- 2. This Review focuses on the employment situation that prevailed in the organised sector during the years 1990-95 and is likely to be of utility in the areas of vocational guidance, educational planning, craftsmen and technical training, manpower planning and monitoring of employment generation.
- 3. I am thankful to all employers for their cooperation in furnishing the requisite information through the employment returns prescribed under the Employment Exchanges (Compulsory Notification of Vacancies) Act & Rules framed thereunder. I am also grateful to the Directorates of Employment of various States and Union Territories and their officers and staff, as also to the EMI Units of the Employment Exchanges for their active participation and whole hearted devotion & cooperation in the course of field enquiries.

A register of establishments maintained at the Employment Exchanges-primary frame for collection of E.M.I. data.

Live Register

A register of persons currently seeking employment assistance through the Employment Exchanges.

Percentages

All the percentages given in the Review are based on absolute figure, unless other-wise specified.

Totals

On account of rounding off, the individual figures/sub-totals (in the different Tables & Annexures) may not necessarily add up to the total shown.

Establishment

Any office or any place where any industry, trade business or occupation is carried on.

Establishment in public sector

Any establishment owned, controlled or managed by:

- (i) The Government or a department of the Government.
- (ii) A Government Company as defined in Section 617 of the Companies Act, 1956.
- (iii) A Corporation (including a Co-operative society)
 established by or under a Central, Provincial or
 State Act, which is owned, controlled or managed by the
 Government, and
- (iv) A Local Authority.

Establishment in private sector

An establishment which is not an establishment in public and where ordinarily twenty five or more persons are employed to work for remuneration.

Data under EMI are also being collected on a voluntary basis from non-agricultural private establishments employing 10-24 persons and hence the coverage of the programme is wider than that under the EE (CNV)Act.

Industrial Classification

C HAPTER-I

HIGHLIGHTS

1.1 The present Employment Review is twenty-sixth in the series of Annual Employment Reviews being published by the Directorate General of Employment and Training (D.G.E.& T), Ministry of Labour, Government of India, and pertains to the year ended 31st March, 1995. This Review is based on the information collected by the network of Employment Exchanges in the country under the Employment Market Information (EMI) Programme of the D.G.E.& T., which was initiated more than thirty-five years ago.

COVERAGE OF EMI PROGRAMME

The EMI Programme relates to the "organised sector" of our economy. This organised sector covers all establishments in the public sector, irrespective of their size and non-agricultural establishments in the private sector employing 10 or more persons. Accordingly, information in respect of all the public sector establishments and non-agricultural establishments in the private sector employing 25 or more persons is collected statutorily under the provisions of the Employment Exchanges (Compulsory Notification of Vacancies) Act, 1959 and information from smaller non-agricultural establishments in the private sector employing 10-24 persons is collected on voluntary basis.

ESTABLISHMENTS GROWTH

1.3 There were 2.77 lakh establishments on the Employer's Register of Employment Exchanges at the end of March 1995. Of these, 1.64 lakh were in the public sector and the remaining 1.13 lakh in the private sector. The public sector establishments increased from 1.58 lakh at the end of March, 1994 to 1.64 lakh at the end of March, 1995, recording a growth of 3.6%. All branches of the public sector recorded growth in the number of establishments barring Local Bodies. The growth of establishments in the private sector was of the order of 4.5%. The growth of larger establishments was recorded as 7.5%, which in the case of smaller establishments was 2.0%.

EMPLOYMENT GROWTH IN THE ORGANISED SECTOR

Employment in the organised sector went up from 273.75 lakh in March, 1994 to 279.87 lakh in March, 1995 recording an increase of 2.2%. The growth rate was of the order of 0.7% during the preceding year. Whereas the public sector recorded an increase of 1.3%, the private sector showed a rise of 4.6%. The increase of 1.3% in public sector employment during the period under review (1994-95) was higher as compared to 0.6% recorded in the previous year (1993-94). In the private sector, the growth of employment was 4.6% during the period under report (1994-95) as against 1.0% recorded during the corresponding period of the previous year (1993-94).

