2. This Review focuses on the employment situation that prevailed in the organised sector during the year 1996-97 and is likely to be of utility in the areas of vocational guidance, educational planning, craftsmen and technical training, manpower planning and monitoring of employment generation.

I am thankful to all employers for their cooperation in furnishing the requisite information through the employment returns prescribed under the Employment Exchanges (Compulsory Notification of Vacancies) Act 1959 & Rules framed there under. I am also grateful to the Directorates of Employment of various States and Union Territories and their officers and staff, as also to the EMI Units of the Employment Exchanges for their active participation and wholehearted devotion & cooperation in the course of field enquiries.

4. I would wish to place on record my appreciation of the work accomplished by Sh. A.K. Khanna, Deputy Director of Employment Exchanges and the officers & staff of EMI section and Data Processing Unit under the over all supervision and guidance of Sh. P.K. ## CHAPTER-I

### HIGHLIGHTS

- 1.1 The present Employment Review is twenty-eighth in the series of Annual Employment Reviews being published by the Directorate General of Employment and Training (DGE&T), Ministry of Labour, Government of India, and pertains to the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March, 1997. This Review is based on the information collected by the network of Employment Exchanges in the country under the Employment Market Information (EMI) Programme of the DGE&T, which was initiated more than thirty seven years ago.

### COVERAGE OF EMI PROGRAMME

- 1.2 The EMI Programme relates to the "Organised Sector" of our economy. This organised sector covers all establishments in the Public Sector, irrespective of their size and non-agricultural establishments in the Private Sector employing 10 or more persons. Information in respect of all the Public Sector establishments and non-agricultural establishments in the Private Sector employing 25 or more persons is collected statutorily under the provisions of the Employment Exchanges (Compulsory Notification of Vacancies) Act, 1959 and information from smaller non-agricultural establishments in the Private Sector employing 10-24 persons is collected on voluntary basis.

### ESTABLISHMENTS IN THE ORGANISED SECTOR

- 1.3 There were 2.78 lakh establishments on the Employer's Register of Employment Exchanges at the end of March, 1997. Of these 1.65 lakh were in the Public Sector and remaining 1.13 lakh in Private Sector. There was marginal increase in the number of establishments both in the Public and Private Sectors. It has registered an overall increase of 1.4% over the previous year. The Public Sector establishments increased from 1.62 lakh at the end of March 1996 to 1.65 lakh at the end of March 1997 recording an increase of 2.1%. All branches of Public Sector recorded increase in the number of establishments. Central Government recorded a growth of 6.7%. The increase of establishments in the Private Sector was of the order of 0.4%. The increase of larger establishments was recorded as 1.6%, while in the case of smaller establishments there was a marginal decrease of 0.7%.

### EMPLOYMENT IN THE ORGANISED SECTOR

- 1.4 Employment in the organised sector went up from 277.80 lakh in March, 1996 to 285.18 lakh in March, 1997 recording an increase of 2.7%. However, during the preceding year 1995-96 there was decrease of the order 0.7%. The Private Sector employment recorded an increase of 1.7% and Public Sector employment showed an increase of 3.1%. The increase of 1.7% in Private Sector employment during

the period under review 1996-97 was lower as compared to 3.3% recorded in the previous year 1995-96. In the Public Sector increase of 3.1% in employment was recorded during the period under report 1996-97 as against decrease of 2.4% during the corresponding period of the previous year 1995-96.

### **EMPLOYMENT IN DIFFERENT ZONES/REGIONS.**

- 1.5 During the year under review 1996-97, all zones/regions except Western, Eastern and Southern Zones of the country recorded negative growth in employment. The Eastern Zone recorded the highest growth in Employment (7.5%) followed by Southern Zone (4.3%) and Western Zone (2.0%). The maximum decrease in employment was recorded in Northern Zone (0.8%) followed by North-Eastern Zone (0.3%) and Central Zone (0.1%).

### **EMPLOYMENT IN DIFFERENT INDUSTRY DIVISIONS.**

- 1.6 During 1996-97, as would be observed from results shown in Table 11, there was an increase in employment in most industry divisions. The maximum increase in employment was recorded in Industry Division Manufacturing(7.1%) followed by Transport, Storage and Communication (4.5%), Community, Social and Personal Services (1.9%), Electricity, Gas and Water (1.6%) and Financing, Insurance, Real Estate and Business Services (1.2%). The decrease in employment was recorded highest in Mining and Quarrying (4.1%) followed by Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry and Fishing (3.1%) and Construction (2.0%).

### **WOMEN EMPLOYMENT**

- 1.7 Employment of women in the organised sector went up from 45.27 lakh in March, 1996 to 47.16 lakh in March, 1997 registering an increase of 4.2%. Women's employment in the Public Sector recorded an increase of 3.5% during the year under report ( 1996-97), whereas in the Private Sector the increase was 5.1%. In absolute terms, the number of women employees in the Public Sector went up from 26.42 lakh in March, 1996 to 27.34 lakh in March, 1997 and in the case of Private Sector their number increased from 18.85 lakh in March,96 to 19.82 lakh in March, 1997.

### **WORK-SEEKERS**

- 1.8 The number of work-seekers registered with the Employment Exchanges in the country had gone up from 368.25 lakh at the end of March, 1996 to 376.31 lakh at the end of March, 1997 recording an increase of 2.2.%. The number of educated job-seekers ( Matriculates and above) increased from 248.22 lakh at the end of March, 1996 to 258.85 lakh at the end of March, 1997.

## **EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES**

- 1.9 The number of vacancies notified to the employment Exchanges by various employers in the country during January.-December, 1997 was only 3.93 lakh as against 4.24 lakh vacancies notified during January-December, 1996. A fall in the proportion of vacancies notified to registrations effected at the employment exchanges by various employers over the last ten years from 9.1% in 1988 to 6.2% in 1997 appears to be an alarming feature indicating dis-popularity of the services of Employment Exchanges resulting in decrease of placement effected to registrations which went down from 5.5% in 1988 to 4.3% in 1997 as is evident from data in Table 27.



## CHAPTER-II

### THE ECONOMIC SCENARIO 1996-97

- 2.1 The year 1995-96 witnessed a very satisfactory growth rate of GDP of 7.1. The momentum of growth has been maintained in 1996-97, thus providing increasing evidence that the growth potential has improved as a result of the reforms initiated in 1991. With the passing of election distractions, the pace of economic reform was also revived. The reform initiatives have been introduced or strengthened in almost every critical infrastructure sub-sector since June, 1996. There have also been new policy measures in several areas such as Industrial delicensing, foreign investment, trade policy, financial sector and capital markets. With the growing participation of virtually the entire spectrum of political opinion in the reform process, there is a good prospect that a higher growth rate would become a permanent feature of the economy.
- 2.2 The initial spurt of reforms from 1991-92 to 1993-94 was very successful by all accounts resulting in a jump of economic growth to 7.2% in 1994-95 (in terms of GDP at factor cost). Since 1994-95, however, there was a marked slow down in the pace of reforms. The slackening of reforms preceding and during the election period may have been responsible for some loss of momentum, but this has been revived with a series of measures in recent months. Economic growth 1996-97 is estimated by CSO to be around 6.8%(GDP at factor cost). Thus the eighth plan is likely to end with an average growth of 6.5% per annum, 0.9% point higher than the target rate of 5.6% and 0.5% point higher than the actual achievement of the Seventh Plan. More important for the future is the fact that the average growth during the latest three years is 7%.
- 2.3 A comparison of some salient dimensions of economic performance between the eighth plan period and its predecessor reveals the following :-
- Overall economic growth has been faster.
  - The manufacturing sector has grown almost 2% points faster per year.
  - Both Exports and Imports have grown significantly faster in the eighth plan period.
  - The balance of payments has strengthened considerably with trade and current account deficit declining as ratios of GDP, while exports and imports have grown rapidly both in value terms as well as in proportion to GDP.
  - The Central Government's fiscal deficit as a proportion of GDP has declined significantly.
  - The average rate of gross domestic savings has risen substantially from 20.6% of GDP in the seventh Plan period to 23.9% in the first four years of the eighth Plan.
  - With the exception of Telecommunications, the rate of growth of net output (Value added) of infrastructure sectors has slowed.
  - The average rate of inflation has risen somewhat though remaining below double digits.

The selected economic indicators in the following table reflect % changes that have been recorded during 1990-91 and 1996-97 in the gross national product, Agricultural production, Food grain production, Industrial production, Electricity generation, Wholesale Price Index, Monetary resources, Imports, Exports etc.

**SPECIAL EMPLOYMENT PROGRAMMES**

- 2.4 Ongoing employment programmes like Integrated Rural Development Programme (IRDP), Training of Rural Youth for Self Employment (TRYSEM), Jawahar Rozgar Yojana (JRY), Nehru Rozgar Yojana (NRY) and Prime Minister's Rozgar Yojana (PMRY) have been further strengthened to ensure

generation of more employment, creation of productive assets, imparting of technical, entrepreneurial skills and raising the income level of the very poor.

- 2.5 The Employment Assurance Scheme is aimed at providing assured employment to all persons in Rural Areas who are below the poverty line and are seeking employment but are unable to find it. The coverage of EAS has since been extended to 3206 Blocks. A decision has been taken to universalise the scheme. The scope of the scheme has also been enlarged for taking up horticultural activities on individual beneficiary's land of marginal farmers. Over 22.3 million persons have been registered under the scheme. In 1996-97 about 400.6 million mandays jobs were generated.
- 2.6 Since 1993-94, the JRY was being implemented in the following three streams :-

First stream

Comprising of general works under the JRY and the two sub schemes namely, the Indra Awas Yojana (IAY) and the Million Wells Schemes (MWS).

Second Stream

Second stream of JRY (also called as the Intensified JRY) is implemented in 120 identified backward districts with additional allocation.

Third Stream

Third stream of JRY consists of special and innovative projects.

In the light of the experience gained in the past the modalities of implementing the Jawahar Rozgar Yojana (JRY) have been considered in detail during 1995-96 and it has been decided to continue the First Stream comprising of general works under the JRY and the third stream consisting of special and innovative projects of JRY on the existing lines. However, two sub schemes namely the Indira Awas Yojana (IAY) and Million Wells Scheme (MWS) of the first stream, as mentioned above, will be implemented as separate schemes ( in their own right ) and will not form part of the first stream of JRY. The Second Stream of JRY ( also called as the Intensified JRY) stands merged with the Employment Assurance Scheme with effect from 1.1.1996. The third stream (innovative JRY) for taking up pilot projects of innovative nature is being implemented with the stipulation, namely 5% of JRY funds or maximum of Rs.75 crore.

- 2.7 Prime Minister's Rozgar Yojana (PMRY) is aimed at assisting seven lakh educated unemployed youth in setting up self-employment ventures in the industry, service and business sectors during the 8<sup>th</sup> five year plan. Sustainable employment is expected to be created for fourteen lakh persons at the average rate of 2 persons per enterprise. By the end of November 1996 as many as 6.23 lakh youth had been sanctioned loans.

