## HIGHLIGHTS

---

This report is based on the information collected through various statistical returns of different periodicity from Employment Exchanges located across the country. Some of the key findings are highlighted below:

### *A) Employment Exchanges*

- ❖ There were 997 employment exchanges, including 76 University Employment Information and Guidance Bureau (UEI&GB), functioning in the country in the year 2019.
- ❖ Among 997 employment exchanges, 42 were special employment exchanges for differently abled persons and 38 were special cells dealing with differently abled in the year 2019.
- ❖ There were 14 employment exchanges for professional and executive (P&E) and 5 employment exchanges were exclusively for women in the year 2019.

### *B) Registration*

- ❖ Total 34.5 lakh jobseekers have got registered in employment exchanges during 2019.
- ❖ Out of which 20.8 lakh jobseekers were men and 13.7 lakh were women.
- ❖ The highest jobseekers 7.0 lakh were registered during 2019 in Uttar Pradesh, followed by Gujarat and Tamil Nadu, which were 4.9 lakh and 3.8 Lakh respectively.
- ❖ During the year 2018, the educated jobseekers registered in employment exchanges were 26.1 lakh and out of which 8.5 lakh were women.
- ❖ During 2018, total 3.9 lakh Scheduled Caste jobseekers registered in employment exchanges out of which 2.6 lakh were educated Scheduled Castes jobseekers.
- ❖ During 2018, total 1.9 lakh Scheduled Tribe jobseekers registered in employment exchanges out of which 1.2 lakh were educated Scheduled Tribe jobseekers.
- ❖ During the year 2018, the number of differently abled jobseekers registered in employment exchanges was around 27 thousand that include 2.5 thousand jobseekers registered in special employment exchanges.

- ❖ During the year 2018, the number of minority communities jobseekers Muslim, Christian, Sikh, Buddhist and Jain registered in employment exchanges in the country were 182.7 thousand, 145.1 thousand, 31.5 thousand and, 25.4 thousand and 2.3 thousand respectively.

### *C) Placement*

- ❖ Around 3.7 lakh jobseekers were placed through employment exchanges during the year 2019.
- ❖ Among the 3.7 lakh placed jobseekers, 3.2 lakh were men and 0.5 lakh were women.
- ❖ During the year 2018, the number of educated jobseekers placed was 3.76 lakh, whereas the educated women placed through employment exchanges were around 54 thousand.
- ❖ During the year 2018, the Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe and Other Backward Class jobseekers placed through employment exchanges were around 31.8 thousand, 32.0 thousand and 6.2 thousand respectively.

### *D) Live Register*

- ❖ As reported by the State/UTs, 424.1 lakh jobseekers were registered on the live register of employment exchanges in the country at the end of December 2019. Out of which 157.1 lakh jobseekers registered were women.
- ❖ Out of total jobseekers (421.2Lakh), 268.6 lakh jobseekers were youth (age group of 15-29 year) which constitute 63.9% of total jobseekers. At the same time, educated jobseekers were 278.7 lakh and educated women jobseekers were 138.1 lakh during the year 2018.
- ❖ Among educated jobseekers, the Scheduled Caste were 39.6 lakh and the Scheduled Tribe were 21.3lakh.
- ❖ The jobseekers belong to Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe and Other Backward Class registered on live register of employment exchange across the country were 70.0 lakh, 26.1 lakh and 114.9 lakh at the end of the December, 2018.
- ❖ During the year 2018, the differently abled jobseekers registered on live register in the country were around 6.9 lakh.
- ❖ Total jobseekers belong to minority communities registered on live register were 57.7 lakh at the end of December, 2018.



### ***E) Vacancies Notified***

- ❖ Total numbers of vacancies notified during the year 2019 (January to December) were 5.4 lakh.
- ❖ Total numbers of vacancies notified during the year 2019 were around 5.4 lakh, in which the vacancies notified for SC were 7 thousand, for ST 8 thousand and 6 thousand for OBC.

### ***F) Submission Made***

- ❖ The submission made by the employment exchanges in the country at the end of December, 2019 was 19.7 lakh.

# CHAPTER 1

## FRAME WORK FOR DATA COLLECTION

### 1.1 Introduction

National Employment Service in the country functions in the legal framework of Employment Exchange (Compulsory Notification of Vacancies) Act, 1959 through a network of Employment Exchanges located in various parts of the country. The services rendered by the Employment Exchanges include registration & placement, vocational guidance and career counseling and collection of Employment Market Information, etc. National Employment Service covers all the States and Union Territories with a network of 997 Employment Exchanges (*Except Sikkim, since there is no employment exchange is functioning in this State*). Administrative and financial control of Employment Exchanges lies with the respective State/UT Government. As part of their administrative functioning, Employment Exchanges collect data on various aspects of employment and unemployment and supply to the respective State Directorate of Employment and the Directorate General of Employment (DGE). State Government are required to compile this data at the State level, while Directorate General of Employment (DGE) compiles and releases this data at all India level. Directorate General of Employment is responsible for laying down the policies, standards, norms and guidelines for coordination of the National Employment Service at all India level. In this publication, data on jobseekers registered with the Employment Exchanges has been analyzed to give the employment and unemployment scenario in the country.

### 1.2 Reference Period

Employment Exchanges furnish data through various returns known as Employment Exchange Statistical Returns, covering various fields viz., registration, placement, live register, submissions made and vacancies notified etc. at different periodicity. The data presented in the report refer to the year 2018 and 2019 (from 1<sup>st</sup> January to 31<sup>st</sup> December). There are 4 annual, 4 half-yearly and 1 monthly return. Name and brief description of Statistical Returns is as follows:

### 1.3 Concepts and Definitions

Some of the important terms, relevant to the administrative records generated in the Employment Exchanges are mentioned below:

Applicant	A person who voluntarily registers at an employment exchange and is eligible for employment and other assistance in accordance with the prescribed procedure.
Apprentice	A person who is undergoing apprenticeship training in a trade in pursuance of a contract of apprenticeship.
Apprentices Act	The Apprentices Act, 1961, provides for the regulation and control of training of apprentices in trades and matters connected therewith.
Dead Register	Systematic arrangement of Index Cards of applicants who for various reasons are not entitled to placement assistance.
Displaced Person	A person who, on account of the setting up of India and Pakistan or on account of civil disturbances or fear of such disturbances in any area which formed part of the erstwhile Pakistan had been displaced from or left his place of residence in such an area after 1 <sup>st</sup> day of March, 1947, and who has subsequently been residing in India (Government of India Ordinance No. XX of 1948). Where, however, State Government has evolved a system of registration of Displaced Persons only those persons who are in possession of evidence if such registration should be regarded as "Displaced Persons" by Employment Exchanges for purposes of employment under that State.
Differently Abled	A person who on account of injury, disease or congenital deformity is substantially handicapped in obtaining or keeping employment or in undertaking work on his own account of a kind which apart from the injury, disease or deformity would be suited to his age, experience and qualifications.
Educated	A jobseeker who is having qualification of the level of 10 <sup>th</sup> standard and above.
Group Discussion	A discussion with a homogenous group of applicants or students involving detailed information on job opportunities, training facilities and such other matters pertaining to career planning or choosing appropriate to the group.
Group Guidance	All group activities conducted for guidance purposes.
Index Card	A card on which particulars pertaining to and action in respect of an applicant are recorded.
Live Register	Systematic arrangement of Index Cards pertaining to applicants who are in need of employment assistance.

