-Graduates were 25.25 lakh & 8.35 lakh respectively.

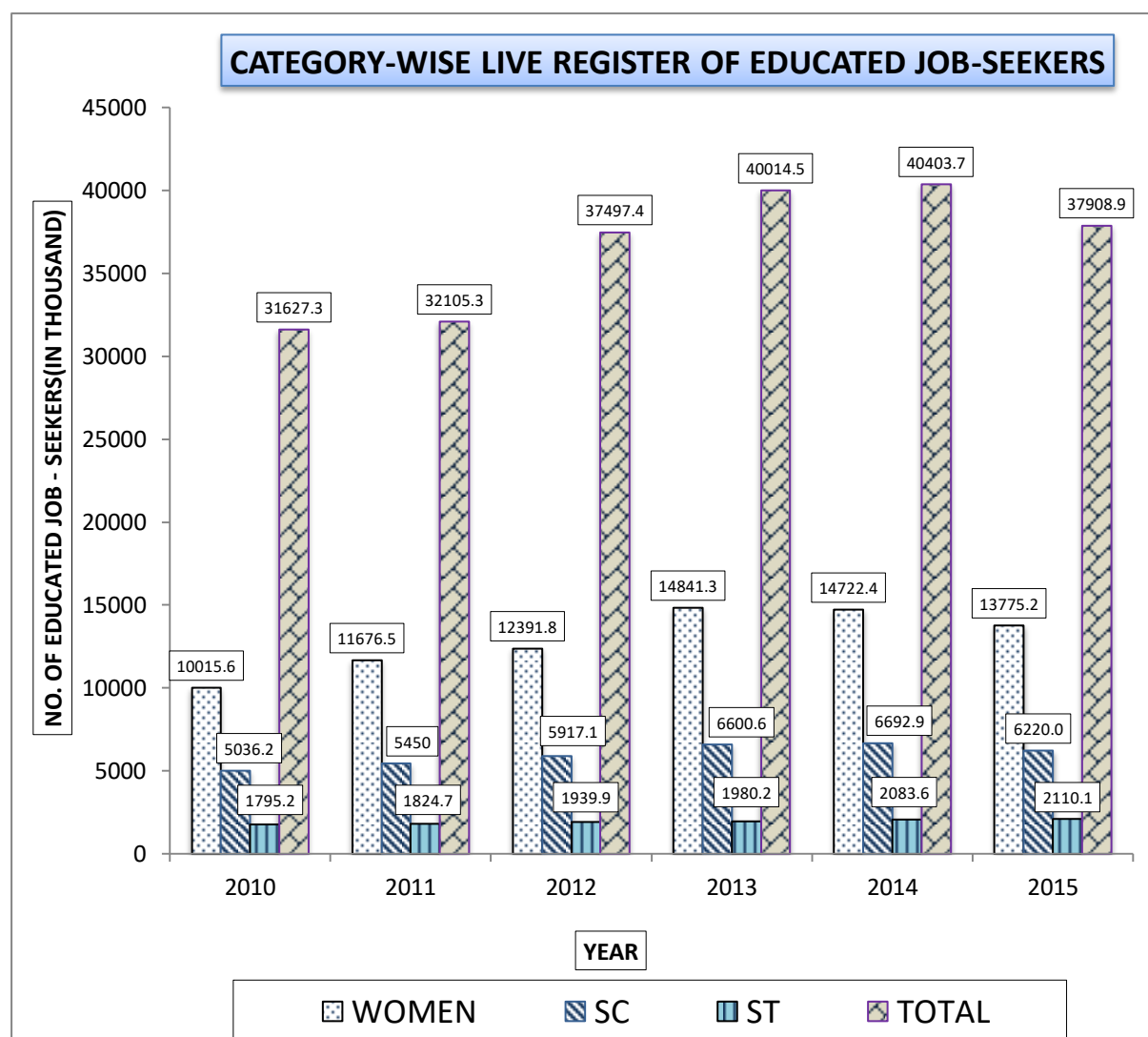

It may be seen from the above statement that:

- The percentage of educated women job seekers of the total educated job-seekers at the end of 2015 has increased 36.3% from 31.7% in 2010.
- The educated Scheduled Caste job seekers have increased from 15.9 % in 2010 to 16.4% in 2015.
- Educated Scheduled Tribes job-seekers have marginally decreased during the same period.