- 2.8 Nehru Rozgar Yojana (NRY) is aimed at creating employment opportunities through three schemes such as wage employment, micro enterprise and shelter upgradation for the urban poor. A sum of Rs. 71 crore has been allocated during 1996-97 budget.
- 2.9 The Prime Minister's Integrated Urban Poverty Eradication programme was launched in November, 1995 which seeks to attack several root causes of Urban poverty simultaneously in an integrated manner with the specific objectives of achievement of social sector goals, community empowerment, employment generation and skill upgradation, shelter upgradation and environmental improvement with a multi pronged and long term strategy. As on October, 1996 over fourteen thousand and eleven thousand beneficiaries have been identified for self employment and shelter upgradation.
- 2.10 The Integrated Rural Development Programme (IRDP) along with wage employment programmes formed the corner stones of the Government's strategy of direct attack on rural poverty through creation of employment for vulnerable groups. This is a centrally sponsored scheme with subsidy being shared between the Centre and the States on 50:50 basis. Besides, central outlay includes provision for supply of improved tool kits to general artisans below the poverty line.
- 2.11 The targets and achievements of the special employment programmes are given in Table-2.

include Owners, Proprietors, Managers, Working Partners, or Directors of Firms/Companies who work full time for the firms/companies.

### **GEOGRAPHICAL COVERAGE**

- 3.4 The EMI programme is being implemented in all the States and Union Territories of the country except Arunachal Pradesh, Sikkim, Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Lakshadweep. The programme could not be extended to these States/UTs so far due to administrative reasons. The smaller establishments employing 10-24 persons in the Private Sector in metropolitan areas of greater Mumbai and Calcutta are also not being covered owing to administrative reasons.

### **REFERENCE PERIOD**

- 3.5 The EMI data are furnished by the establishments through ER-I and ER-II returns. The form ER-I is used for the collection of information from the establishments at quarterly intervals i.e. 31<sup>st</sup> March, 30<sup>th</sup> June, 30 September and 31<sup>st</sup> December of each year.

### **ORGANISATION OF THE PROGRAMME**

- 3.6 The information collected through ER-I is scrutinised, tabulated and disseminated at the area, state and national level. The employment exchanges prepare Area Employment Market Reviews to indicate employment situation in the organised sector within the district. The State Directors of Employment also prepare state level Employment Reviews showing employment situation prevailing at the State level. At the National level, Employment Reviews are prepared annually by the Directorate General of Employment and Training projecting the overall picture of Employment in the organised sector in different States/UTs. The present Employment Review provides information regarding employment in the organised sector at the end of the year 1996-97. The National Industrial Classification (NIC) 1987 was followed in classifying the employment data by industries.

### **LIMITATIONS OF EMI DATA**

- 3.7 The EMI programme does not cover :-
- a) Employment in the un-organised sector.
  - b) Self Employment
  - c) Part-time employment
  - d) Employment in agricultural and allied establishments which furnish employment returns only on voluntary basis.
  - e) Employment in house-hold Sector and non-agricultural establishments employing less than 10 workers in Private Sector.
  - f) Employment in Defence forces.
  - g) Employment in Indian Embassies and Missions abroad.

- 2.8 Nehru Rozgar Yojana (NRY) is aimed at creating employment opportunities through three schemes such as wage employment, micro enterprise and shelter upgradation for the urban poor. A sum of Rs. 71 crore has been allocated during 1996-97 budget.
- 2.9 The Prime Minister's Integrated Urban Poverty Eradication programme was launched in November, 1995 which seeks to attack several root causes of Urban poverty simultaneously in an integrated manner with the specific objectives of achievement of social sector goals, community empowerment, employment generation and skill upgradation, shelter upgradation and environmental improvement with a multi pronged and long term strategy. ## CHAPTER-III

### EMPLOYMENT MARKET INFORMATION PROGRAMME

#### OBJECTIVES

- 3.1 The main objectives of the Employment Market Information(EMI) Programme are :-
- I) to provide information at short intervals about the structure of employment in the public and private sectors at the area, state and national levels and also to monitor the changes in the level of employment.
  - II) to present occupational composition and educational profile of employees in the public and private sector establishments.
  - III) to identify the occupations which are characteristic to a given industry.
  - IV) to assess the manpower shortages in the organised sector.
  - V) to make available information required to improve and add to the services offered by the National Employment Service.
  - VI) to monitor the progress in generating employment during the five year Plans.

#### COVERAGE

- 3.2 The EMI programme was initiated in the year 1955 as a Pilot Project in Delhi which was subsequently extended to selected areas ( Districts) in various States during the Second Five Year Plan period . The programme was provided a statutory base with the enactment of the Employment Exchanges ( Compulsory Notification of Vacancies) EE(CNV) Act 1959. The data collected under the EMI programme covers only the Organised Sector of the economy which interalia, covers all establishments in the Public Sector irrespective of their size and non-agricultural establishments in the Private Sector employing 10 or more persons. While the information from non-agricultural establishments in the Private Sector employing 25 or more persons is collected under the provisions of EE(CNV) Act 1959, data from the establishments employing 10-24 persons is collected on a voluntary basis.
- 3.3 Under the EMI programme collection of data is done following the "establishment reporting system". The establishments are required to furnish at regular intervals details about the number of persons they employ by sex, vacancies that have occurred and the type of persons which are in short supply. This information relates only to 'Employers' and 'Employees'. Employers



include Owners, Proprietors, Managers, Working Partners, or Directors of Firms/Companies who work full time for the firms/companies.

### **GEOGRAPHICAL COVERAGE**

- 3.4 The EMI programme is being implemented in all the States and Union Territories of the country except Arunachal Pradesh, Sikkim, Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Lakshadweep. The programme could not be extended to these States/UTs so far due to administrative reasons. The smaller establishments employing 10-24 persons in the Private Sector in metropolitan areas of greater Mumbai and Calcutta are also not being covered owing to administrative reasons.

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  - c) Part-time employment
  - d) Employment in agricultural and allied establishments which furnish employment returns only on voluntary basis.
  - e) Employment in house-hold Sector and non-agricultural establishments employing less than 10 workers in Private Sector.
  - f) Employment in Defence forces.
  - g) Employment in Indian Embassies and Missions abroad.

Other limitations of EMI Programme are:-

- a) The frame of establishments maintained at local employment exchange is not comprehensive in certain cases due to non inclusion of new and emerging establishments.
- b) There is an element of estimation of employment in respect of non-responding establishments.
- c) Employment created under various employment/beneficiary oriented schemes/programmes viz. NREP, RLEGP, IRDP, TRYSEM. etc. might be erroneously reported under the EMI Programme.

**COVERAGE OF ESTABLISHMENTS IN THE ORGANISED SECTOR AT THE END OF MARCH, 1997.**

- 3.8 On the basis of information furnished by the Directorates of Employment in various States/Union Territories, there were 2,783,15 establishments borne on the Employers' Register as on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 1997. Of these, the required employment returns were rendered by 2,084,56 establishments both in the Public and Private Sectors. The rate of response works out to 74.9% during the year 1996-97 as against 75.1% achieved during the last year i.e. 1995-96.
- 3.9 The coverage of Public Sector comprises establishments of Central Government, State Government, Quasi Government ( Central), Quasi Government (State) and Local Bodies. In the Private Sector, the establishments are grouped on the basis of the number of persons employed therein. Establishments employing 25 or more persons are categorised as larger establishments and those employing 10-24 persons are termed as smaller establishments.

3.10 It is observed from the above table that out of the total number of 165091 establishments in the public sector 77.6% rendered the returns whereas in the private sector out of 113224 establishments 70.9 % rendered the returns. The analysis of the rate of response reveals that in the public sector the highest number (82.4%) of establishments in Local Bodies rendered the employment return, followed by State Govt. (78.4%), Quasi Govt. (State) (77.1%) Quasi-Govt. (Central) (76.2%) and Central Govt. establishments (69.5%) In the Private Sector, 75.5% of the Larger Establishments and 66.9 % of the Smaller Establishments had sent the employment returns for the period ending March, 1997.

**BRANCHWISE & SIZEWISE DISTRIBUTION OF ESTABLISHMENTS**

3.11 Table-4 below presents the distribution of establishments by different branches of public and private sectors as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 1996 and 1997

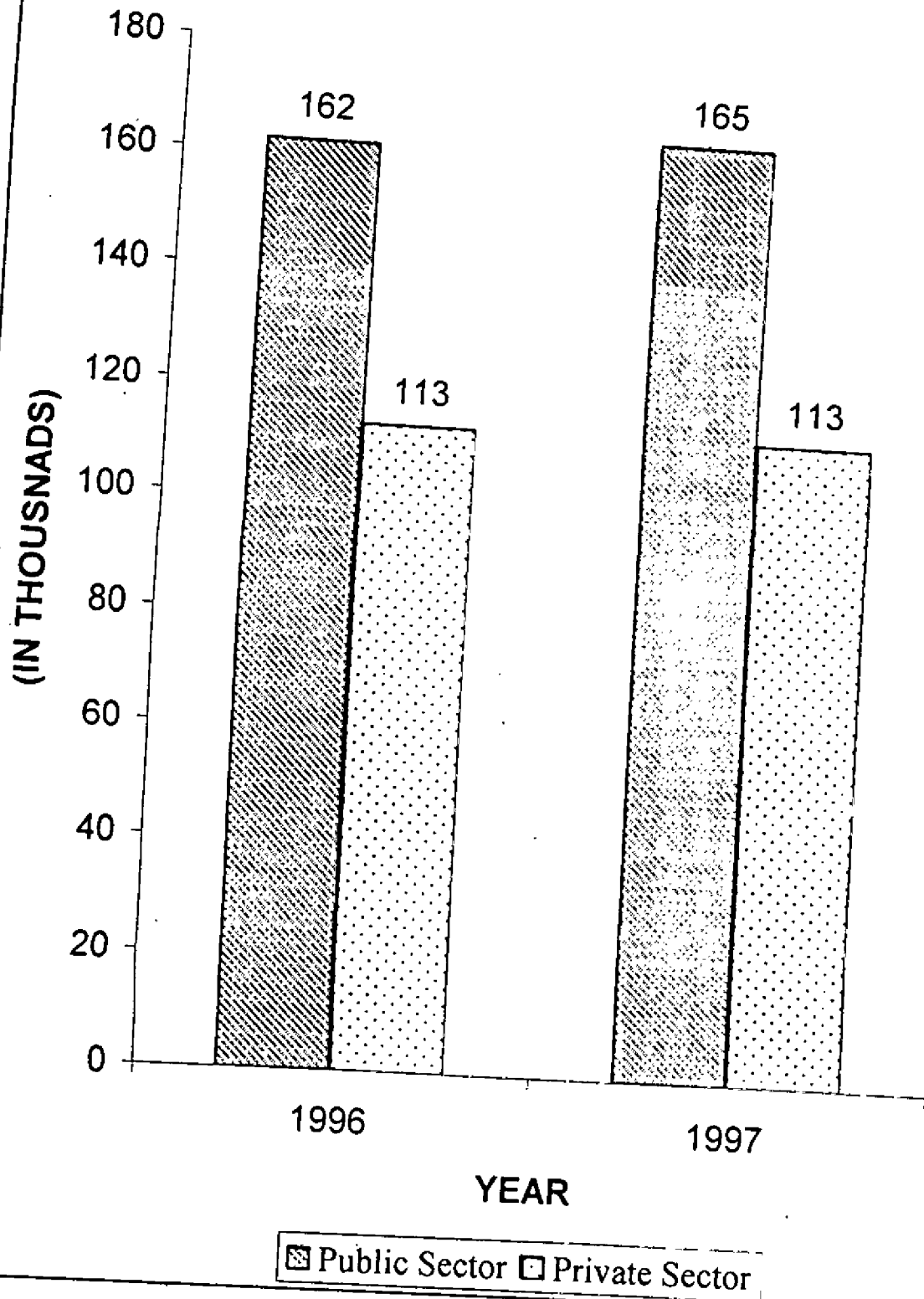

3.12 It is seen from the above Table that there was increase in the number of establishments in all the branches of the public sector including larger establishments in the private sector but there was decline in smaller establishments during the year 1996-97. A graphical representation of number of establishments in the organised sector is given in the next page.