Placement	An employer's acceptance of a person into a remunerative job through the Employment Exchange. This includes: acceptance by employers of applicants submitted by Exchanges for training/apprenticeship with the object of their becoming paid employees on completion of their training/apprenticeship.
Registration	The process of recording the particulars of an employment seeker according to prescribed procedure with a view to render him employment assistance.
Registration Guidance	Brief counseling given to an applicant at the time of registration.
Submission	Forwarding of applicant's particulars to an employer for consideration against a notified, advertised or speculative vacancy.
Vocational Guidance	Assistance given to an individual in solving problems related to vocational planning and to occupational choice and profession with due regard for the individual characteristics and their relation to occupational opportunities.
Renewal of Registration	The process of extension of the period for which registration is valid for purposes of rendering employment assistance.

#### 1.4 Limitations of Data

Data flowing from the Employment Exchanges suffers from some limitations. These limitations arise out of the fact that the Employment Exchanges are mostly located in urban areas. The jobseekers from the rural areas may find it difficult to register their names with the Employment Exchanges. Further, the registration of applicants with the Employment Exchanges is voluntary in nature. The following limitations of the data may be kept in view while using the information contained in the publication:-

- ❖ All jobseekers who are registered with the Employment Exchanges may not necessarily be unemployed.
- ❖ All the jobseekers who are unemployed don't necessarily register themselves with the Employment Exchanges.
- ❖ In some exceptional cases, there may be a chance of duplication of registration.
- ❖ The jobseekers, after getting employment from other sources except Employment Exchanges, don't intimate the Employment Exchanges for deletion of their names from the Live Register.
- ❖ Employers do not always intimate the Employment Exchanges about the selection of candidates even when selection is made from the list supplied by Employment Exchanges.

- ❖ There can be cases when jobseekers could not renew their cards within the stipulated period and by virtue of their non-renewal, their names get deleted from the live register.

## 1.5 National Career Service Portal

The Ministry of Labour and Employment is implementing National Career Service (NCS) Project as a Mission Mode Project for transformation of the National Employment Service to provide a variety of employment related services like career counseling, vocational guidance, information on skill development courses, apprenticeship, internships etc. Under this project, the NCS Portal (NCSP) has been made functional at the URL ([www.ncs.gov.in](http://www.ncs.gov.in)). The services under NCS are available online and can be accessed directly, through Career Centres, Common Service Centres, post offices, mobile devices, cyber cafes etc. The various stakeholders on the NCS platform include jobseekers, industries, employers, employment exchanges (career centres), training providers, educational institutions and placement organizations.

The NCS Project also envisaged setting up of Model Career Centres (MCCs) to be established in collaboration with States and other institutions to deliver employment services. The Government has approved establishment of 246 Model Career Centres. The Government provides financial assistance to these centres based on the proposals and scheme guidelines. These Model Career Centres can be replicated by the States from their own resources. In addition, the NCS project has a component of interlinking of employment exchanges with NCS portal and provides central funding to States for up-gradation of infrastructures in employment exchanges and organizing Job fairs.

Statistics given in this publication are exclusively received through employment exchanges of State/UTs in the country. ## CHAPTER 2

### EMPLOYMENT EXCHANGE STATISTICS: AN ANALYSIS

The Chapter includes the Employment Exchange Statistics pertaining to the year ending December 2018 and 2019. A comparison with earlier report results is also presented for various aspects. The number of jobseekers on the live register of Employment Exchanges in the country has been classified according to several variables such as age, gender, education level, etc. and analyzed with a view to understand the labour market formation. The report is based on the responses received from around 50% employment exchanges across India for the reference period.

#### 2.1 LIVE REGISTER

Live Register means systematic arrangement of Index Cards pertaining to applicants who are in need of employment assistance. Live Register, therefore, provides the total number of persons waiting for job as on a particular day. The number of jobseekers on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges is often taken **as an indicator of the level of unemployment in the country.**

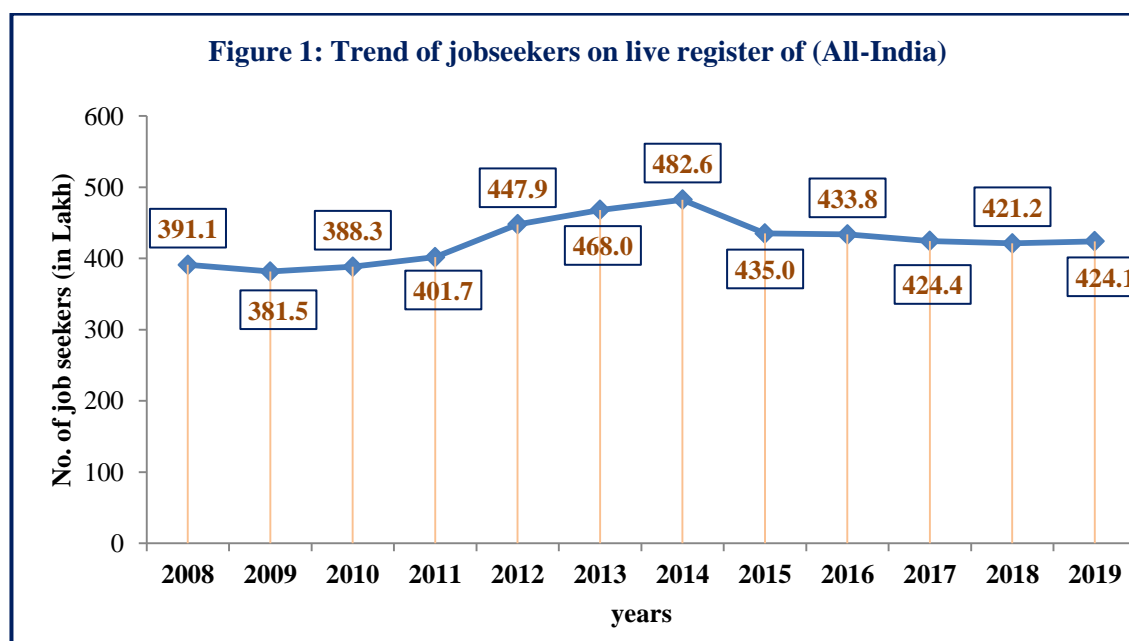
Time series data on total number of jobseekers registered with the Employment Exchanges, placement effected against the vacancies notified, along with the number of jobseekers waiting for the job at end of the year (Live Register) for the period 2008 to 2019 are given in **Table 1**. Following **Statement 1** shows the trends in number of total registration, placement, vacancies notified, submission made and live register for the year 2015 to 2019.