## 2.3 WOMEN JOB-SEEKERS

Table-7 gives the number of women seeking jobs through Employment Exchange for the period 2005-2016.

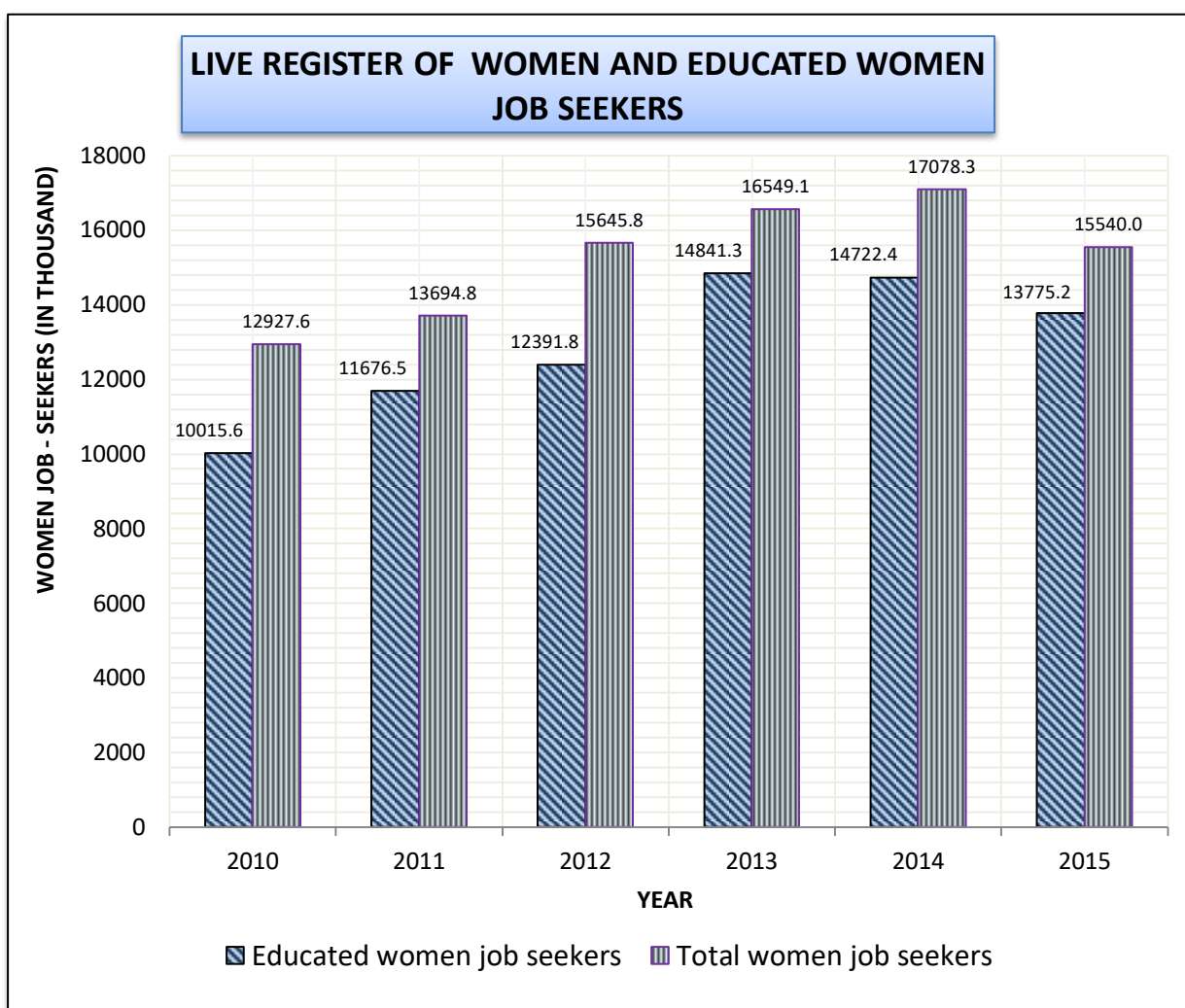
- Women job seekers constituted around 36.3% of the total live register in 2016.
- Registration of women job seekers has varied from around 16 lakh to 35 lakh over the period of 2005 to 2016.
- The placement of women through employment exchanges has marginally decreased during the year 2016. It was around 59.7 thousand during 2016 as compared to 59.9 thousand during 2015.