**COVERAGE OF ESTABLISHMENTS IN DIFFERENT ZONES / REGIONS :**

3.13 The entire country has been divided into six Zones / Regions, viz., Northern Zone, Central Zone, Eastern Zone, North-Eastern Zone, Western Zone and Southern Zone. The Andaman & Nicobar Islands is outside the scheme of Zonal Councils embodied in the States Reorganisation Act, 1956. Table-5 below shows the number of establishments in the six zones and in the Union Territories of A & N Islands in 1996 and 1997.

3.14 The above Table reveals that the maximum percentage increase of establishments in the organised sector over the previous year was recorded in the Western Zone (3.5%), whereas the total number of establishments had shown marginal increase (1.4%). The increase in the number of establishments over the previous year was recorded in all the zones, North-Eastern Zone (2.0%), followed by Southern Zone (1.0%). There was a marginal increase in other zones, Northern Zone (0.9%), Central Zone (0.8%), and Eastern Zone (0.7%). The number of establishments according to the State/Union Territories is contained in Annexure-I.

**ESTABLISHMENTS COVERED IN DIFFERENT INDUSTRIES/ SERVICES:**

3.15 The distribution of establishments in the organised sector by Industrial Divisions in 1996 and 1997 is shown in Table-6 below:

3.16 The Primary and Tertiary sectors showed marginal increase of 1.2% and 1.3% respectively whereas the secondary sector showed a decline of 2.0% in the number of establishments over the previous year 1996. The Manufacturing and Electricity, Gas & Water division in the secondary sector recorded the highest growth of 2.1% and 1.0% respectively in the number of establishments over the previous year 1996, followed by Community, Social & Personal Services. The Tertiary sector 1.9% and Financing, Insurance, Real Estate and Business Services 1.1%. Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry & Fishing also recorded a growth 1.7% in the Primary Sector. The remaining industrial divisions in the Primary, Secondary and Tertiary sectors recorded a decline. The number of establishments in the Public and Private sectors classified by industry groups is given in Annexure-II.



**CHAPTER -IV**  
**EMPLOYMENT IN THE ORGANISED SECTOR**

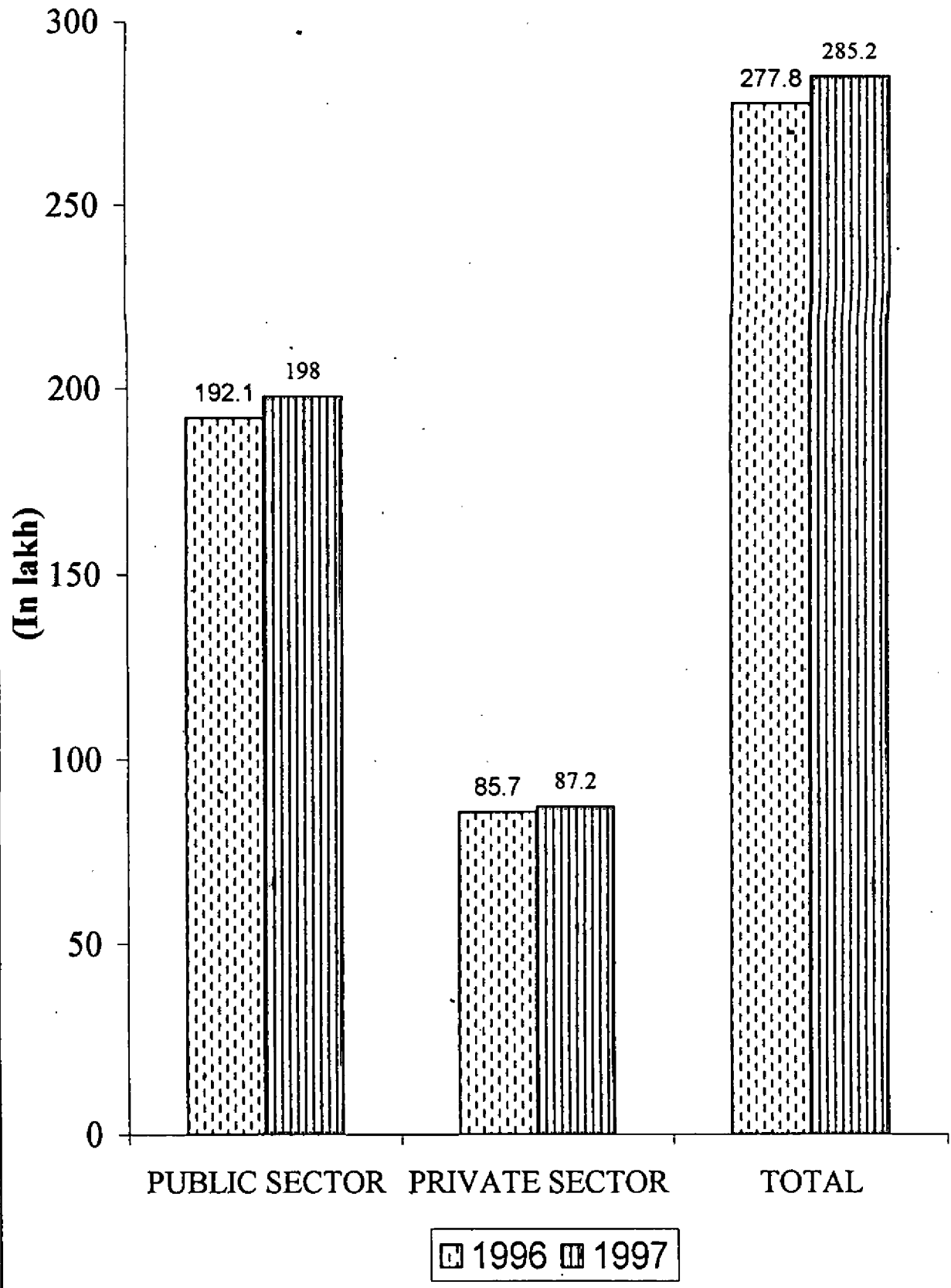
- 4.1 During the year under review (1996-97), employment in the organised sector showed an increase of 2.7%. There was marginal decline of 0.7% in the employment during the preceding year (1995-96). In absolute terms, employment in the organised sector increased from 277.80 lakhs at the end of March, 1996 to 285.18 lakhs at the end of March, 1997.
- 4.2 The sector-wise break-up of employment as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 1996 and 1997 and percentage variation in 1997 over 1996 is shown in the following Table.

It is revealed from the data contained in the Table-7 above that employment in the public sector recorded increase of 3.1% in 1997 over the year 1996. Private sector employment has also shown an increase of 1.7% during the same period. A graphical representation of Employment in the organised sector (Public & Private) as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 1996 & 1997 is given on the next page.

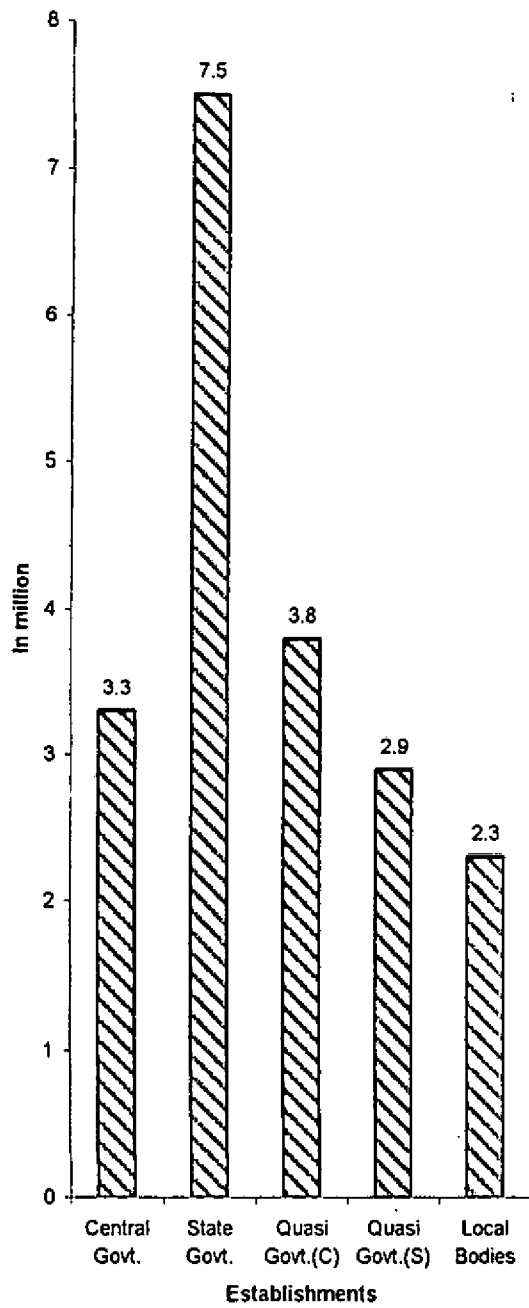

An analysis of employment in different branches of the public sector revealed that the rise in employment was recorded in all the branches of Public Sector. The maximum increase was recorded in Quasi-Govt (Central) (6.9%), followed by Central Govt. (5.4%), Local Bodies (5.3%), Quasi-Govt (State) (1.1%) and State Govt (0.4%). A graphical representation showing Employment in the different branches of Public Sector and Private Sector by size of establishment as on 31.3.97 is given on the next page.