The above **Statement 1** indicates the followings:

- ❖ As on 31<sup>st</sup> December 2019, 424.1 lakh persons were on live register with employment exchanges as compared to 421.2 lakh during 2018. During 2019, jobseekers on live register were increased by 0.7% as compared to the year 2018 while number of registration was decreased during the year 2019.
- ❖ On an average, around 48 lakh jobseekers got registered with the employment exchanges per year during the last five years.
- ❖ The number of vacancies notified during the year 2019 was 5.4 lakh which was 12.3 lakh during 2018.
- ❖ The placement has slightly decreased to 3.7 lakh in 2019 from 4 lakh in 2018.
- ❖ Out of the total number of vacancies notified during 2019, around 68% were filled through the Employment Exchanges.

**Figure 1** shows the year-wise trend of jobseekers on live register since 2008 to 2019. It reflects the highest number of jobseekers on live register was 482.6 lakh during the year 2014.



Year-wise trend of jobseekers on live register is given in **Table 1**.



## Live Register: State wise

The State-wise distribution of jobseekers registered with employment exchanges for the year 2019 is given in **Table 2**. The followings are the main highlights of State-wise registrations:

- ❖ The highest number of jobseekers registered during 2019 were in Uttar Pradesh (7.1 lakh) followed by Gujarat (4.9 lakh) and Tamil Nadu (3.8 lakh).
- ❖ During the year 2019, more than 4.6 lakh vacancies were notified by Gujarat which was the highest among all State/UTs followed by Maharashtra with 0.6 lakh.
- ❖ 19.7 lakh jobseekers were sponsored by the employment exchanges and out of these 3.7 lakh could find the placement which is less than the vacancies notified (5.4 lakh) during the year 2019.
- ❖ The largest number of jobseekers on live register during the year 2019 were in West Bengal (77.6 lakh), Tamil Nadu (70.7 lakh) and Maharashtra (42.5 lakh).
- ❖ During the year 2019, Gujarat has placed 3.4 lakh jobseekers that were the highest among all State/UTs.

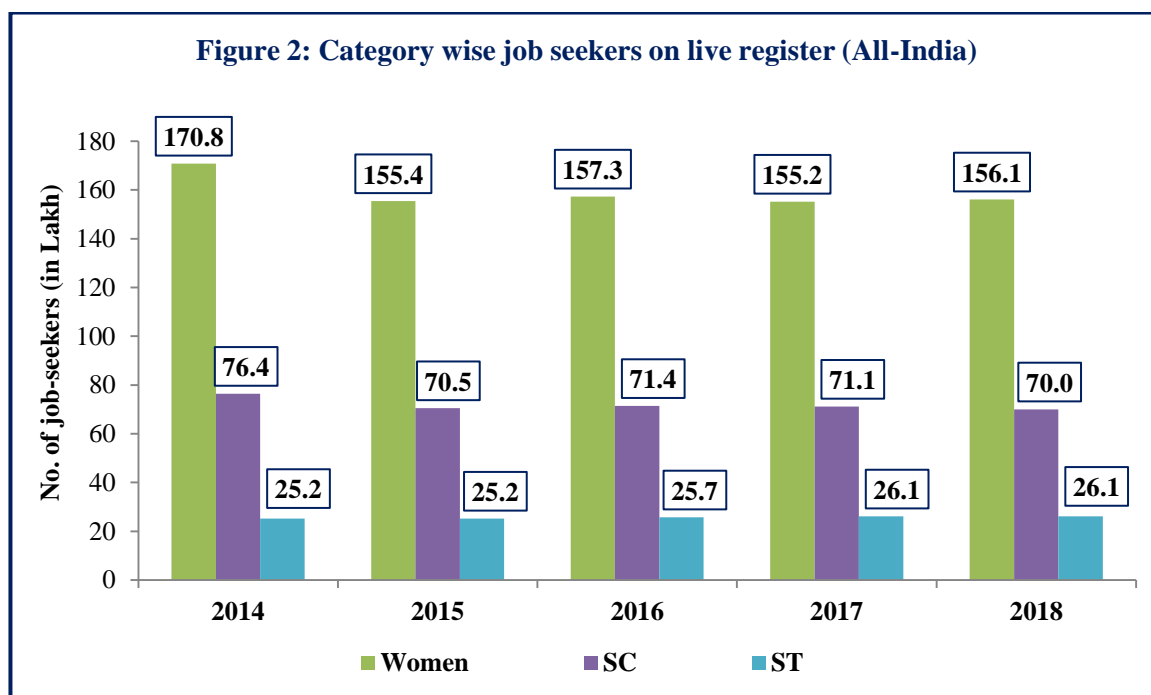

The **Statement 2** shows that

- ❖ The number of women jobseekers has increased on live register during 2018 with 37.1% share in total jobseekers on live register.
- ❖ The number of Scheduled Caste jobseekers on live register has fluctuated from 76 lakh during 2014 to 70 lakh during the year 2018.
- ❖ Scheduled Tribe jobseekers have increased from 25.2 lakh during 2014 to 26.1 lakh on live register during the year 2018.
- ❖ The number of differently abled persons on live register has marginally decreased from 7.0 lakh in 2014 to 6.9 lakh in 2018. The percentage of live register of differently abled to total live register was around 1.6% in 2018.