SPECIAL EMPLOYMENT PROGRAMMES

- 2.4 Special employment and anti-poverty programmes like Integrated Rural Development Programme(IRDP), Training of Rural Youth for Self Employment (TRYSEM), Jawahar Rozgar Yojana (JRY) and Nehru Rozgar Yojana (NRY) have been a central feature of India's development strategy. In 1993-94, two new programmes namely the Employment Assurance Scheme and the Prime Minister's Rozgar Yojana were introduced. In addition, some State Governments have special employment programmes of their own, such as the Employment Guarantee Scheme (EGS) in Maharashtra and the Self Employment Scheme for Registered Unemployed (SESRU) in West Bengal.
- 2.5 The EAS is implemented in 1778 backward blocks in the country. It aims at providing 100 days of unskilled manual work up to two members of a family in the age group of 18 to 60 years normally residing in villages within the blocks covered under EAS. It is a need-based programme; hence no target of employment generation has been fixed. Since 1993-94, the JRY has been made more target oriented and expanded substantially through increased budgetary allocations. It has been divided into three streams viz. (i) JRY-Ist stream with 75 percent of total allocation; (ii) JRY-2nd stream with 20 percent of total allocation for 120 selected backward districts, and (iii) JRY-3rd stream for innovative projects, aimed at prevention of migration of labourers, enhancing women's employment, special programmes through voluntary organisations and those aimed at drought proofing and watershed development.

- 2.6 For better targeting, cost effectiveness and judicious selection of assets under JRY, the allocations for two sub-schemes of 1st stream of JRY, have been increased for the Indira Awas Yojana (IAY) from 6 percent in 1992-93 to 10 percent in 1993-94 and for the Million Wells Scheme (MWS) from 20 percent to 30 percent during the same period. Along with SC/ST and freed bonded labourers, poor non-SC/ST families have also been included for assistance under IAY and MWS subject to the condition that their share not exceeding 4 and 10 percent of allocation respectively.
- Under IRDP, all families in rural areas below the poverty line are eligible for assistance. There is reservation for SC/ST up to 50 percent of total families assisted. 40 percent is reserved for women and 3 percent for those who are physically handicapped.
- The achievements of the special employment programmes are given in the following table. The Scheme for Self Employment for Educated Unemployed Youth (SEEUY) has been integrated with the PMRY from 1994-95. The target under PMRY for 1994-95 is fixed at 2.2 lakh micro-enterprises to generate about 4.4 lakh employment opportunities. Under JRY, about fifty percent employment generation during 1993-94 came from the SC/ST group. The coverage of SC/ST under IRDP during 1993-94 was over 53 percent of total families assisted as against the target of 50 percent. The coverage of women was 34 percent, as against the target of 40 percent.

CHAPTER-III

EMPLOYMENT MARKET INFORMATION PROGRAMME

OBJECTIVES

- 3.1 The main objectives of the Employment Market Information (EMI) Programme are:-
 - (i) to provide information at short intervals about the structure of employment in the public and private sectors at the area, state and national levels and also to monitor the changes in the level of employment.
 - (ii) to present the occupational composition and educational profile of employees in the public and private sector establishments.
 - (iii) to identify the occupations which are characteristic to a given industry.
 - (iv) to assess the manpower shortages in the organised sector.
 - (v) to make available information required to improve and add to the services offered by the National Employment Service.
 - (vi) to monitor the progress in generating employment during the five years' plans.

COVERAGE

- 3.2 The EMI Programme was initiated in the year 1955 as a pilot project in Delhi which was subsequently extended to selected areas (Districts) in various States during the Second Five Year Plan period. The programme was provided a statutory base with the enactment of the Employment Exchanges (Compulsory Notification of Vacancies) Act, 1959. The data collected under the EMI Programme covers only the organised sector of the economy which, inter alia, covers all establishments in the public sector irrespective of their size and non-agricultural establishments in the private sector employing 10 or more persons. While the information from non-agricultural establishments in the private sector employing 25 or more persons is collected under the provisions of EE(CNV) Act, 1959, data from the establishments employing 10-24 persons is collected on voluntary basis.
- 3.3 Under the EMI Programme collection of data is done following the 'establishment reporting system'. The establishments are required to furnish at regular intervals details about the number of persons they employ by sex, vacancies that have occurred and the type of persons which are in short supply. This information relates only to "employers" and "employees". Employers include owners, proprietors, managers, working partners, or directors of firms/ companies who work full time for the firms/companies.