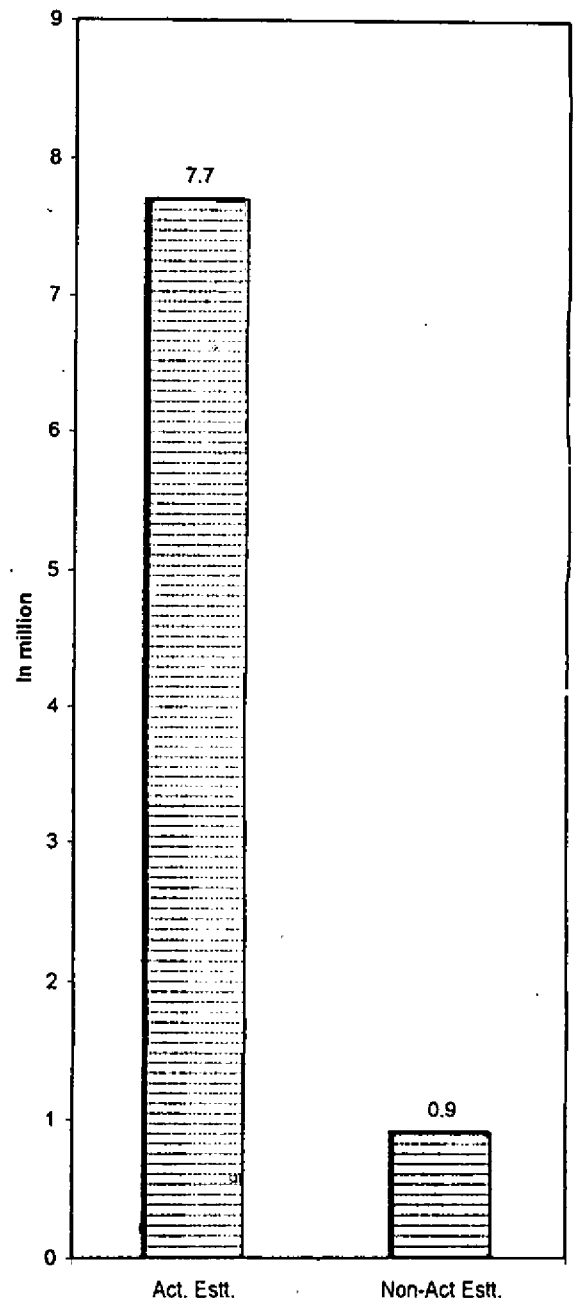

It may be observed from the Table-9 that employment in larger establishments in the private sector went up by 1.9% while in the smaller establishments, there was no change. The overall increase in employment in the Private Sector was of the order of 1.7% during the period under review.

Table-10 reveals that the maximum increase in Employment in the country was recorded in Eastern Zone (7.5%) followed by Southern Zone(4.3%) and Western Zone (2.0%). There was a decline in employment in all the other Zones in the country including Andaman & Nicobar Island. The maximum decrease in employment was recorded in Andaman & Nicobar Islands, which is out side the scheme of Zonal classification. The decrease in employment was marginal in Northern zone (0.8%), North-Eastern Zone (0.3%) and Central Zone (0.1%).

**CHAPTER-V**  
**EMPLOYMENT IN STATES AND UNION TERRITORIES**

- 5.1 Employment in the organised sector in the country is spread over 27 States/Union Territories. Analysis of data with regard to employment in the organised sector by different Zones/Regions has already been made in Chapter IV. Each Zone/Region has a group of contiguous States/Union Territories. The main focus of analysis is on the trends of employment in the organised sector in various States/Union Territories under each Zone/Region. Employment in different States/Union Territories under each of the six Zones is shown in Annexure III.

**NORTHERN ZONE**

**Haryana**

- 5.2 There was no change in employment in both public & private sectors. Employment in the organised sector remained static at 6.67 lakh in the state during the period under review (1996-97). Haryana state had a share of only 2.3% of the total employment as at the end of March 1997.

**Punjab**

- 5.3 Employment had gone down 8.56 lakhs in March, 1996 to 8.36 lakh in March, 1997 showing a decrease of 2.3%. Employment decreased from 6.07 lakh to 5.87 lakh i.e. 3.3% in the Public Sector and remained static in the Private Sector. The share of employment in Punjab was 2.9% of the total employment in the organised sector as at the end of March, 1997.

**Himachal Pradesh**

- 5.4 Total employment in the State had marginally declined from 2.90 lakh in March, 1996 to 2.83 lakh in March, 1997 recording a decrease of 2.4%. Employment had gone down by 2.4% in both Public and Private sector. Himachal Pradesh had a share of 1.0% in all India employment at the end of March 1997.

**Chandigarh**

- 5.5 Employment in the Union Territory had decreased from 0.90 lakh at the end of March, 1996 to 0.81 lakh at the end of March 1997 recording a nominal decrease in both public & private sectors. The Union Territory contributed only 0.3% of the total organised sector employment at the all-India level.



## Delhi

- 5.6 Employment in the Union Territory had declined from 8.51 lakh at the end of March 1996 to 8.42 lakh at the end of March 1997, reflecting a marginal decrease of 1.1% in the organised sector. In the public sector the employment decreased by 1.0% while in the private sector it went down by 1.3%. The Union Territory contributed 3.0% to the total organised sector employment at the all India level.

## Rajasthan

- 5.7 Employment in the State increased from 12.66 lakh in March 1996 to 12.80 lakh in March 1997 showing an increase of 1.1%. In public sector, employment increased by 0.5% whereas private sector employment increased by 3.5%. The share of the State in all-India employment was 4.5% as at the end of March, 1997.

## Jammu & Kashmir

- 5.8 Total Employment as well as employment in Public & Private sectors remained static at 2.09, 1.99 and 0.10 lakh respectively in the State both at the end of March 1996 and at the end of March 1997. The state had a share of 0.7% of all-India employment at the end of March 1997.

## CENTRAL ZONE

### Madhya Pradesh

- 5.9 Total employment in Madhya Pradesh decreased from 16.77 lakh in March 1996 to 16.74 lakh in March 1997 recording a decrease of 0.2%. Public Sector employment had gone down from 14.23 lakh to 14.20 lakh registering a fall of 0.2% whereas Private Sector recorded no change in Employment. The State had a share of 5.9% of all-India employment in March 1997.

### Uttar Pradesh

- 5.10 Organised Sector Employment in the State had decreased from 26.20 lakhs in March 1996 to 26.18 lakhs in March 1997 recording a marginal fall in employment of 0.1%. Employment in the Public Sector went down by 0.1% while in Private Sector employment remained static. The state accounted for a share of 9.2% of all-India employment as at the end of March, 1997.

## NORTH-EASTERN ZONE

### Assam

- 5.11 Organised Sector Employment in the State had decreased from 11.66 lakh in March 1996 to 11.44 lakhs in March 1997, recording a decrease of 1.9%. Employment in the Public Sector increased by 2.7% whereas Private sector employment went down by 5.6%. The state had a share of 4.0% of all-India employment.

### Meghalaya

- 5.12 Employment in the State had gone up marginally from 0.72 lakh in March, 1996 to 0.80 lakh in March 1997 showing an increase of 11.1%. There was significant increase in the level of employment in the Public sector (10.8%) and Private Sector (14.3%) in Meghalaya. The state's share at the end of March, 1997 in all India employment was only 0.3%.

### Manipur

- 5.13 Organised sector employment in the State remained static in 1997 as compared to 1996. There was no change in Public and Private sectors employment during the period under review which was 0.77 lakh in Public and 0.02 lakh in Private sector. Manipur had a meager share of 0.3% in the total organised sector employment in the country.

### Mizoram

- 5.14 Employment in the State had increased from 0.29 lakh in March, 1996 to 0.40 lakh at the end of March, 1997 recording an increase of 37.9%. In the public sector employment had gone up from 0.28 lakh in 1996 to 0.39 lakh in 1997 showing an increase of 39.3%. In the private sector, the employment more or less remained static during the year. The State's share in all India organised sector employment was only 0.1%.

### Nagaland

- 5.15 Total employment in the organised sector reflected no change during the period March 1996 and March 1997. The employment remained more or less static in the Public and Private sector at 0.71 and 0.03 lakhs respectively. Nagaland had a small share of 0.3% in the total organised sector employment in the country.

## Tripura

- 5.16 Organised sector employment in the State remained same at the end of March 1996 and at the end of March 1997. Tripura contributed only 0.4% in the total organised sector employment at all-India level. The public and private sector employment registered no variation in employment.

## EASTERN ZONE

### Bihar

- 5.17 Employment in the organised sector in the State had decreased from 17.02 lakh in March 1996 to 16.31 lakh in March 1997 showing a decrease of 4.2%. There was a decrease of Employment in Public and Private sector to the extent of 3.9% and 5.6% respectively. The organised sector employment in the State as a whole formed 5.7% of the total employment in the organised sector at the all-India level.

### Orissa

- 5.18 Total employment in the organised sector in the State decreased from 8.17 lakh in March 1996 to 8.12 lakh in March 1997, recording a decrease of 0.6%. Employment in the public sector decreased by 0.8% but increased in the private sector by 1.1%. Their respective contribution was 3.7% and 1.0% to the total employment at the all-India level. The share of the State was 2.9% in the total organised sector employment in the country.

### West Bengal

- 5.19 The organised sector employment in the State recorded an increase from 21.50 lakh in March 1996 to 25.74 lakh in March 1997, recording an increase of 19.7%. Employment in Public sector picked up by 35.5% but decreased in the Private sector by 5.8%. Public & Private sector employment constituted 9.1% and 8.9% respectively of the all-India employment in these sectors. The overall employment in the State accounted for 9.0% of the total organised sector employment at the all-India level.

## WESTERN ZONE

### Gujarat

- 5.20 Employment in the organised sector in the State was 17.71 lakh in March, 1997 as compared to 17.14 lakh in March 1996. The increase in the organised sector employment was 3.3% during the year under review. In public sector the decrease in employment was of the order of 0.5% whereas in Private Sector, Employment registered an increase of 8.2%. The total organised sector employment in the State accounted for 6.2% of the total employment in the organised sector at the all-India level.

## Maharashtra

- 5.21 Employment in the organised sector in the State increased from 38.42 lakh in March 1996 to 38.93 lakh in March, 1997 showing an increase of 1.3%. In the public and private sectors the increase in Employment was of the order of 2.1% and 0.1% respectively during the year under review. Public and private sector had a share of 12.1% and 17.3% respectively of total employment in the respective sectors, whereas total organised sector employment in the State constituted 13.7% of the total organised sector employment at the all-India level during the year under review.

## Goa

- 5.22 The total organised sector employment maintained a status quo at 1.07 lakh in March, 1997. No change in employment was observed in public and private sectors. The State accounted for only 0.4% of the total organised sector employment at the all-India level

## Daman

- 5.23 The total organised sector employment in the Union Territory of Daman had gone up from 5 thousand in March, 1996 to 10 thousand in March 1997 showing an increase of 100%. The increase in employment in the public and private sectors was 100% in each.

## SOUTHERN ZONE

### Andhra Pradesh

- 5.24 Employment in the organised sector in the State had gone up from 18.46 lakh in March 1996 to 20.41 lakh in March, 1997 recording an increase of 10.6%. The employment growth was 9.8% and 12.6% in the public & private sectors respectively. In the all India Employment figures, the State accounted for 7.6% and 6.1% in the public and private sector respectively and 7.2% in the total organised sector employment in the country.

### Karnataka

- 5.25 Organised sector employment in the State went up from 17.70 lakh in March 1996 to 18.23 lakh in March 1997 showing a rise of 3.0%. Employment had increased in the public sector by 2.3% and by 4.1% in the private sector. The share of Karnataka was 5.5% and 8.4% in all-India public and private sector employment respectively and 6.4% in the total organised sector employment at the all-India level.