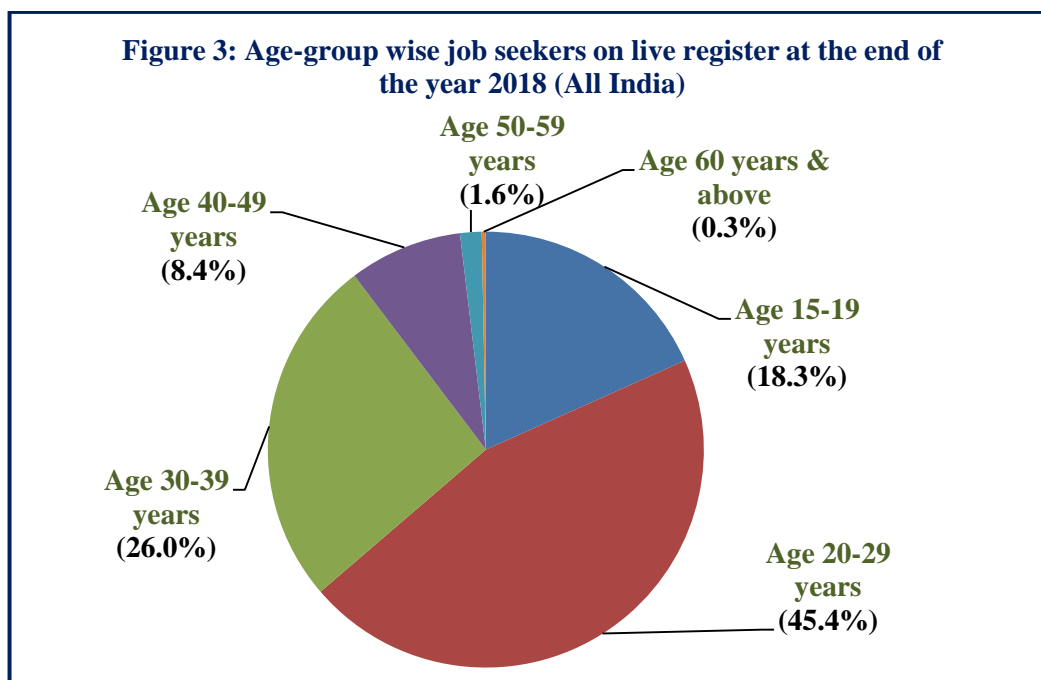
**Figure 2** shows the year-wise trend of women, SC and ST jobseekers on live register since 2014 to 2018. It reflects the highest number of women jobseekers on live register was 170.8 lakh during the year 2014. The number of ST jobseekers on live register has increased during the recent years.



## 2.2 AGE-WISE DISTRIBUTION OF JOBSEEKERS

Age-wise distribution of jobseekers on the live register for the years 2011-2018 are given in **Table 3**. State-wise number of jobseekers on the live register for various age group during the year 2018 are given in **Table 4**.

**Figure 3** shows the percentage distribution of jobseekers on live register at various age-groups during the year 2018. The highest number of jobseekers were registered on the live register were for the age group of 20-29 years during the year 2018.



The time series analysis of age-wise distribution of jobseekers on live register reveals that

- ❖ Approximately 63.7 % of the jobseekers were in the age group of 15-29 years.
- ❖ The number of jobseekers in the age group of 20-39 years was 326.4 lakh, which was approximately 72.9% of total number of jobseekers on live register during 2012 which has decreased to 71.4 % in 2018 depicting 300.6 lakh jobseekers.
- ❖ The number of jobseekers on live register in the age group of 30 years & above has decreased to 152.6 lakh during 2018 as compare to 161.5 lakh during the year 2012. The percentage of jobseekers in the age group of 30 years & above to the total number of jobseekers on live register was 36.3% during 2018.

## 2.3 EDUCATED JOBSEEKERS (10<sup>th</sup> Standard & above)

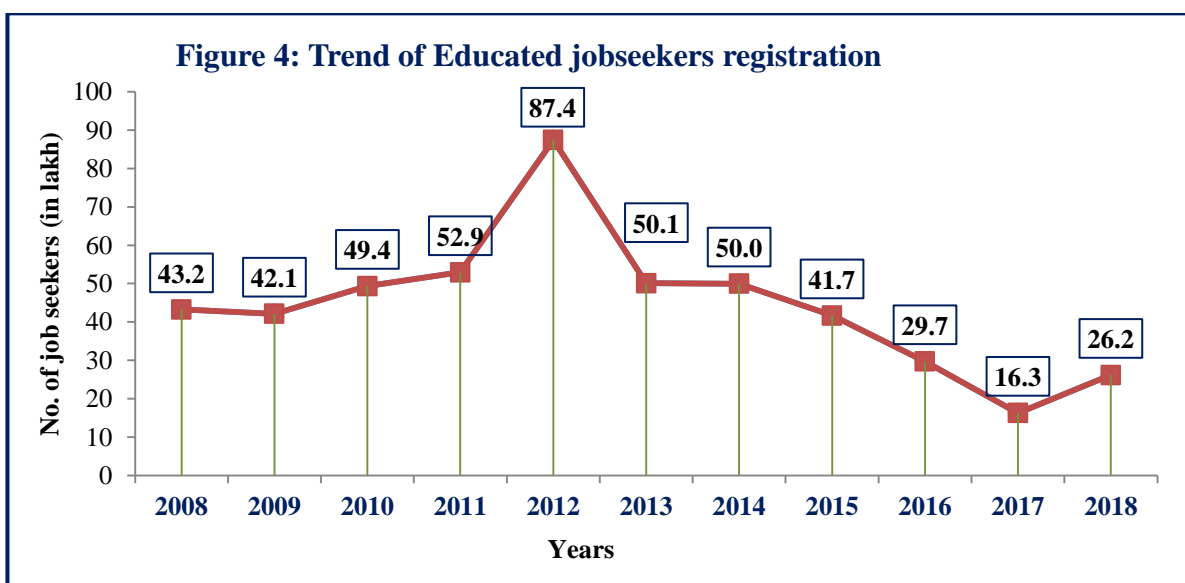
The major share of jobseekers awaiting jobs in the employment exchanges was that of educated persons. The details of registration, placement, live register, etc. of educated jobseekers since 2008 to 2018 are given in **Table 5**.

**Statement 3** shows the number of registration, placement and live register for educated jobseekers along with the percentage share of educated jobseekers on live register to the total number of jobseekers on live register.

It shows that around 26 lakh educated jobseekers got registered with the employment exchanges during the year 2018. The percentage of educated jobseekers on live register to the total live register has decreased from 83.7 % during 2014 to 66.2% during the year 2018. Out of the total placement of 4.05 lakh jobseekers during 2018, 92.8% placement was of educated jobseekers.

**Figure 4** represents the trend of number of registration of educated jobseekers since 2008 to 2018.



## Educated Jobseekers on Live register at various education level

The number of educated jobseeker registered on live register of employment exchanges according to various education levels for the year 2018 is given in **Table 6**. It is observed that

- ❖ The maximum number of jobseekers (36.0% share) in total educated jobseekers was educated upto 10<sup>th</sup> standard level.
- ❖ Higher Secondary or 12<sup>th</sup> passed accounted for 93.2 lakh (33.4%), Graduates, Post-Graduates and Diploma Holders & Others were 52.4 lakh (18.8%), 14.1 lakh (5.1%) and 18.5 lakh (6.7%) respectively.
- ❖ The educated women jobseekers were 49.6% of the total educated jobseekers on live register during 2018. Among the total educated jobseekers, 50.5 lakh women were 10<sup>th</sup> class passed, 44.9 lakh were 12<sup>th</sup> passed, 26.4 lakh were Graduates and 8.5 lakh were Post-Graduates. The educated women having education level of Diploma holders & others were 7.7 lakh during the year 2018.