GEOGRAPHICAL COVERAGE:

3.4 The EMI Programme is being implemented in all the States and Union Territories of the country except Arunachal Pradesh, Sikkim, Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Lakshadweep. The programme could not be extended to these States/U.Ts so far due to administrative reasons. The smaller establishments employing 10-24 persons in the private sector in metropolitan areas of Greater Bombay & Calcutta are also not being covered owing to administrative reasons.

REFERENCE PERIOD:

3.5 The EMI data are furnished by the establishments through ER-I & ER-II returns. The form ER-I is used for the collection of information from the establishments at quarterly intervals i.e. 31st March, 30th June, 30th September and 31st December of each year.

ORGANISATION OF THE PROGRAMME:

3.6 The information collected through ER-I is scrutinised, tabulated and disseminated at the Area, State and National levels. The Employment Exchanges prepare Area Employment Market Reviews to indicate employment situation in the organised sector within the district. The State Directors of Employment also prepare State level Employment Reviews showing the employment situation prevailing at the State level. At the national level, Employment Reviews are prepared annually by the Directorate General of Employment and Training projecting the overall picture of employment in the organised sector in different States and U.Ts. The present Employment Review provides information regarding employment in the organised sector at the end of the year 1994-95. The National Industrial Classification (NIC) 1987 was followed in classifying the employment data by industries.

<u>LIMITATIONS OF EMI DATA:</u>

- 3.7 The EMI Programme does not cover:
 - (a) Employment in the un-organised sector.
 - (b) Self-employment
 - (c) Part-time employment.
 - (d) Employment in agriculture and allied establishments which furnish employment returns only on voluntary basis.
 - (e) Employment in house-hold sector and non-agricultural establishments employing less than 10 workers in private sector.
 - (f) Employment in defence forces.
 - (g) Employment in Indian Embassies & Missions abroad.

3.8 Other limitations of the EMI Programme are:

- (a) The frame of establishments maintained at local Employment Exchanges is not comprehensive in certain cases due to non-inclusion of new and emerging establishments.
- (b) There is an element of estimation of employment in respect of non-responding establishments.
- (c) Employment created under the various employment/beneficiary oriented schemes/programmes viz. NREP, RLEGP, IRDP, TRYSEM. etc. might be erroneously reported under the EMI Programme.

COVERAGE OF ESTABLISHMENTS IN THE ORGANISED SECTOR AT THE END OF MARCH, 1995

- 3.9 On the basis of the information furnished by the Directorates of Employment in various States and Union Territories, there were 276718 establishments borne on the Employers' Register as on 31st March, 1995. Of these, the required employment returns were rendered by 208268 establishments both in the public and private sectors. The rate of response thus works out to 75.3% during the year 1994-95.
- 3.10 The coverage of public sector comprises establishments of Central Govt., State Govt. Quasi Govt. (Central), Quasi-Govt. (State) and Local Bodies. In the private sector, the establishments are grouped on the basis of the number of persons employed therein. Establishments employing 25 or more persons are categorised as "larger establishments" and those employing 10 to 24 persons are termed as "smaller establishments".

It is observed from the above table that for the period ended 31st March 1995 out of a total number of 163681 establishments in the public sector only 78.4% rendered the returns, whereas in the private sector, out of 113037 establishments 70.7% rendered their returns. The analysis of the rate of response reveals that in the public sector the highest 83.0% of the establishments in Local Bodies rendered employment return, followed by State Govt.(78.3%), Quasi-Govt.(Central) (78.1%), Quasi-Govt.(State)(78.0%) and Cerntal Govt. establishments (73.5%). In the Private Sector, 75.4% of the Larger Establishments and 66.6% of the Smaller Establishments had sent the employment returns for the period ended March, 1995.

ESTABLISHMENTS GROWTH DURING 1990-95

3.12 Table-4 below presents the growth of establishments by different branches/sizes of public and private sectors as on the 31st March of the years 1990 to 1995.

It is seen from the above Table that overall establishments as also those in the Public Sector continued to show positive growth during 1990-95 in almost all branches (except in Local Bodies) wherein fall was noticed alternately in the years 1991, 1993 & 1995. Establishments in the Private Sector also maintained positive growth except a marginal decrease in 1994. Further relative analysis of establishment data reflect that growth was phenomenal in State(Quasi) & Central(Quasi) Govts. and also in larger establishments being 21.2%, 19.0% and 15.8% respectively.