## **Kerala**

5.26 The total organised sector employment in the state went up from 11.76 lakh in March, 1996 to 11.79 lakh in March 1997 showing a rise of 0.3%. Employment in the public sector & private sector, however, had gone up by 0.2% and 0.4% respectively. Kerala contributed 3.2% and 6.4% in public and private sector respectively and 4.1% in the total organised sector employment at the all India level.

## **Pondicherry**

5.27 The total employment in the organised sector decreased from 55 thousand to 51 thousand in the Union Territory during the period under review. No change in private sector employment was recorded. Where as in public sector employment recorded a decrease of 9.1%. The overall employment in the Union Territory was 0.2% of the all-India employment in the organised sector.

## **Tamil Nadu**

5.28 Among the Southern states, Employment in Tamil Nadu was the highest. In this state, organised sector employment went up from 25.01 lakh in March, 1996 to 25.70 lakh in March 1997 indicating a growth of 2.8%. The employment decreased by 0.4% in public sector whereas it increased in the private sector by 8.8%. The proportion of organised sector employment as a whole to all-India employment was 9.0% during the year under review.

## **Andaman & Nicobar Islands**

5.29 The Union Territory is outside the Zonal classification as per the States Reorganisation Act. There was no significant change in employment in the organised sector at the end of March, 1997 as compared with that of March, 1996. The employment during the period under review decreased marginally from 36 thousand to 35 thousand. There was no appreciable change in employment either in the Public Sector or Private Sector.

**CHAPTER-VI**  
**EMPLOYMENT IN INDUSTRIES/SERVICES**

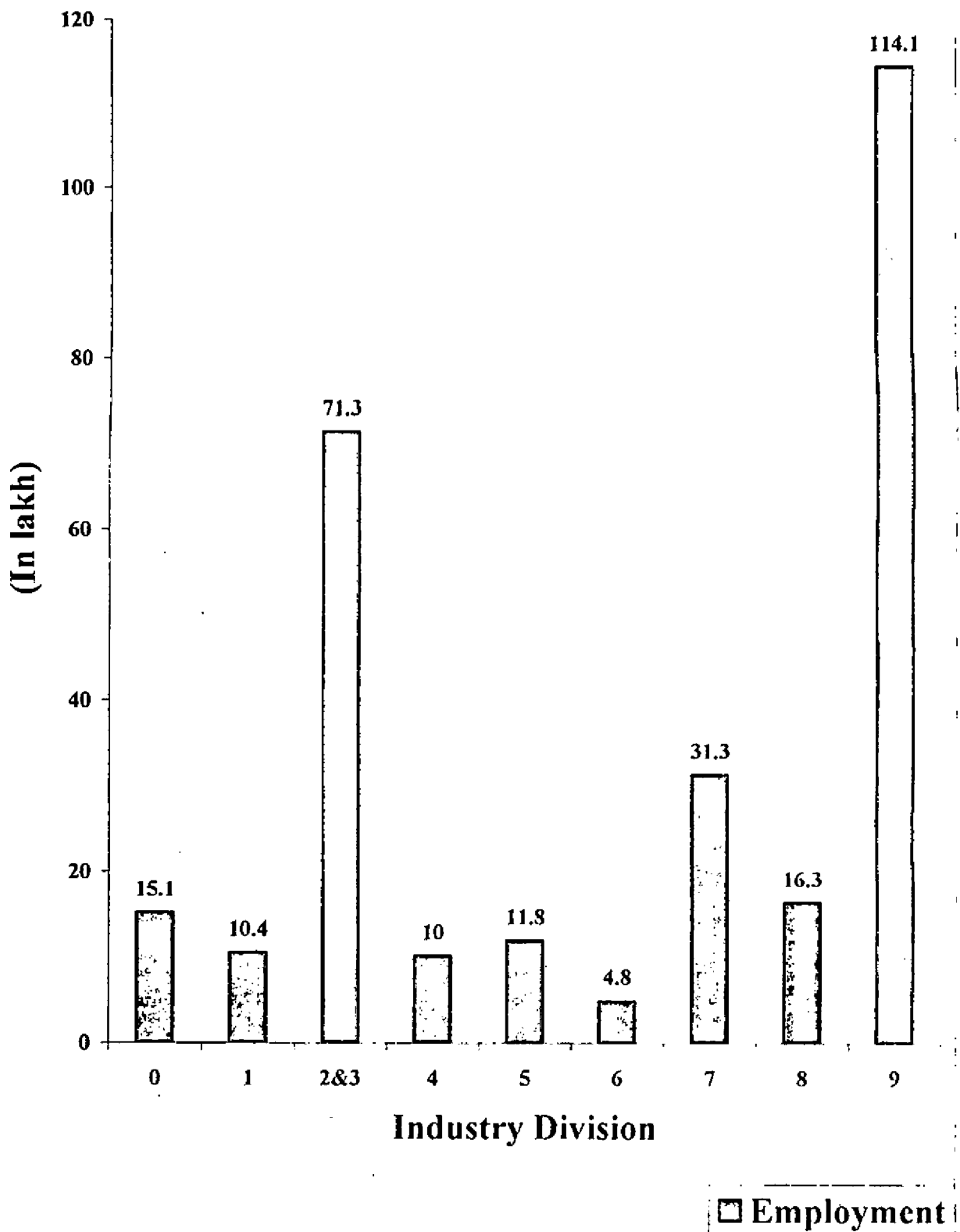
6.1 A broad picture about the structure of employment in the organised sector, in different Industries/Services grouped under Primary, Secondary and Tertiary Sectors as on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 1996 and 1997 is presented in the following Table:-

It will be observed from the above Table-11 that Primary Sector comprising Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry & Fishing and Mining & Quarrying Industry Division showed an over-all decrease of 3.5% in employment. Under this sector, Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry and Fishing recorded a decrease of 3.1%, whereas the Mining & Quarrying Division recorded a decrease of 4.1%.

### Employment in the organised sector by major industries as on 31.3.97



- 6.2 An over-all growth in employment in Secondary sector was 6.4%. Under this sector, employment in Manufacturing Division showed an increase of 7.1% while employment in Electricity, Gas and Water Division showed an increase of 1.6% and construction industry showed a decline of 2.0%.
- 6.3 There was an overall increase in employment in the Tertiary sector of 2.3%. The growth in employment in this sector was recorded in all the divisions. The highest growth in employment was registered in Transport, Storage & Communication (4.5%), followed by community, social and personal services (1.9%) Financing, Insurance, Real Estates & Business services and wholesale and Retail Trade & Restaurants & Hotels showed growth of 1.2% and 0.2% respectively. Employment in the organised sector by Industry Divisions under public and private sectors as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 1996 and 1997 is shown in Annexure-VI. A graphical representation on 31.3.97 is given on previous page.

**EMPLOYMENT IN PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SECTORS BY MAJOR INDUSTRY DIVISION AND BRANCH/SIZE OF ESTABLISHMENTS.**

- 6.4 The data on employment classified by Industry Division and branches of Public Sector and Act and Non-Act establishments in the Private Sector as on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 1996 and 1997 are contained in Annexure V. Branch-Wise distribution of employment in Public Sector shows that under Central Govt. some Industry Divisions like Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry & Fishing, Electricity, Gas & Water, Transport storage and communication recorded increase in employment. The maximum increase in employment was recorded in Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry & Fishing (22.7%) followed by Transport, Storage & Communication (9.4%) and Electricity, Gas & Water (3.6%), while other industry divisions showed decrease in employment.
- 6.5 Under the State Govt., the maximum increase in employment was recorded in Industry Division Wholesale & Retail Trade & Restaurants & Hotels (5.7%) followed by Electricity, Gas & Water (1.7%) Financing, Insurance, Real Estate & Business Services (1.5%) and Community, Social & Personal services (1.5%). However, Transport, storage and communication (51.1%), Manufacturing (2.7%), Construction (2.0%), Mining & Quarrying (1.8%) and Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry & Fishing (0.3%) registered decline in employment.
- 6.6 In the Central Govt. (Quasi), employment growth was recorded in Manufacturing (31.7%), Electricity, Gas & Water (6.1%), Community, Social and Personal Services (3.5%) and Wholesale and Retail Trade & Restaurant & Hotels (1.3%). The Industry division under Central Govt. (Quasi) which registered decline in employment were Construction (18.3%), Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry & Fishing (8.8%), Mining & Quarrying (3.7%), and Transport storage and communication (2.6%). There was an overall increase of 6.9% in the Central Govt. (Quasi) during the period under review.



- 6.7 In the State Govt. (Quasi) Employment growth was recorded in the Industry, Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry & Fishing (28.8%) followed by Construction (3.3%), Financing, Insurance, Real Estate & Business Services (2.7%), Community, Social and Personal Services (2.6%) and marginal increase in Electricity Gas & Water , Transport Storage & Communication (1.0%) and (0.5%) respectively. There was a decline in employment in Manufacturing (3.1%), Mining & Quarrying (1.5%) and Wholesale and Retail Trade & Restaurant, Hotels (1.5%). There was an overall increase of (1.1%) in employment in this branch of Public Sector.
- 6.8 Under Local Bodies the maximum increase in employment was registered in Financing, Insurance, Real Estate & Business services (31.4%) Community, Social & Personal Services (5.7%) and Wholesale & Retail Trade & Restaurants & Hotels (4.2%), Electricity, Gas & Water (2.5%), Construction (1.5%) and marginal increase in Transport, Storage & Communication (0.5%). There was no change in employment in the industrial division Mining & Quarrying. The employment marginally decreased in Industrial divisions Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry and Fishing (0.7%) and Manufacturing (0.1%). There was an overall increase (5.3%) in employment under local Bodies during the period under Review.
- 6.9 The distribution of employment in the Private Sector, classified by Act and Non-Act Establishments, by Industries/Services Division shows that under Act Establishments, the highest increase in employment was recorded in Transport, Storage and Communication (12.3%), followed by Financing, Insurance, Real Estate, Business Services (4.5%), Manufacturing (4.2%), Electricity, Gas & Water (3.4%), Construction (3.2%) and Wholesale and Retail Trade & Restaurants & Hotels (2.5%). The remaining three Industry Divisions, namely, Mining & Quarrying, Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry & Fishing and Community Social & Personal Services showed decline of (10.4%), (6.5%) and (0.3%) respectively. So far as Industry-wise composition of employment under Non-Act Establishments in the Private Sector is concerned, the Industry division Electricity, Gas and Water,, Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry & Fishing, Manufacturing and Financing, Insurance, Real Estate, Business Services registered gains of 24.8%, 4.7%, 2.2% and 1.5% respectively. On the other hand, the remaining five Industry Divisions under Non-Act Private Sector indicated decline in employment, the maximum being in Construction (8.7%) followed by Transport, Storage and Communication (7.5%), Mining & Quarrying(6.6%), Wholesale and Retail Trade & Restaurants & Hotels (4.2%) and Community, Social & Personal Services (1.4%).