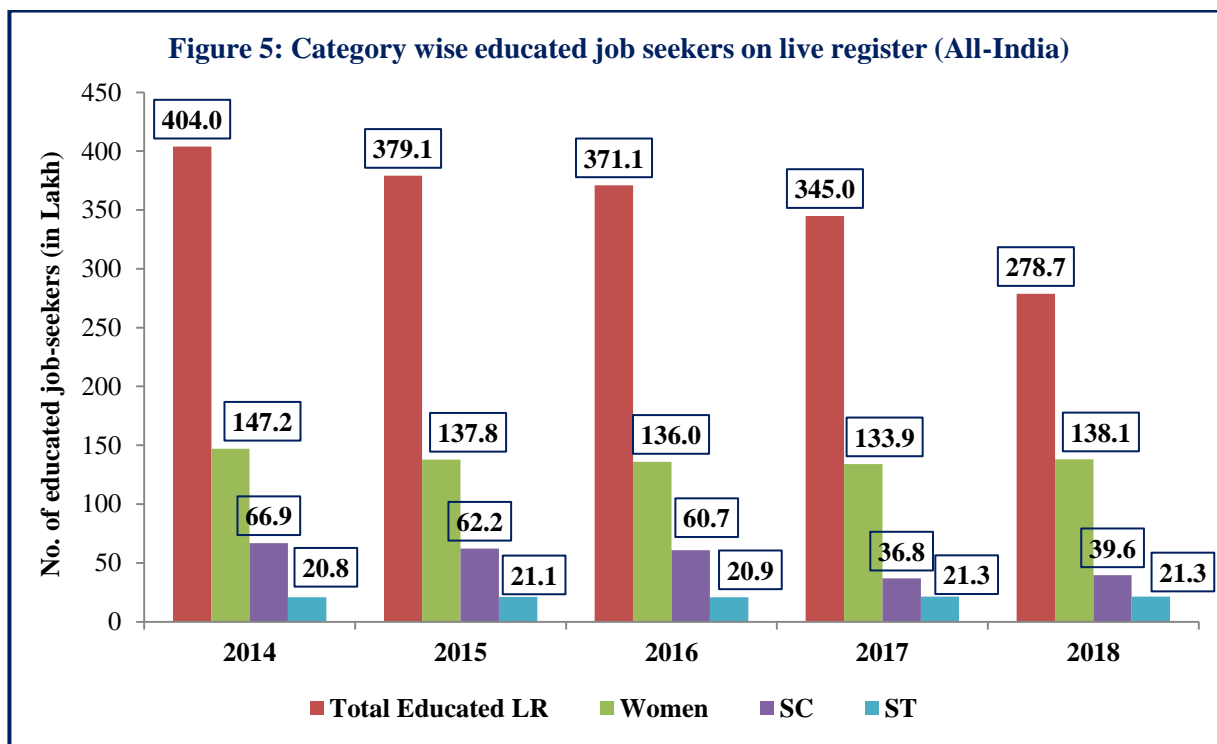
## Category-wise Educated Jobseekers

Women, SC and ST educated jobseekers on live register for the years 2014 to 2018 are given in **Statement 4**. It shows that the percentage of educated women jobseekers of the total educated jobseekers during the year 2018 has increased to 49.6% from 38.8% in 2017.

**Figure 5** shows the category-wise educated jobseekers on live register. It shows that the educated SC jobseekers have increased to 39.6 lakh in 2018 from 36.8 lakh in to previous year 2017. Educated ST jobseekers have marginally decreased during 2018 over the year 2017.