ZONEWISE ESTABLISHEMENTS GROWTH DURING 1990-95

The entire country has been divided into six Zones/Regions, viz., Northern Zone, Central Zone, Eastern Zone, North-Eastern Zone, Western Zone and Southern one. The Andaman & Nicobar Islands are outside the scheme of Zonal Councils embodied in the States Reorganisation Act, 1956. Table-5 below shows the number of establishments in the six zones and in the Union Territories of Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 1990-1995.

3.15 The above Table reveals that the maximum percentage increase of 13.5% in the number of establishments in the organised sector in 1995 over the year 1990 was recorded both in the Northern & Western Zones, followed by the Southern & North-Eastern Zones recording increase of 12.3% and 10.2% respectively. The number of establishments according to the States/Union Territories is presented in Annexure - I

ESTABLISHMENTS COVERED IN MAJOR INDUSTRIES/SERVICES

3.16 The distribution of establishments in the organised sector by Major Industry Divisions as on the 31st March of 1990 and 1995 is shown in Table-6 below:

Industries in the Secondary Sector recorded the highest increase of 28.3% in their number of establishments in which Electricity, Gas & Water establishments contributed highest growth of 17%. Almost all major Industrial Divisions (excepting Mining & Quarrying, Construction, Trading, Hotels & Restaurants) had recorded growth ranging between 5% and as high as 19.2% contributed by the establishments in the Financing, Insurance, Real States & Business Services. The breakup of number of establishments in the public and private sectors classified by industry groups is given in Annexure-II.

CHAPTER-IV

EMPLOYMENT IN THE ORGANISED SECTOR

During the year under review (1994-95) employment in the organised sector rose by 2.2%. The increase in employment during the preceding year (1993-94) was 0.7%. In absolute terms, employment in the organised sector had gone up from 273.75 lakhs at the end of March, 1994 to 279.87 lakhs at the end of March, 1995.

EMPLOYMENT GROWTH (1990-95)

4.2 The Sector-wise break-up of employment as on the 31st March of 1990 to 1995 and year wise percentage variations therefor are shown in the following Table-7.

It is revealed from the data contained in the above Table-7 that while employment in the public sector recorded an increase of 1.3% in 1995 over the year 1994, the increase in employment in the private sector was as high as 4.6% during the same period. It is further interesting to note that while overall employment in 1995 over 1990 registered an increase of 6.2%, the Private Sector recorded 9.6% increase, as against an increase of only 4.8% in the Public Sector in the two relevant years (say 1995 over 1990).

EMPLOYMENT BY PUBLIC SECTOR BRANCHES (1990-95)

4.3 The distribution of employment in different branches of the public sector as on the 31st March of 1990 to 1995 is indicated in Table-8 below:

An analysis of employment in 1995 over 1994 in different branches of the public sector reveals that the maximum rise in employment was observed in Quasi Govt. (Central)(5.6%), followed by State Govt. & Quasi Govt. (State) (0.8% each). Employment in Central Govt & Local Bodies, however, reflected fall of 0.9% and 0.4% respectively. The study of employment growth in the Public Sector during 1990-1995 indicates an overall increase of 4.8%, out of which Quasi Govt. (State) shared maximum increase of 13.5%, followed by Quasi Govt. (Central)(6.9%) and State Govt. (6.0%). Employment in Local Bodies and Central Govt. during 1995 over 1990, however, reflected a decrease of 3.0% & 1.2% respectively.

PRIVATE SECTOR EMPLOYMENT GROWTH (1990-95)

4.4 Employment in the private sector during 1990-1995 classified by size of establishments is shown in the following Table-9.

It will be observed from the above Table-9 that employment in larger and smaller establishments in the private sector as on the 31st March of 1995 over 1994 went up by 4.9% and 2.6% respectively. The overall increase in employment in the Private Sector was of the order of 4.6% during 1994-95. Further, it is encouraging to note that overall employment in the Private Sector in 1995 over 1990 registered an increase of 9.6% (10.1% in case of larger establishments and 5.6% in smaller establishments employing 10-24 workers.