Table-8 gives the position of women job-seekers in different States at the end of the year 2016. Some of the main features are given below:

- Among the major states, Tamil Nadu has the maximum (39.76 lakh) number of women job-seekers followed by West Bengal (24.63 lakh) and Kerala (22.22 lakh). Among the States, minimum number of women job-seekers was in Mizoram (0.13 lakh).
- Placement of women job-seekers was maximum in Gujarat around 44 thousand.
- The percentage of educated women job seekers among the total women job seekers has increased from 71.1% in 2005 to 88.6% in 2015 (Table 9) at page 32.
- Live register for women job-seekers (educated and total) has registered a decline in 2015 over the previous year.
- Placement of educated women job seekers has decreased to 38.5 thousand during 2015 as compared to 40.2 thousand during 2014.
- Among the graduate and above women job seekers, around 18% were graduates and 6% were post graduates in 2015 (Table 6) at page 29.

- The ratio of placement to registration for educated women was 2.8% during 2015.
- The live register of educated women increased from 75.42 lakh in 2005 to 137.75 lakh in 2015.

## 2.4 SCHEDULED CASTES (SC)/ SCHEDULED TRIBES (ST)/ OTHER BACKWARD CLASSES(OBC) JOB SEEKERS

The employment service, as in the past, continued making efforts to cater to the special needs of Scheduled Castes (SC) and Scheduled Tribes (ST) and Other Backward Classes (OBC) job-seekers. Over the years, a number of special measures were adopted by



the Employment Exchanges to safeguard the interest of the job-seekers belonging to these categories. These includes:-

- Maintenance of their registration cards separately,
- Ensuring that the vacancy notifications from public sector establishments invariably indicate details regarding reservation,
- Providing vocational guidance and imparting recruitment training,
- Sponsoring suitable candidates against unreserved vacancies,
- Eliciting the cooperation of SC and ST association in locating suitable candidates.

The year wise performance of Employment Exchanges in respect of Scheduled Caste job-seekers is given in Table-10.

- Over the past 11 year's period from 2005 to 2015, live register of SC job-seekers has increased from 63.53 lakh in 2005 to 70.48 lakh in 2015, showing an increase over the period.
- SC job-seekers were 16.2% of the total job-seekers on the live register at the end of year 2015.
- Registration of SC job-seekers has varied from around 6.5lakh to 12.8 lakh during the period 2005 to 2015. The lowest number of registration has been recorded during 2009.
- Placement of SC job-seekers increased from 17.1 thousand in 2005 to 26.7 thousand in 2015. Percentage of placement to the registration of SC job-seekers in the year 2015 was 3.3%.

The year-wise performance of Employment Exchanges in respect of educated Scheduled Caste job-seekers is given in Table-11.

- The percentage of educated SC job-seekers to the total SC job-seekers has increased from 63.1 % in 2005 to 88.2 % in 2015.
- Out of 26.7 thousand SC job-seekers placed through employment exchanges during 2015, 16.9 thousand were educated SC job-seekers. Live register of educated job-seekers has also increased from 40.1 lakh in 2005 to 62.20 lakh in 2015.