## 2.4 WOMEN JOB-SEEKERS

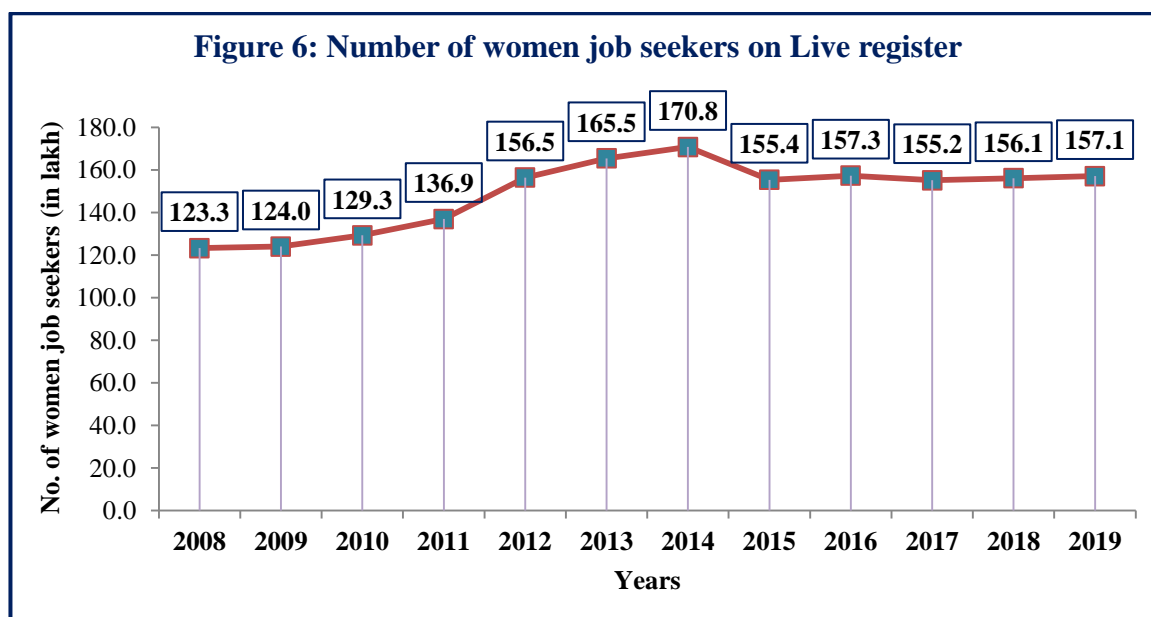

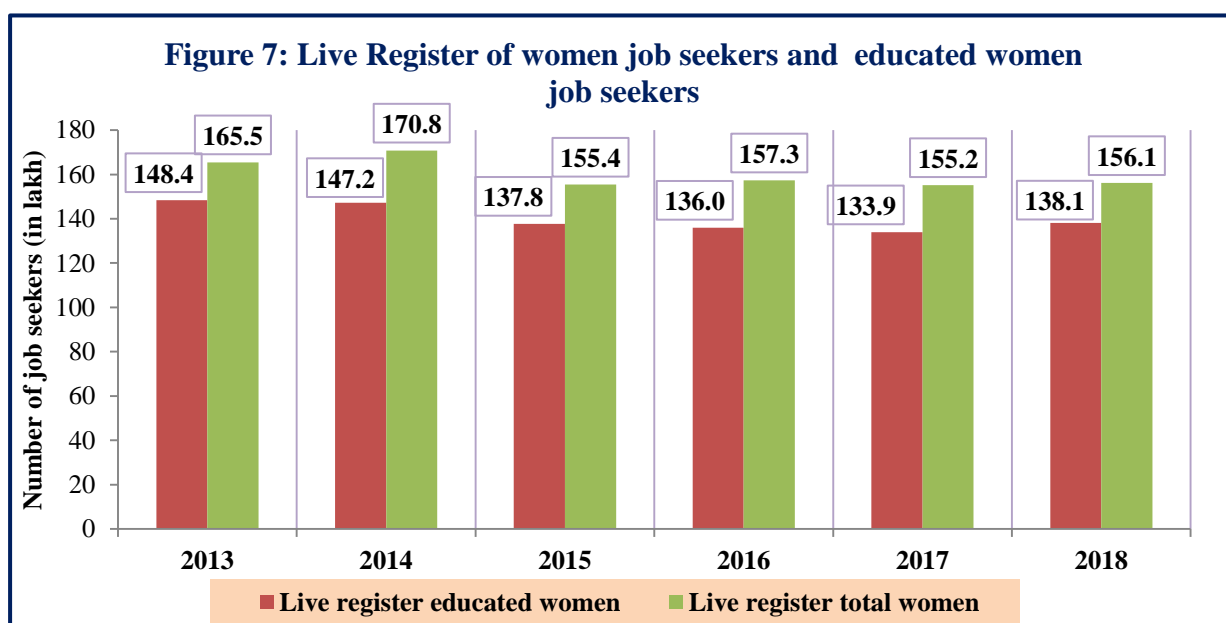
The data in the above **Statement 5** shows that

- ❖ Women jobseekers constituted around 37% of the total live register in 2019.
- ❖ Registration of women jobseekers has declined to 13.7 lakh during 2019 as compared to 14.4 lakh during the previous year 2018.
- ❖ The placement of women jobseekers through employment exchanges has slightly decreased to 0.55 lakh during the year 2019 against 0.58 lakh during 2018.
- ❖ The number of women jobseekers on live register has increased during 2019 as compared to the previous year.

The State/UT wise details of registration, placement, live register in respect of women jobseekers during the year 2019 is given in **Table 8**. Some of the main features are as follows:

- ❖ Among the major states, Tamil Nadu had the highest number of women jobseekers (36.9 lakh) on live register of employment exchanges followed by West Bengal (24.6 lakh) and Kerala (22.4 lakh).
- ❖ The highest number of women jobseekers who got registered in employment exchanges in the country during 2019 were in Uttar Pradesh (2.7 lakh) followed by Tamil Nadu (2.0 lakh) and Kerala (1.9 lakh).
- ❖ Out of 55.2 thousand women jobseekers placed through employment exchanges across the country, 47.4 thousand women jobseekers were placed by Gujarat.

## **2.5 CATEGORY WISE JOBSEEKERS: SCHEDULED CASTE (SC)/ SCHEDULED TRIBE (ST)/ OTHER BACKWARD CLASS (OBC)**

The employment service, as in the past, continued making efforts to cater to the special needs of Scheduled Castes (SC), Scheduled Tribes (ST) and Other Backward Classes (OBC) jobseekers. Over the years, a number of special measures were adopted by the employment exchanges to safeguard the interest of the jobseekers belonging to these categories. These includes:

- ✚ Maintenance of their registration cards separately
- ✚ Ensuring the vacancy notifications from public sector establishments invariably indicating details regarding reservation
- ✚ Providing vocational guidance and imparting recruitment training
- ✚ Sponsoring suitable candidates against unreserved vacancies
- ✚ Eliciting the cooperation of SC and ST association in locating suitable candidates.

### **Scheduled Caste jobseekers**

The year-wise details of registration, placement and live register, etc. in respect of Scheduled Caste jobseekers are given in **Table 10**.

- ❖ Over the period from 2008 to 2018, live register of SC job-seekers has increased from around 63 lakh in 2008 to 70 lakh in 2018, showing an increase over the period.
- ❖ SC jobseekers were 16.6% of the total jobseekers on the live register at the end of year 2018.



- ❖ Registration of SC jobseekers has declined to 4.0 lakh during the year 2018 against the previous year, which was 4.4 lakh.
- ❖ Placement of SC jobseekers during 2018 has increased against previous year. Percentage of placement to the registration of SC jobseekers during the year 2018 was 8.1%.

### **Educated Scheduled Caste jobseekers**

The year-wise performance of employment exchanges in respect of educated Scheduled Castes jobseekers is given in **Table 11**.

- ❖ The percentage of educated SC jobseekers to the total SC jobseekers has increased in 2018 against previous year.
- ❖ Out of around 32 thousand SC jobseekers placed through employment exchanges during 2018, 27 thousand were educated SC jobseekers. Live register of educated SC jobseekers has been fluctuated between 47.4 lakh to 39.6 lakh during 2008 to 2018.

### **Scheduled Tribe (ST) jobseekers**

The year wise performance of employment exchanges in respect of Scheduled Tribes (ST) jobseekers is given in **Table 12**.