## EMPLOYMENT IN KEY INDUSTRIES

6.10 The organised sector employment in four key industries comprising Coal, Cement, Iron & Steel and Generation and Transmission of Electric Energy is analysed, on the basis of the data contained in the following Table :

The analysis of above data reveals that employment in manufacture of Iron & Steel in Primary/Semifinished forms had tremendously increased by 78.4% while in other three key industries there was a decrease in employment. The maximum decrease in employment was recorded in Mining & agglomeration of coal (4.4%), followed by Manufacture of Cement, Lime & Plaster (3.8%). There was marginal decrease in Generation and Transmission of Electric Energy (0.4%).

## EMPLOYMENT IN TRANSPORT SECTOR

6.11 Transport industry is an important constituent of employment in the organised sector. The following Table-13 gives the distribution of employment in Transport Sector.

As may be observed from the data contained in the above Table-13, employment in Inland Water Transport showed an increase of 16.0% followed by Railway Transport (15.2%) and Air Transport carriers (of passengers & freight) (4.1%). However, employment in the Ocean and Coastal Water Transport decreased by 1.9% followed by Passenger Transport by Bus (including Tramways) by 0.7%.

## EMPLOYMENT IN BANKING AND FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS

6.12 The employment trends in Banking and Financial Institutions are indicated in Table-14 below:

An analysis of the above data shows that Insurance carriers other than life Industry registered a tremendous growth of (12.3%) followed by other credit activities (1.9%) and insurance carriers, life (0.1%). However the employment in the Deposit Activities (Banking) decreased by (0.2%).

## EMPLOYMENT IN SERVICES SECTOR

6.13 Educational services, Research & Scientific Services and Health & Medical Services mainly comprise the services sector. Table 15 below provides Employment data for these services.

Column 5 of the above Table-15 shows that except Research and Scientific Services which registered decrease in employment (8.0%), all the remaining services sectors recorded increase in employment. The highest increase was recorded in Educational Services rendered by Technical or Vocational colleges and other institutions (3.3%). Followed by Health and Medical services (2.2%) and Educational Services rendered by non-technical colleges, schools etc.(1.8%).

**CHAPTER-VII**  
**WOMEN'S EMPLOYMENT IN THE ORGANISED SECTOR**

7.1 . Employment of women constitutes an important component of the organised sector employment in the country. The employment of women in the organised sector has gone up steadily over the last ten years. It comprise 16.5% of the total employment in the organised sector in the country. An overview of women's employment is given in the following Table:-

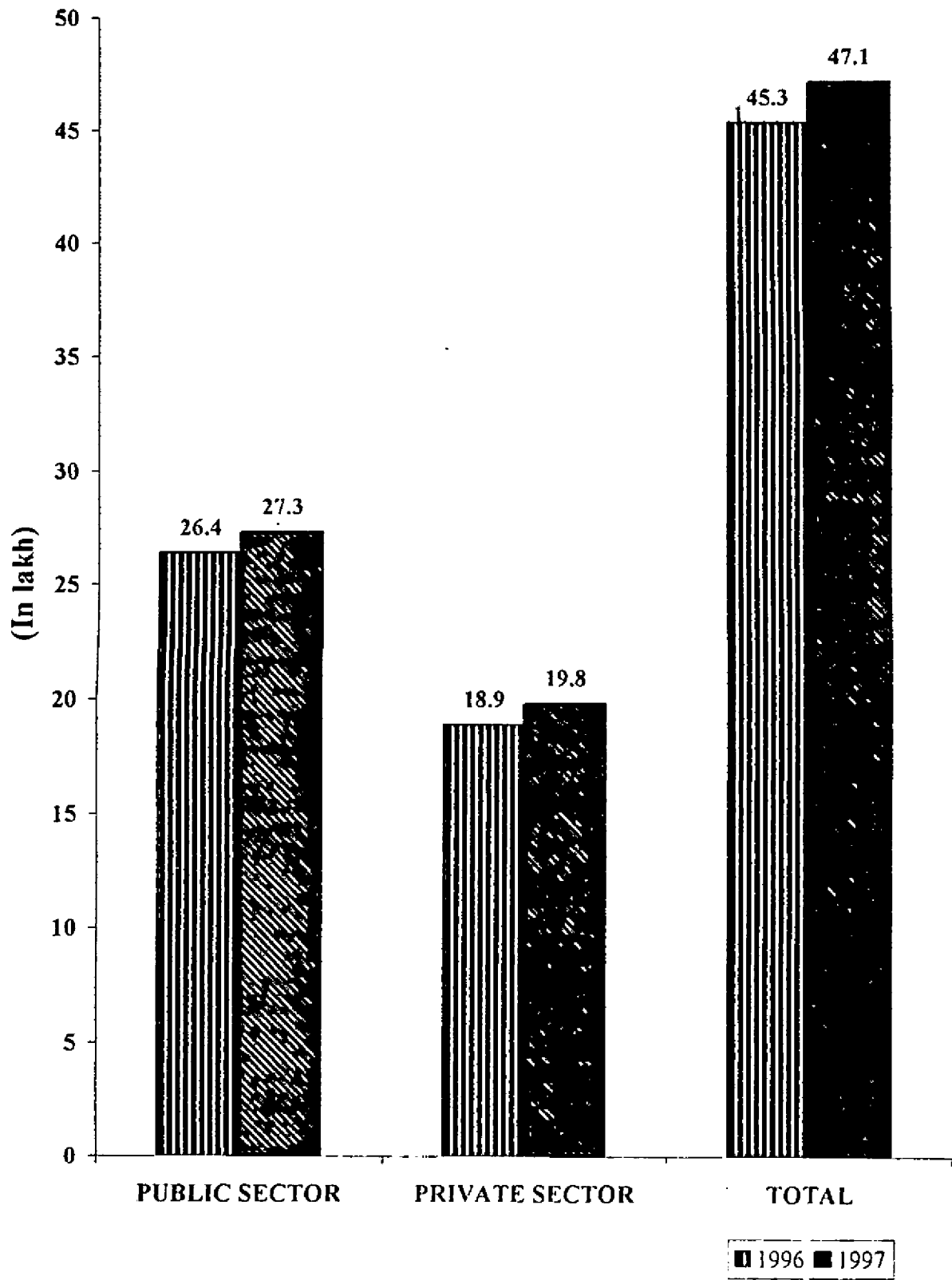

It may be observed from the above Table that women's employment in the organised sector went up from 34.36 lakh in 1987-88 to 47.16 lakh in 1996-97.

7.2 The increase in women employment during the year 1996-97 was of the order of 4.2% as compared to 5.2% during the preceding year, 1995-96. It may be seen from the Table -16 that the share of women's employment to total employment in the organised sector has risen steadily from 13.4% in 1987-88 to 16.5% in 1996-97.

It may be observed from the above Table that out of the total 47.16 lakh women employees in the organised sector at the end of March 1997, 27.34 lakh were in the Public Sector and the remaining 19.82 lakh in the Private Sector. Women's employment in both public and private sectors registered a growth of 3.5% and 5.1% respectively during the year 1996-97. The branch-wise distribution of women's employment shows an increase in employment in all branches of Public Sector and Private Sector. The maximum increase in employment was recorded in State Govt.(quasi) (10.0%) followed by Central Govt. (7.1%), State Govt.(3.0%), local bodies (2.3%) and Central Govt.(Quasi)(0.8%) in Public Sector. There was an overall increase of women's employment in the Public Sector (3.5%) during the period under review. In the Private sector, women's employment registered an appreciable & substantial growth of (5.8%) in "Larger establishments" There was a marginal growth (0.6%) in "Smaller establishments". The overall growth in women employment in Private Sector was 5.2% during the period under review.

It may be observed from the above table that women's employment had increased in all Zones of the country except Eastern and North-Eastern Zone. The highest increase was recorded in Southern Zone (11.0%), followed by Central Zone (2.4%). While there is no change in women employment in Northern Zone and Andaman & Nicobar Island, (which is out side the scheme of zonal classification). The Women employment in Eastern Zone decreased by (3.8%) followed by North-Eastern Zone (3.0%).

### **WOMEN'S EMPLOYMENT IN STATES/UNION TERRITORIES**

7.6 The distribution of women employees by States/U.Ts. Cross-classified by public and private sectors as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 1996 and 1997 is contained in Annexure IX. It may be observed that in the States/U.Ts. of Punjab (5.3%), Delhi (0.7%), Assam (4.9%), Bihar (6.4%), West Bengal (4.6%), Pondicherry (15.2%) and Kerala (2.0%), women employment had gone down. In all other States/U.Ts. the employment of women showed an upward trend. There was a significant and substantial growth of women employment noticed in Daman (127.9%), Andhra Pradesh (34.0%) and Mizoram (31.6%), while women's employment had no change in Jammu & Kashmir, Tripura, Goa and Andaman & Nicobar during the period under review (1996-97).

## WOMEN'S EMPLOYMENT IN INDUSTRIES/SERVICES

7.7 The distribution of women's employment by major industries as on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 1996 and 1997 is given below:

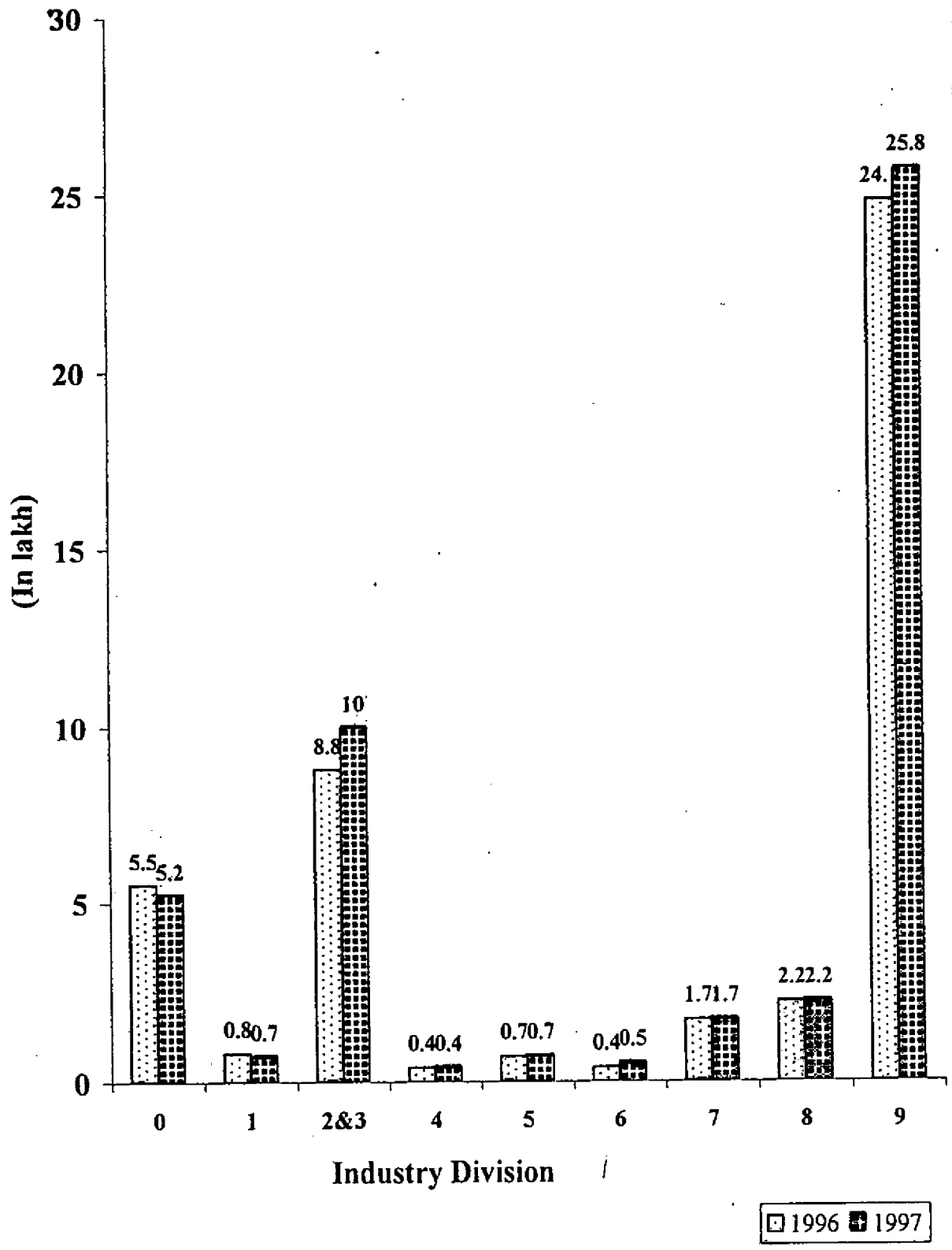

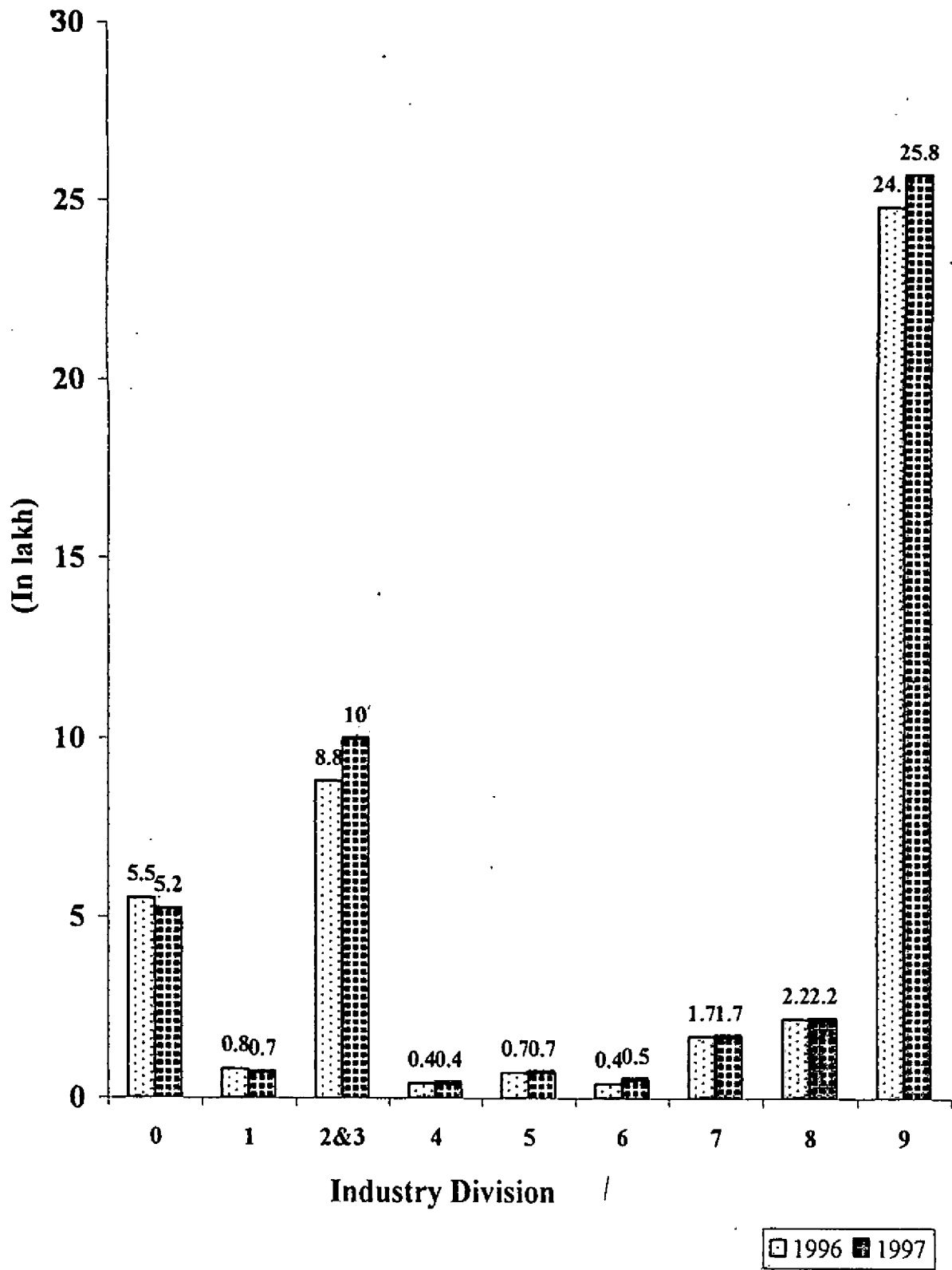
An analysis of data on women's employment contained in Table-20 reveals that there was increase in women's employment in Manufacturing (13.7%) followed by wholesale and Retail Trade & Restaurants & Hotel (13.4%), Electricity, Gas & Water (5.5%), Financial, Insurance, Real Estate & Business Services and the Industry Division Community & Social & Personal Services (3.4%) each. While there is a decrease in other Industry Divisions, which were Mining & Quarrying (6.6%) followed by Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry & Fishing (4.1%), Construction (2.4%) and there was marginal decrease in Transport, Storage & Communication Services (0.8%). Sector-wise & Industry-wise women employment is presented in Annexure-X. A graphical representation of women employment in the organised sector by major industries as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 1996 & 1997 is given on the next page.

- 8.5 The absolute magnitude of unemployment has of course, been increasing over the years; but open unemployment rates have also been rising in recent years. Unemployment rates according to UPS criterion decreased from 3.77 percent in 1987-88 to 2.56 percent in 1993-94 and according to WS from 4.80 percent to 4.28 percent. Unemployment rate by daily status criterion has also shown a decline from 6.09 percent to 6.03 percent over this period. These trends suggest that while the total unemployed labour (in person days as measured by daily status concept) has shown a decline as a percentage of the Labour Force, the percentage of unemployed has increased. In other words, the structure of unemployment seems to be shifting from the predominance of underemployment towards rise in open unemployment.
- 8.6 Within the broad trends towards an increasingly open and chronic character of unemployment the following features may be considered of special significance. For one, this trend is seen to be particularly strong in the case of rural areas, where Usual Status unemployment has decreased from 3.07 percent of Labour Force in 1987-88 to 1.79 percent in 1993-94 and Daily Status unemployment has increased from 5.25 percent to 5.61 percent. In urban areas, only a small change in the open (usual status) unemployment rate was observed from 6.56 to 5.21, so also in the Daily Status unemployment rate from 9.26 to 7.43 percent. Secondly, the trend in the increased incidence of open unemployment was stronger in the case of women than men. The usual status rate of unemployment decreased from 3.52 in 1987-88 to 1.40 percent in 1993-94 among rural women workers but the decrease in the case of rural male workers was from 2.87 to 1.96 percent. In the urban areas also, the open unemployment rate decreased in the case of women and men. Thirdly, the differences between the usual status and daily status unemployment rates were almost same in the case of women and in the case of men, which implies that underemployment is in same proportion of overall unemployment in the case of women as in case of men.
- 8.7 The most comprehensive measure of incidence of the unemployment is the one based on the daily status concept, as it includes all the person days of unemployment of those openly unemployed as well as of the underemployed. According to this measure, the unemployment rate in the country during 1993-94 was 6.03% of the labour force as against 6.09% in 1987-88. The unemployment rates (DS), among the major states, was highest in Kerala during 1993-94; the rates were 14.7% and 17.7% in its Rural and Urban areas respectively, the corresponding all India rates being 5.6% and 7.4% in Rural and Urban areas respectively. In this state the rates among males and females were 13.1% and 19.0% in rural and 14.1% and 27.8% respectively, in urban areas. The states followed by Kerala were Tamil Nadu, West Bengal, Orissa and Andhra Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh has the lowest unemployment rate (3.1% and 4.8%) in rural and urban areas respectively. Next lowest was in Madhya Pradesh, 2.6% and 6.8% in rural and urban areas respectively.

## CHAPTER – VIII

### LABOUR MARKET

- 8.1 Generally, Labour Market is termed as an area where workers in search of employment and employers in need of workers come in contact with each other or meet. This may be local, regional, provincial, national or even inter-national. The proper appraisal of the Labour Market envisages a regular study of the various economic, social, institutional and cultural factors such as quantum and composition of the labour force, level of education, training and skills, behavioural aspects of job-seekers and employers, mobility, recruitment practices, prevailing wage levels, traditions and institutional barriers, etc.
- 8.2 In this Chapter, an attempt has been made to bring together data flowing from day-to-day operations of the National Employment Service relating to work-seekers, vacancies notified, etc. and the Employment Market Information (EMI) Programme of the D.G.E.&T., Ministry of Labour, Government of India regarding the number of persons employed, as both these sets of data taken together have a close bearing on the labour market situation prevailing in our country.
- 8.3 The Employment Exchange statistics provide only a broad indication of the unemployment situation in the organised labour market. Before drawing any conclusions the following limitations of the Employment Exchange statistics as indicators of unemployment in the country must be kept in mind:-
- (i) All persons registered with the Employment Exchanges are not necessarily unemployed. Quite a number of them are already in employment and have registered their names for better and more suitable jobs.
  - (ii) Registration being voluntary, all unemployed persons do not register themselves with the Employment Exchanges.
  - (iii) Some work-seekers registered at the Employment Exchanges who secure employment subsequently through sources other than the Exchanges do not get their names deregistered.
  - (iv) Many persons residing in rural areas also register themselves with Employment Exchanges but as the Employment Exchanges are located in urban areas the rural registrants are not likely to get properly represented in the Live Register.
  - (v) Many students, who normally are not considered a part of the labour force, also register themselves for employment assistance primarily with a view to gaining seniority in registration.

### LEVEL OF UNEMPLOYMENT

On the basis of the data available from the 50<sup>th</sup> Round of the NSS (1993-94), unemployment was estimated to be 11.53 million according to Usual Principal Status (UPS), 6508 million according to Weekly Status (WS) and 6508 million person days according to Daily Status (DS). As a percentage of the Labour Force, unemployment according to the three concepts works out to 2.56, 4.28 and 6.03 respectively (Table 21). Unemployment rates are much higher for the urban than for the rural areas and for men than for women. For example, unemployment rate according to UPS was 5.21 percent for the urban and 1.79 percent for the rural areas and 8.21% for females and 4.54% for males in the urban. The unemployment rate in the rural area according to UPS was 1.96 percent for males and 1.40 percent for females.