The year wise performance of Employment Exchanges in respect of Scheduled Tribes job-seekers is given in Table-12.

- Live Register of ST job seekers increased from 22.3 lakh in 2005 to 25.2 lakh in 2015.

- Registration of ST job-seekers has varied from around 2.6 lakh to 3.8 lakh during the period 2005-2015.
- ST job-seekers were around 5.8 % of the total job seekers on the live register at the end of year 2015.
- Placement of ST job-seekers has varied from 8.9 thousand to 28.1 thousand during 2005 to 2015 respectively.
- Placement to registration ratio of ST job-seekers was around 7.5% in 2015.

The year wise performance of Employment Exchanges in respect of educated Scheduled Tribe job seekers is given in Table-13atpage 36.

- The percentage of educated ST Job seekers to the total ST job-seekers has increased from 60.9% % in 2005 to 83.7 % in 2015.
- The total number of educated ST Job seekers was 21.10 lakh at the end of 2015.
- Out of 28.1 thousand ST placements, around 18.4 thousand were in respect of educated ST placements.

State-wise performance of Employment Exchanges in respect of SC/ST/OBC job seekers for the year 2015 is given in Table 13-A.

- It may be observed that Tamil Nadu has maximum number of SC and OBC job seekers 17.5 lakh and 48 lakh respectively on the live register whereas Chhattisgarh and Assam have maximum number of Scheduled Tribes job seekers (3.3 lakh) and (2.6 lakh) respectively on the live register of the employment exchanges.
- Gujarat has shown the maximum number of placements in respect of SC/ST numbering 18.98 and 24.92 thousand respectively, whereas for OBC job seekers, maximum placement was 4.9 thousand in Tamil Nadu during 2015.
- Registration during the year 2015 for SC was maximum (2.02 lakh) in Tamil Nadu, for ST maximum was in Gujarat (0.44 lakh) and for OBC, maximum was in Tamil Nadu (6.5 lakh).
- Percentage of placement to registration was maximum in Gujarat among major States for SC, ST and OBC job-seekers.

- The ratio of vacancies filled to vacancies notified for SC, ST and OBC was 28.87%, 40.09% and 51.90% respectively during 2015.