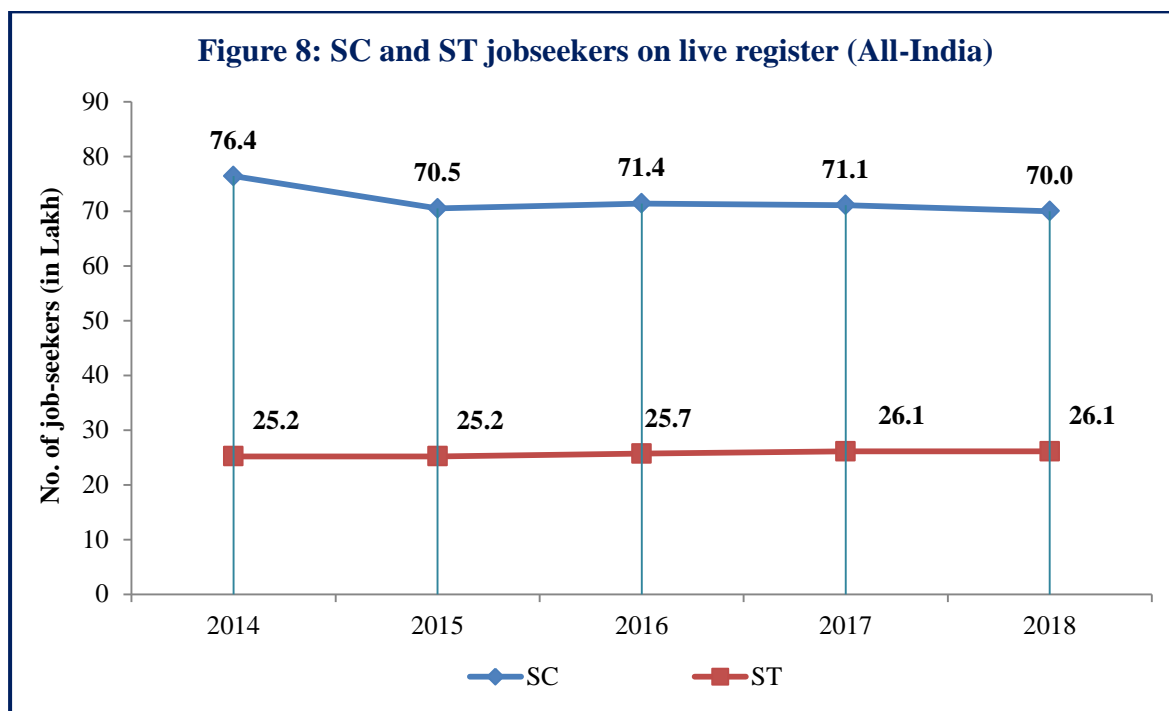
- ❖ Live register of ST jobseekers has marginally decreased during the year 2018 against the previous year. ST jobseekers were 6.1% of the total jobseekers on the live register at the end of year 2018.
- ❖ Registration of ST jobseekers has varied from around 3.1 lakh to 1.9 lakh over the period of 2008 to 2018.
- ❖ Placement of ST Jobseekers has decreased during 2018 against the previous year. Placement to registration ratio of ST Jobseekers was around 16.9% in 2018.

### **Educated Scheduled Tribes (ST) jobseekers**

The year wise performance of employment exchanges in respect of educated Scheduled Tribes (ST) jobseekers is given in **Table 13**.

- ❖ The percentage of educated ST Jobseekers to the all ST Jobseekers was 81.7% at the end of the year 2018, which were 21.3lakh.
- ❖ Out of 0.32 lakh ST Jobseekers placed through the employment exchanges during the year 2018, around 80 % were educated ST jobseekers.

**Figure 8** reflects the number of SC and ST jobseekers on live register for the period 2014 to 2018.



State-wise details of registration, placement and live register, etc in respect of Scheduled Caste (SC), Scheduled Tribe (ST) and Other Backward Class (OBC) jobseekers for the year 2018 is given in **Table 13-A**.

- ❖ The State wise table reveals that Tamil Nadu has maximum number of SC and OBC jobseekers around 18 lakh and 47.8 lakh respectively on the live register whereas Chhattisgarh and Assam have maximum number of ST jobseekers (3.9 lakh) and (2.9 lakh) respectively on the live register of the employment exchanges.
- ❖ Gujarat has placed maximum number of SC and ST Jobseekers around 28.15 thousand and 30.35 thousand respectively, whereas for OBC jobseekers, maximum placement was made in Kerala during 2018.
- ❖ Percentage of placement to registration was maximum in Gujarat among major States for SC, ST and Maharashtra for OBC jobseekers.

The position of reserved vacancies notified and filled by employment exchanges is given in **Table 14**. The ratio of vacancies filled to vacancies notified for jobseekers of SC, ST and OBC categories was 142.9%, 111.1% and 116.5% respectively during 2018.

## 2.6 DIFFERENTLY ABLED JOBSEEKERS

The Employment Service is making all efforts to cater to the special needs of the differently abled jobseekers. At all-India level, there were 42 Special Employment Exchanges working at the end of the year 2018 and Shimla employment exchanges was maintaining duplicate cards only. In addition to these special employment exchanges, there are 38 Special Cells for differently abled jobseekers in the normal Employment Exchanges which are also catering to special employment needs of differently abled jobseekers. Apart from these special cells and exchanges, normal employment exchanges also register the differently abled jobseekers.

Besides these, there are 21 National Career Service Centre for Differently Abled (NCSC-DA) erstwhile Vocational Rehabilitation Centres (VRCs) functioning at Mumbai, Hyderabad, Jabalpur, Delhi, Ludhiana, Kanpur, Calcutta, Chennai, Ahmedabad, Trivandrum, Bangalore, Guwahati, Bhubaneswar, Jaipur, Vadodara, Patna, Agartala, Una, Srinagar, Ranchi and Puducherry. These centres are working under the direct administrative control of Directorate General of Employment and evaluate the residual capacity of the differently abled persons, impart them vocational training and guidance and try to put them into the job or self-employment according to their capabilities. NCSC-DA had rehabilitated as many as 11.5 thousand persons during 2019 and 10.6 thousand during 2018.

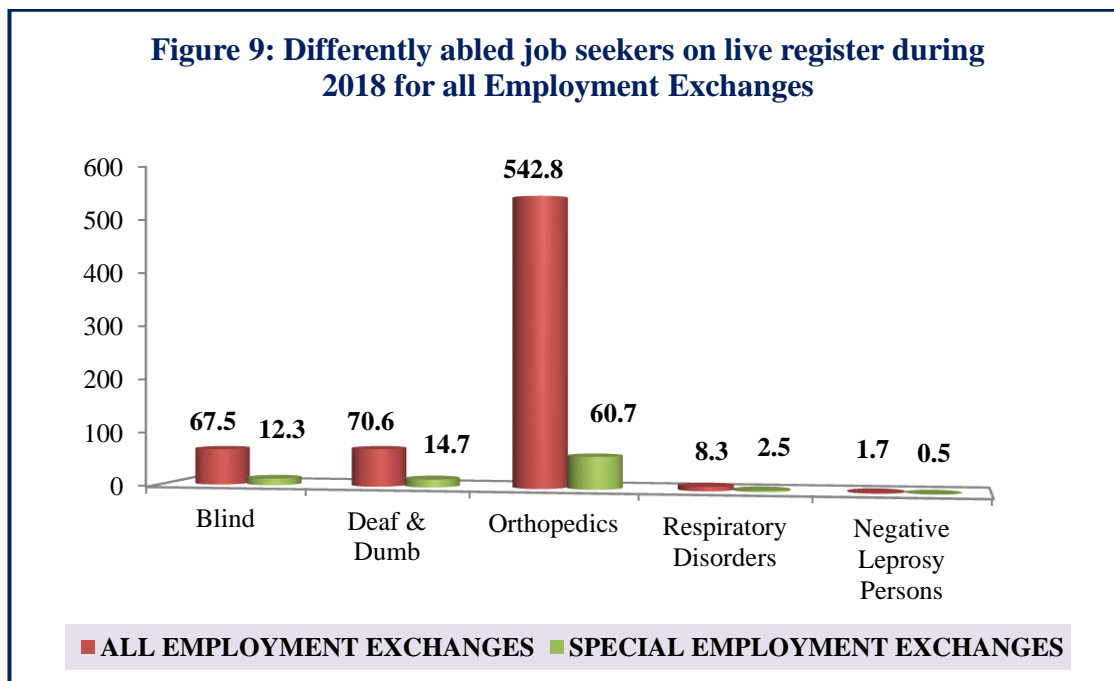

The statement 6 shows that the number of differently abled jobseekers on live register of all employment exchanges has slightly decreased during the year 2018 as compared to previous year. The placement through special employment exchanges has also decreased during the said period.