Above data reveals that during 1994-95 all the zones (excepting Central & Eastern Zones) in the zountry recorded an increase in employment, the highest being 6.1% in the Western Zone followed by 4.7% in the Northern Zone and 1.6% in the Southern Zone. Both Central and Eastern Zones, however, reflected marginal fall of 0.4% and 0.7% respectively. An analysis of growth of employment as reflected by various zones during 1995 over 1990 show that highest growth was contributed by the Western Zone (10.4%) followed by the Northern Zone (10.2%), the Southern Zone (9.3%) and North Eastern Zone (8.6%). Only the Eastern Zone suffered a fall of 1.1% during 1990-95.

CHAPTER.V

EMPLOYMENT IN STATES AND UNION TERRITORIES

Employment in the organised sector in the country is spread over 28 States\Union Territories. Analysis of data with regard to employment in the organised sector by different Zones\Regions has already been made in Chapter IV. Each Zone\Region has a group of contiguous States\UTs. The main focus of analysis in this Chapter is on the trends of employment in the organised sector in various States\Union Territories under each Zone\Region.However, employment in different States\Union Territories under each of the six Zones is shown in Annexure III.

ZONEWISE CONTRIBUTIONS OF EMPLOYMENT TO THE TOTAL ORGANISED SECTOR EMPLOYMENT

An analysis of the Zonewise share of employment to the total employment in the organised sector indicates that the States in the Southern Zone contributed maximum share of 25.57% to the total employment (24.35% in the public sector and 28.44% in the private sector). States in the other three respective Zones (viz Eastern, Central & Northern Zones) had an overall share of 17.14% & 15.43% to the total employment in the organised sector. However, their share in the Public Sector was 18.51%, 17.99% & 16.48% respectively in these three cited zones in that order. On the other side, their corresponding share of employment in the total private sector worked out to 13.88%, 9.36% and 12.93% respectively for the Eastern, Central & Northern Zones.

NORTHERN ZONE

Haryana

Employment increased from 5.96 lakh in March 1990 to 7.14 lakh in March 1995, recording an increase of 19.8% in the State. Employment in the public sector increased from 3.97 lakh in March 1990 to 4.94 lakh in March 1995. Haryana State had a share of only 2.6% in the total employment as at the end of March. 1995.

Punjab

Employment had gone up from 7.87 lakhs in March, 1990 to 8.45 lakhs in March 1995 showing a rise of 7.4%. Both in public & private sectors employment had increased. The increase was from 5.66 lakh to 6.00 lakh i.e., 6.0% in the public sector and from 2.21 lakh to 2.45 lakh i.e., 10.9% in the private sector. The share of employment in Punjab was 3.02% to the total employment in the organised sector as at the end of March 1995.

Himachal Pradesh

Total employment in the State increased from 2.71 lakh in March, 1990 to 2.91 lakh in March, 1995 recording an increase of 7.4%. While employment in the public sector had gone up by 4.1% it increased by 33.3% in the private sector. Himachal Pradesh had a share of 1.04% in all India employment at the end of March 1995.

Chandigarh

Employment in the Union Territory increased from 0.74 lakh at the end of March, 1990 to 0.80 lakh at the end of March 1995 recording an increase of 8.1%. There was increase in employment in public sectors to the extent of 10.3%. This Union Territory contributed only 0.29% to the total organised sector employment at the all-India level as at the end of March, 1995.

Delhi

Employment in the State had gone up from 8.30 lakh at the end of March 1990 to 8.54 lakh at the end of March 1995, reflecting an increase of 2.9%. In the public sector the employment increased by 1.8% while in the private sector it went up by 6.2%. Delhi State contributed only 3.05% to the total organised sector employment at the all-India level as at the end of March, 1995.

Rajasthan

5.7 Employment in the State increased from 11.56 lakh in March 1990 to 13.22 lakh in March, 1995, showing a rise of 14.4%. In public sector, employment increased by 8.1%, whereas private sector employment increased by 39.6%. The share of the State in all-India employment was 4.72% as at the end of march 1995.

Jammu & Kashmir

Total employment in the State increased from 2.06 lakh in March, 1990 to 2.13 lakh in March, 1995 recording an increase of 3.4%. Employment in the Public Sector had gone up by 3.1%, whereas in the Private Sector the increase was 10.0%. The State had a share of 0.76% of all-India employment at the end of March, 1995.