## 2.5 DIFFERENTLY ABLED JOB-SEEKERS

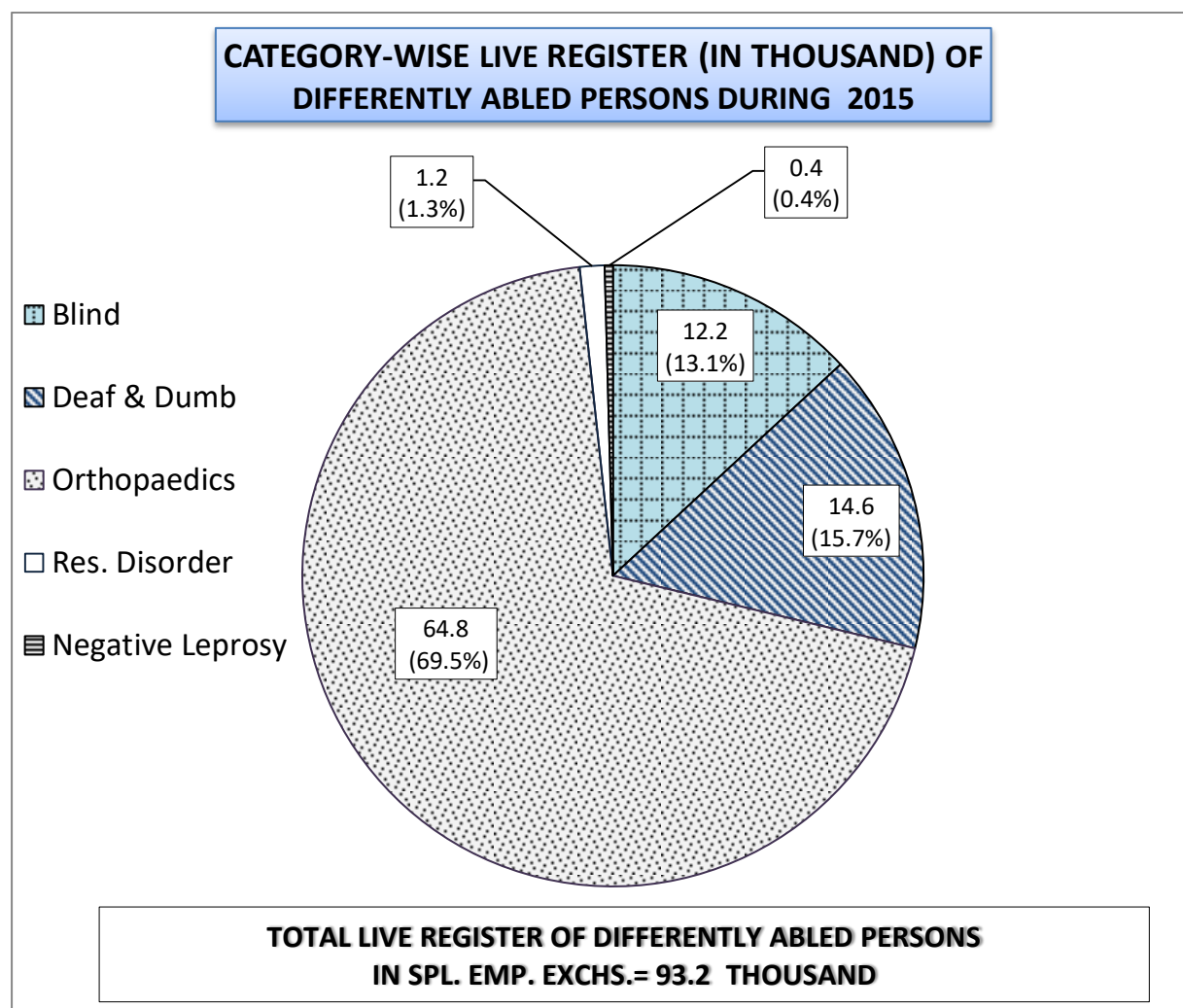
The Employment Service is making all efforts to cater to the special needs of the differently abled job-seekers.

- At all- India level, there were 42 Special Employment Exchanges working at the end of the year 2015 and Shimla employment exchanges was maintaining duplicate cards only.
- In addition to these special employment exchanges, there are 38 Special Cells for differently abled job-seekers in the normal Employment Exchanges, which are also catering to special employment needs of differently abled job-seekers.
- Apart from these special cells and exchanges, normal exchanges also register the differently abled job-seekers.
- Besides these, there are 21 National Career Service Centre for Differently Abled- NCSC(DA) erstwhile Vocational Rehabilitation Centres (VRCs) functioning at Mumbai, Hyderabad, Jabalpur, Delhi, Ludhiana, Kanpur, Calcutta, Chennai, Ahmedabad, Trivandrum, Bangalore, Guwahati, Bhubaneswar, Jaipur, Vadodara, Patna, Agartala, Una, Srinagar, Ranchi and Puducherry. These Centres are working under the direct administrative control of Directorate General of Employment and evaluate the residual capacity of the differently abled persons, impart them vocational training and guidance and try to put them into the job or self-employment according to their capabilities.

Tables-15 to 19 mentions the work done by Employment Exchanges and NCSC (DA) for the differently abled persons. The number of differently abled job-seekers has increased from 5.8 lakh in 2005 to 6.9 lakh in 2015. The placement through employment exchanges was 2.8 thousand in 2015 as compared to 1.7 thousand in 2014. NCSC (DA) had rehabilitated as many as 11.2 thousand persons during 2016 and 12.3 thousand during 2015.