The differently abled jobseekers having infirmity of orthopedics was found to be maximum in number on the live register of employment exchanges followed by deaf & dumb and blind during the year 2018.

**Figure 9** shows the disability wise jobseekers on live register for the year 2018.



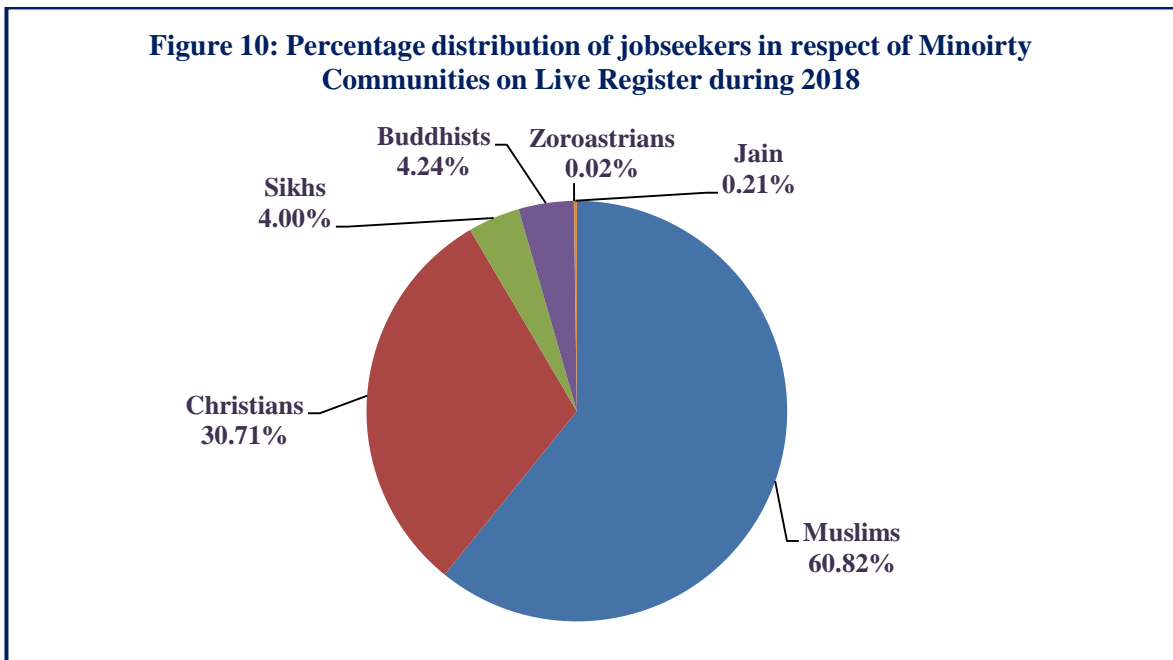
## 2.7 MIGRANTS AND REPATRIATES

The employment service continued to render assistance in the resettlement of migrants and repatriates from Myanmar, Sri Lanka and East Pakistan. **Table 20** shows the performance of employment exchanges in respect of migrant jobseekers from East Pakistan, repatriates from Myanmar and Sri Lanka to India. Table 20 depicted that the live register of migrant was 0.01% of total jobseekers on live register at the end of the year 2018.

## 2.8 MINORITY COMMUNITIES JOBSEEKERS

The main minority communities in India are Muslims, Christians, Sikhs, Buddhists, Jain and Zoroastrians. The statement showing the performance of employment exchanges in respect of Minority Communities is given in **Table 21**. Number of jobseekers belonging to all minority communities put together at the end of 2018 on live register of employment exchanges in India was 57.8 lakh, accounting for 13.7% of total jobseekers on the live register.

**Figure 10** represents the percentage distribution of jobseekers on the live register in respect of minority communities for the year 2018.



The followings are the main highlights in respect of minority communities jobseekers:

- ❖ Out of total minority communities' jobseekers live register, 35 lakh (60.8%) were Muslims, 17.7 lakh (30.7%) Christians, 2.5 lakh (4.2%) Buddhists, 2.3 lakh (4.0%) Sikhs, 12 thousand (0.2%) Jains and Zoroastrians were around 900.
- ❖ During the year 2018, around 3.9 lakh minority jobseekers got registered with the employment exchanges across India. The maximum registration was made in respect of Muslim jobseekers (1.8 lakh) followed by Christians (1.5 lakh) and Sikh jobseekers (0.3lakh).
- ❖ The maximum placement was made in respect of Muslim job-seekers (7.7 thousand). The percentage of placement to submission was maximum for Buddhists (22.6%) followed by Muslims (17.1%).

## **2.9 EX-ITI AND FULL TERM APPRENTICES**

The performance of employment exchanges in respect of Ex-ITI and Full Term Apprentices during the years 2008 to 2018 is given in **Table 22**. The jobseekers who have completed ITI courses and got themselves registered with the employment exchange was around 0.9 lakh at the end of the year 2018. The Ex-ITI jobseekers placed through the employment exchanges were around 6.5 thousand during the year 2018.

The jobseekers who have completed full term apprentice and got themselves registered with the employment exchange was 4110 during 2018. The full term apprentice jobseekers placed through the employment exchanges were 569 during the year 2018.

## **2.9 OCCUPATION GROUP-WISE JOB-SEEKERS (NCO 2004)**

Number of jobseekers on the live register of employment exchanges classified by broad occupational groups at the end of 2018 is given in **Table 23**. It may be seen that out of 421.2 lakh jobseekers on live register of employment exchanges in the country at the end of the year 2018, around 297.4 lakh i.e. the majority of the jobseekers (70.6%) were found to be in the category of workers not classified by any occupation, meaning thereby that the majority of jobseekers were in experienced, fresher and therefore did not fall under any category of occupation. Second highest around 38.6 lakh (9.2%) jobseekers were in the category of clerks followed by Professionals 28.6 lakh (6.8%), Technician and Associate Professionals 20.1 lakh (4.8%) and Craft and Related Trades workers were 15.3 lakh (3.6%). The lowest number of jobseekers was belonged to Skilled agricultural and fishery workers. In case of woman job-seekers which were 156.1 lakh in 2018, out of which 112.4 lakh (72%) were in the category of workers not elsewhere classified followed by 10.1% in the category of Clerk and 8.7% in Professionals category.