CENTRAL ZONE

Madhya Pradesh

Total employment in Madhya Pradesh had gone up from 16.32 lakh in March, 1990 to 16.71 lakh in March, 1995, recording an increase of 2.4% Public Sector employment had increased from 13.93 lakh in 1990 to 14.27 lakh in 1995 whereas Private Sector employment went up from 2.40 lakh in 1990 to 2.44 lakh in 1995 showing an increase of 2.4% and 1.7% respectively. The State had a share of 5.97% in the all India employment as at the end of March 1995.

Uttar Pradect

Organised sector employment in the State decreased from 26.75 lakh in March 1990 to 26.47 lakh in March 1995 recording a fall of 1.0%. Employment in the Public Sector decreased by 1.1%, and employment in the Private Sector dropped by 0.6%. The state accounted a share of 9.46% in all-India employment as at the end of March, 1995.

NORTH-EASTERN ZONE

Assam

Organised sector employment in the State increased from 10.23 lakh in March, 1990 to 10.93 lakh in March, 1995, recording an increase of 6.8%. Employment in the public sector increased by 8.6% whereas private sector employment went up by 5.0%. The State had a share of 3.91% in the all-India employment in 1995.

Meghalaya

5.12 Employment in the State increased from 0.67 lakh in March, 1990 to 0.73 lakh in March, 1995 showing an increase of 9.0%. There was rise of 8.1% in the level of employment in public sector and 20.0% in the private sector. This state had a share of only 0.26% in the all-India employment as on 31st March 1995.

Manipur

5.13 Organised sector employment in the State had gone up by 32.1% in 1995 as compared to 1990. Employment in the public sector recorded an increase of 30.8% but an increase of 100.0% was recorded in the private sector employment during the period under review. Manipur had a meager share of 0.25% in the total organised sector employment in the country as at the end of March 1995.

Mizoram

Employment in the State increased from 0.31 lakh in 1990 to 0.40 lakh in 1995 recording an increase of 29.0%. In the public sector, employment had gone up from 0.30 lakh in 1990 to 0.38 lakh in 1995 showing an increase of 26.7%. In the private sector however, the employment remained stagnant. The State's share as in March 1995 in the all-India organised sector employment was only 0.14%.

Nagaland

5.15 Total employment in the organised sector in the State increased from 0.62 lakh in March 1990 to 0.70 lakh in March 1995 showing an increase of 12.9%. In the public sector the employment increased by 11.7% and in the private sector it increased by 50.0% Nagaland had a small share of 0.25% in the total organised sector employment of 1995 in the country.

Tripura

Organised sector employment in the State showed an increase from 94 thousand at the end of March 1990 to 99 thousand at the end of March 95, recording a growth of 5.3%. The public sector employment registered an increase of 8.2% but the private sector suffered a fall of 33.3%. Tripura had a small share of 0.35% in the total employment of organised sector in the country.

EASTERN ZONE

Bihar

5.17 Employment in the organised sector in the State had increased from 16.59 lakh in March 1990 to 17.09 lakh in March 1995 showing an increase of 3.0% Sector-wise, employment in the public and private sector increased by 2.4% & 6.5% respectively. The organised sector employment in the state formed 6.11% of the total employment at the all-India level during the year ended March 1995.

Orissa

Total employment in the organised sector in the State registered an increase from 7.41 lakh in March 1990 to 7.84 lakh in March 1995, recording a rise of 5.8%. Employment in the public sector increased by 9.1% but private sector suffered a fall of 14.2% in its employment. The share of employment in the State was 2.8% in the total organised sector employment in the country.

West Bengal

The organised sector employment in the State showed decrease as employment being 24.51 lakh in March 1990 actually receded to 23.03 lakh in March 1995 registering a decrease of 6.0%. While employment in the public sector decreased by 2.9%, the private sector reflected a fall of 11.6% during 1990-95. The overall employment in the State accounted for 8.23% of the total organised sector employment at the all-India level in March, 1995.