Performance of Employment Exchanges /Special Exchanges in respect of DA job-seekers by category of differently abled applicants is given in Table-16. The category of orthopedically differently abled job-seekers was found maximum in number on the live

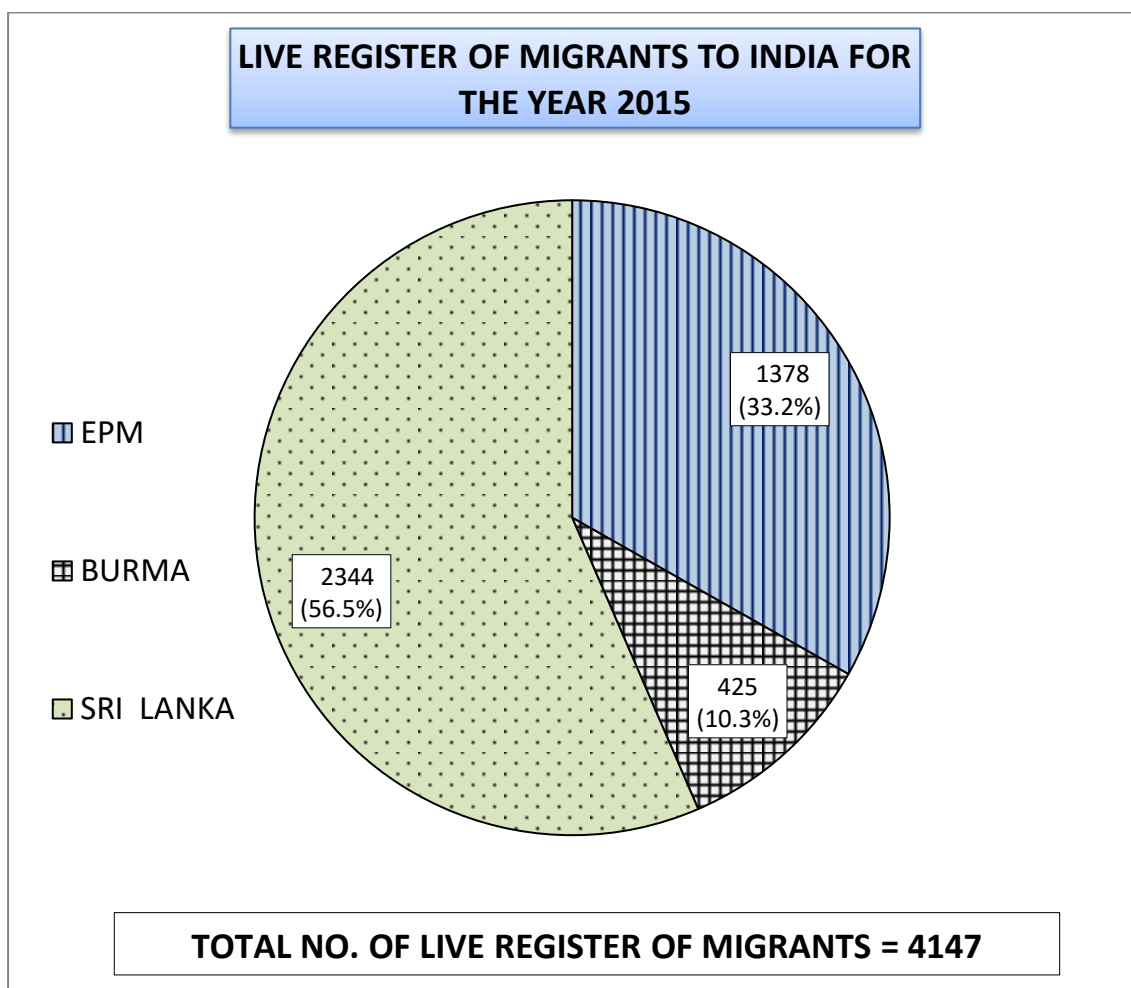
register of employment exchanges at the end of the year 2015. Graphical representation of category-wise live register of job-seekers (DA) for the year 2015 is given below.