**UPS-Usual Principal Status:** A person is considered unemployed according to this concept if he/she was available for work but without work for a major part of the year.

**WS-Weekly Status:** A person is considered unemployed according to this concept if he/she though being available for work did not have work even for one hour during the reference week.

**DS-Daily Status:** It is a measure of unemployment in terms of person days of unemployment of all the persons in the Labour force during the reference week.

8.8 The number of work-seekers on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges in the country has gone up from 368.25 lakh at the end of March, 1996 to 376.3, lakh at the end of March, 1997. The number of men and women on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges and the percentage changes over the years are presented in the following Table:-

It may be observed from the Table-22 that there has been an increase in the number of job seekers registered with the Employment Exchanges over the years from 1988 to 1997. The number of work-seekers registered with the Employment Exchanges has gone up from 368.25 lakh at the end of March, 1996 to 376.31 lakh at the end of March, 1997 recording an increase of 2.2%. In the case of male registrants there was an increase of 1.2%, whereas female registrants increased by 5.8% during the period 1996-1997. The number of work seekers at the end of March, 1996 and 1997 by States/UTs is contained in Annexure-XI.

## DISTRIBUTION OF EDUCATED JOB-SEEKERS

8.9 All types of persons approaching Employment Exchanges for seeking employment assistance are registered by the Employment Exchanges in accordance with their educational qualification and skills. Educated job-seekers i.e. those who are matriculates and above form a significant segment on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges. Providing employment to educated job seekers poses relatively more intricate problem than to those in the uneducated category, as most of the educated people are generally desirous of seeking white-collar jobs. The following Table-23 presents the number of educated job-seekers classified by sex and educational qualifications:

It may be seen from above data that out of total 4557.3 thousand graduate and post-graduate job seekers, 4021.5 thousand were graduates and 535.7 thousand post-graduates at the end of June 1997. As regards women work seekers, out of 1423.5 thousand graduates and post-graduates, 1217.4 thousand were graduates and the remaining 206.1 thousand were post-graduates. Faculty wise analysis of graduate job-seekers reveals that 1630.9 thousand were degree holders in Arts, followed by 718.1 thousand in Science, 657.5 thousand in Commerce and 623.7 thousand in Education. The number of registrants holding degree in Engineering, Agriculture, Medicine and other faculties was much less as compared to registrants holding degree in Arts, Science, Commerce and Education. Faculty-wise composition of women job-seekers reveals that the number of women job-seekers holding degrees in almost all the disciplines except Engineering, Medicine and Agriculture had gone up considerably during 1997. Out of 535.7 thousand post-graduate registrants, 267.1 thousand were post-graduate in Arts, 104.0 thousand in Science, 67.1 thousand in Commerce and 57.3 thousand in Education. The number of post-graduate job-seekers in the remaining faculties was less as compared to above faculties. Faculty-wise distribution of women post-graduate job-seekers reveals that there was an increase in favour of all the disciplines except Engineering and Agriculture.

#### **DISTRIBUTION OF JOB-SEEKERS BY ZONES**

- 8.11 There were approximately 376 lakh work-seekers on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges as on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 1997. The total number of educated job seekers as on 30<sup>th</sup> June 1997 was around 258.8 lakh.
- 8.12 The Zonal distribution of total work-seekers as also educated work-seekers borne on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges is shown in the following Table

Note- Figures may not tally due to rounding off.

It may be seen from the above classification of work-seekers that 71.5% of the job-seekers belonged to the fresher categories and therefore these workers are not classified by specific occupations. Of the total job-seekers, 9.1% were Professional and Technical workers, 7.6% were Clerical and related workers, 7.0% were Production and Related Workers, Transport Equipment Operators and Labourers; 2.1% Service workers, 1.8% Farmers, Fisherman, Hunters, Loggers and Related workers and 0.9% Administrative and Related workers.

## **LABOUR MARKET SITUATION**

8.14 The registration of job-seekers, vacancies notified and placements effected as per Live Register of Employment Exchanges give an idea about the labour market situation in the country. The following Table contains data on registration of job-seekers, vacancies notified and persons placed in suitable employment through the Employment Exchanges:

Data in the Table-27 shows that about 63.2 lakh work-seekers got themselves registered with the Employment Exchanges in the year 1997. A continuing fall in the number of vacancies notified to the Employment Exchanges by various employers over the last ten years from 1988 to 1997 is observed. The number of registrants placed in suitable employment has also shown a declining trend.

### VACANCIES NOTIFIED AND CANCELLED BY BROAD OCCUPATIONS

8.15 The following Table indicates data about the number of vacancies notified and cancelled for lack of suitable applicants by the Employment Exchanges during the calendar year 1997.

It will be seen from the above data that out of 393 thousand vacancies notified to the Employment Exchanges, 137.1 thousand (34.9%) were meant for Professional & Technical workers, 96.9 thousand (24.7%) for Production and Related Workers and Transport Equipment Operators, 68.1 thousand (17.3%) to Clerical and Sales Workers (excluding Typists), 37.8 thousand (9.6%) for Service workers. Around (13.1%) 51.6 thousand vacancies belonged to other occupational categories.

It may be observed from the data contained in the Table-29 that the proportion of vacancies open to freshers increased from 52.8% during 1995 to 56.4% during 1997. Among the Faculties, the proportion of vacancies open to freshers to the total vacancies notified was the highest in Agriculture (58.0%) followed by Engineering (57.2%), Social Science (52.5%), Medicine (35.0%), Natural Science (30.5%) and Technology (23.7%).

## JOB SEEKERS OF SPECIAL CATEGORIES

8.18 A large number of women, scheduled castes, scheduled tribes and physically handicapped persons are on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges, as may be seen from Table -30.

Data in the Table above shows that the number of Physically handicapped job seekers in 1997 had gone up by 9.3% followed by Scheduled Tribes (8.1%), Scheduled Castes (8.0%). The number of women job seekers has also shown an increase of 7.8% in 1997 over the year 1996.

### SCHEDULED CASTE / SCHEDULED TRIBE JOB-SEEKERS

8.19 Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe job-seekers form an important constituent of the Live Register of Employment Exchanges. The number of these job-seekers, classified by their educational levels is shown in the following Table.

It may be noticed from data in the Table above that at the end of June 1997 there were 52.5 lakh Scheduled Caste job-seekers and 15.0 lakh Scheduled Tribe job-seekers on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges. The number of S.C. job-seekers recorded an increase of 2.7% and the number of S.T. job-seekers increased by 5.0% in 1997 over 1996. The large chunk of such work-seekers were below matriculates (including illiterates), followed by matriculates. The number of vacancies filled by Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes recorded a declining Trend of 6.6% & 17.4% respectively during 1996-97.

### WOMEN WORK-SEEKERS

8.20 The information about registration and placement effected by the Employment Exchanges in respect of women work-seekers during the year 1988-1997 is given in the following Table:

It would be seen from above data that the percentage placement of women to the total female registrants during 1988-1997 was in the range of 3.8% to 5.1%. In fact the data in the above table indicates almost a declining tendency in the number of women placements between 1988 and 1997. It has declined from 55.0 thousand in 1988 to 50.1 thousand in 1996. However placement of women has recorded an increase in 1997 at 61.5 thousand.

An analysis of above data reveals an overall increase of 11.2% in the registration of educated women candidates in 1997 over 1996. The registration of women graduates has increased by 23.1% Percentages of placement of women Graduates & Post-graduates and under-graduate job-seekers to their respective registrations were 5.9% and 2.6% respectively during 1997. Whereas the percentage of placement to registration in respect of un-educated (below matriculation) was 5.2.

1.1 वर्तमान रोजगार समीक्षा, रोजगार एवं प्रशिक्षण महानिदेशालय [डीजीईटी] श्रम मंत्रालय, भारत सरकार द्वारा प्रकाशित की जा रही वार्षिक रोजगार समीक्षा की श्रृंखला में 28वीं समीक्षा है तथा यह 31 मार्च, 1997 को समाप्त वर्ष से संबंधित है। यह समीक्षा रोजगार एवं प्रशिक्षण महानिदेशालय के रोजगार बाजार सूचना [ई एम आई] कार्यक्रम जिसे 37 वर्ष से भी पूर्व आरम्भ किया गया था, के तहत देश में रोजगार कार्यालयों के नेटवर्क के माध्यम से एकत्र की गई सूचना पर आधारित है।

### रोजगार बाजार सूचना कार्यक्रम का विस्तार

1.2 रोजगार बाजार सूचना कार्यक्रम हमारी अर्थव्यवस्था के संगठित क्षेत्र से संबंधित है। इस संगठित क्षेत्र में सार्वजनिक क्षेत्र के विभिन्न आकार वाले समस्त प्रतिष्ठान<sup>तथा</sup> 10 या अधिक व्यक्तियों को नियोजित करने वाले निजी गैर-कृषीय प्रतिष्ठान शामिल हैं। तदनुसार, समस्त सार्वजनिक क्षेत्र के प्रतिष्ठानों तथा निजी क्षेत्र के 25 या अधिक व्यक्तियों को नियोजित करने वाले गैर-कृषीय प्रतिष्ठानों के संबंध में सूचना रोजगार कार्यालयों [व्यक्तियों की अनिवार्य अधिसूचना] अधिनियम, 1959 के उपबंधों के तहत संविधानिक रूप से तथा निजी क्षेत्र के 10-24 व्यक्तियों को नियोजित करने वाले लघु गैर-कृषी प्रतिष्ठानों के संबंध में ऐच्छिक रूप से एकत्र की गई है।

### संगठित क्षेत्र में प्रतिष्ठान

1.3 रोजगार कार्यालयों के रोजगार रजिस्टर में मार्च, 1997 के अंत में 2.78 लाख प्रतिष्ठान थे इनमें से 1.65 लाख प्रतिष्ठान सार्वजनिक क्षेत्र में तथा शेष 1.13 लाख प्रतिष्ठान निजी क्षेत्र में थे। सार्वजनिक एवं निजी क्षेत्र दोनों में पिछले वर्ष की तुलना में प्रतिष्ठानों की संख्या में मामूली वृद्धि दर्ज की गई। यह वृद्धि पिछले वर्ष की तुलना में 1.4% रही। सार्वजनिक क्षेत्र के प्रतिष्ठानों की संख्या जोकि मार्च, 1996 से 1.62 लाख थे; मार्च, 1997 के अंत में बढ़कर 1.65 लाख हो गई, जिसमें 2.1% की वृद्धि रिकार्ड की गई। सार्वजनिक क्षेत्र की सभी शाखाओं में प्रतिष्ठानों की संख्या में वृद्धि रिकार्ड की गई। यह वृद्धि केन्द्रीय सरकार में 6.7% दर्ज की गई निजी क्षेत्र के प्रतिष्ठानों में 0.4% की वृद्धि हुई। बड़े प्रतिष्ठानों में 1.6 % की वृद्धि रिकार्ड की गई। लघु प्रतिष्ठानों के संबंध में 0.7% की कमी रिकार्ड की गई।