## 2.6 MIGRANTS AND REPATRIATES

The employment service continued to render assistance in the resettlement of migrants and repatriates from Myanmar, Sri Lanka and East Pakistan. Table-20 shows the performance of employment exchanges in respect of migrant job-seekers from East Pakistan, repatriates from Myanmar and Sri Lanka to India. Over the years, live register for migrants has shown a declining trend as their number on the live register has declined from 4.9 thousand in 2010 to 4.1 thousand in 2015.

\*East Pakistan Migrant

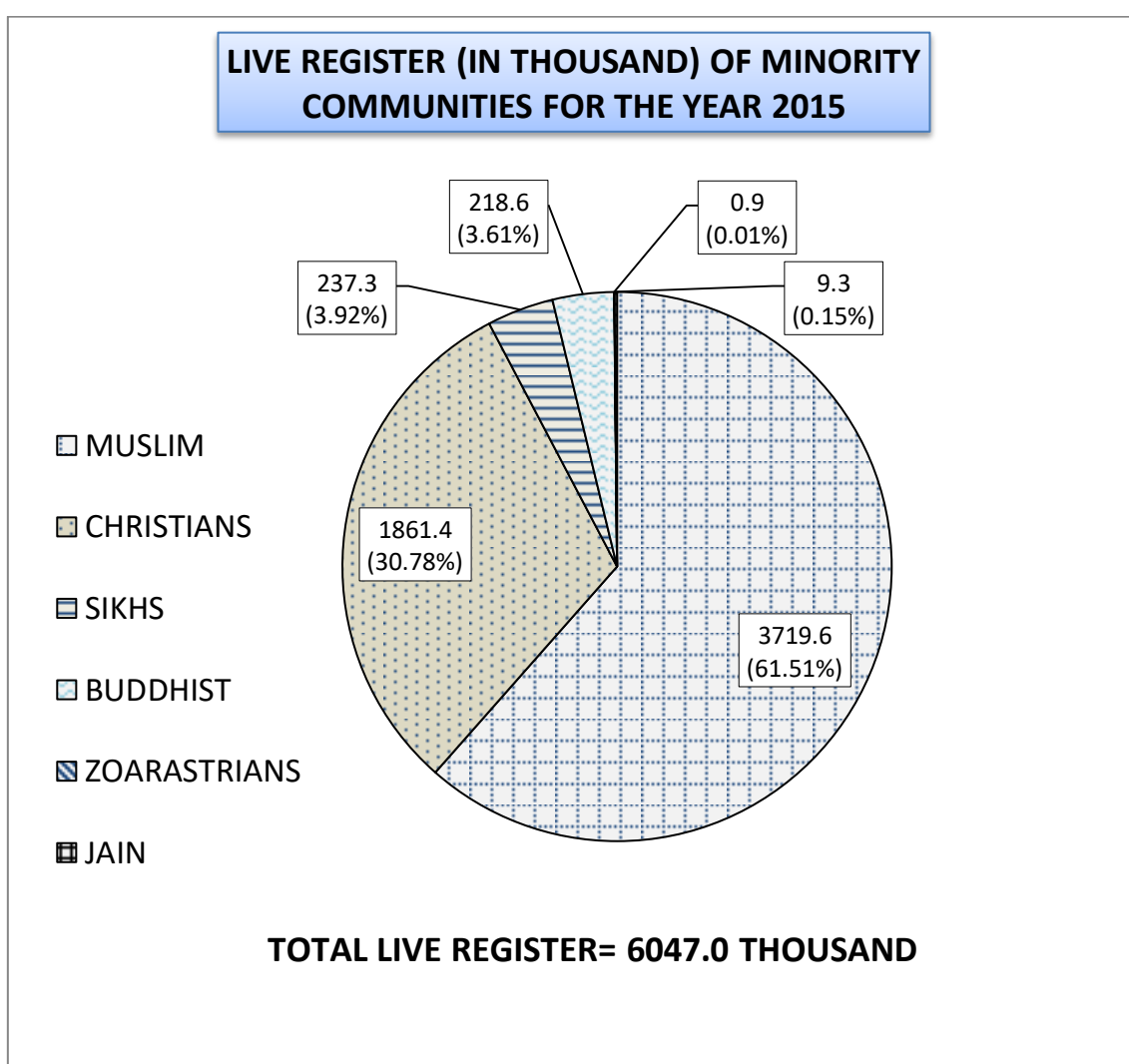
## 2.7 MINORITY COMMUNITIES JOB SEEKERS

The main minority communities in India are Muslims, Christians, Sikhs, Buddhists, Jain and Zoroastrians. The statement showing the performance of employment exchanges in respect of Minority Communities is given in Table-21

- Number of job seekers belonging to all minority communities put together at the end of 2015 on live register of employment exchanges in India was 60.47lakh, accounting for 13.9% of total job seekers on the live register.
- Out of these, 37.2 lakh (61.5%) were Muslims, 18.6lakh (30.8%) Christians, 2.4 lakh (3.9%) Sikhs, 2.2 lakh (3.6%) Buddhists, 0.9 lakh (0.2%) Jains and Zoroastrians were around nine hundred.

- During the year 2015, 5.6 lakh minority job seekers registered with the employment exchanges throughout India. The maximum registration was made in respect of Muslim job-seekers (2.9 lakh) followed by Christians (1.8 lakh) and Sikhs job seekers (0.37 lakh) respectively.
- The maximum placement was made in respect of Muslim job-seekers (8.7thousand). The percentage of placement to submission was maximum for Sikhs (40.3%) followed by Muslims (5.7%) and Christians (5.0 %).

## **2.8 EX-ITI AND FULL TERM APPRENTICES**

The performance of Employment Exchanges in respect of Ex-ITI and Full Term Apprentices during the period 2005-2015 is given in Table-22. The job-seekers who have completed ITI courses and got themselves registered with the Employment Exchange was 0.85lakh at the end of the year 2015. The live register of Ex-ITI job-seekers has slightly declined from 13.4lakh in 2014 to 13.2lakh in 2015. The placement of Ex-ITI job seekers has varied from 6.5 thousand to 15.3 thousand during the period 2005-2015.

The live register of job-seekers, who have completed full term apprentice has also shown mixed trend over the period from 2005 to 2015. Number of full term apprentice job seekers has increased from 1.83lakh in 2014 to 1.85 lakh in 2015. The placement has recorded marginally increase in this category.

## **2.9 OCCUPATION GROUP-WISE JOB-SEEKERS (NCO 2004)**

Number of job seekers on the live register of employment exchanges classified by broad occupational groups at the end of 2015 is given in Table-23. It may be seen that out of 435.03 lakh job seekers on live register of employment exchanges in the country as on 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2015, about 315.06 lakh i.e. the majority of the job seekers (72.4%) were found to be in the category of workers not classified by any occupation, meaning thereby that the majority of job-seekers were inexperienced, fresher and therefore did not fall under any category of occupation. Second highest about 37.13 lakh (8.5%) job seekers were in the category of Clerks followed by Professionals 24.62 lakh (5.7%), Technician and Associate Professionals 18.01 lakh (4.1%) and 16.56 lakh Crafts and Related Workers (3.8%) job seekers. Minimum number of job-seekers 1.33lakh belonged to Legislators, Senior Officials and Managers. In case of woman job-seekers which were around 155.4 lakh, out of these 115.06 lakh (74%) were in the category of workers not elsewhere classified followed by 14.24lakh (9.2%) in the category of Clerks, 11.59lakh (7.5%) in Professionals and 8.36 lakh (5.4%) in Technicians and Associate Professionals.