WESTERN ZONE

Gujarat

Employment in the organised sector in the State was 18.08 lakh in March, 1995 as compared to 16.29 lakh in the March, 1990. The increase in the organised sector employment was thus 11.0%. In public and private sectors the increase in employment was of the order of 3.2% and 21.2% respectively. The total organised sector employment in the State accounted for 6.46% of the total employment at the all-India level as at the end of March, 1995.

Maharashtra

In the Western Zone, Maharashtra state has an important role in employment generation. Employment in the organised sector in the State increased from 36.39 lakh in March 1990 to 40.01 lakh in March, 1995, showing an increase of 9.9%. In public and private sectors, the increase in employment was 12.1% and 6.5% respectively. Public and private sector had a share of 12.9% and 17.7% respectively of total employment in the respective sectors, whereas total organised sector employment in the State constituted 14.30% of the total organised sector employment at the all-India level during the year ended March, 1995.

Goa

The total organised sector employment had gone up from 92 thousand in March 1990 to 106 thousand in March, 1995 showing an increase of 15.2%. The increase in employment was 7.9% in the public sector and 27.6% in the private sector. The State accounted for only 0.4% of the total organised sector employment at the all-India level.

ľ

SOUTHERN ZONE

Andhra Pradesh

Employment in the organised sector in the State had gone up from 17.28 lakh in March, 1990 to 19.18 lakh in March, 1995 recording a growth of 11.0%. The employment growth was 6.3% and 28.1% respectively in the public and private sectors. As compared the all India Employment figures, the State accounted for 7.36% and 5.66% in the publ and private sectors respectively and 6.85% in the total organised sector employment in the country.

Karnataka

Organised sector employment in the State went up from 14.08 lakh in March 1990 to 15.91 lakh in March 1995 showing a rise of 13.0%. Sector wise, employment increased in the public sector by 4.4% and by 35.0% in the private sector. The share of Karnataka in all-India employment was 5.69% in the organised sector at the end of March 1995.

Kerala

The total organised sector employment in the state had increased from 11.22 lakh at the end of March 1990 to 11.76 lakh at the end of March 1995, recording an increase of 4.8%. In the public sector employment had fallen by 0.8% while it increased by only 12.1% in the private sector. As compared to organised sector employment at the all India level, Kerala contributed 3.15% and 6.70% in public and private sectors respectively, and 4.2% of the total organised sector employment as at the end of March 1995.

Pondicherry

Employment in the organised sector in the Union Territory had increased from 52 thousand in March 1990 to 55 thousand in March 1995, recording an increase of 5.8% during the period under review. The employment growth in the public and private sectors was of the order of 4.8% and 10.0% respectively. The overall employment in the Union Territory was 0.2% of the all India employment in the organised sector.

Tamil Nadu

Among the southern states, employment in Tamilnadu was the highest. In this state, organised sector employment went up from 22.40 lakh in March 1990 to 24.15 lakh in March 1995, indicating an employment growth of 7.8%. The public and private sector employment had registered an increase of 5.8% and 12.2% respectively. The proportion of organised sector employment as a whole to all-India employment was 8.63% during the year under review.

Andaman & Nicobar Islands

This Union Territory is outside the Zonal classification as per the States Reorganisation Act. Employment data in the organised sector, however, show that the public sector employment increased from 31 thousand in March 1990 to 32 thousand in March 1995, recording an increase of 3.2%. In the private sector, employment was almost stagnant.

CHAPTER-VI

EMPLOYMENT IN INDUSTRIES/SERVICES

A broad picture about the structure of employment in the organised sector in different Industries/Services grouped under Primary, Secondary and Tertiary Sectors as on the 31st March of 1990 to 1995 is presented in the following Table:-

It will be observed from the above Table-11 that during 1990-95 Primary Sector comprising Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry and Fishing and Mining & Quarrying Industry Divisions showed an over-all increase of only 2.6% in the employment. Under this sector, Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry and Fishing recorded growth of 1.1%, whereas the increase under Mining & Quarrying Division was 4.5%.

- Employment growth during 1990-95 in the Secondary Sector was 5.0%. Under this sector, Electricity, Gas and Water Division recorded an employment growth rate of 7.2%. Manufacturing Division contributed an increase of 4.6%. Employment in Construction Industry, however, showed a marginal increase of about 1.4%.
- 6.3 The overall increase in employment in the Tertiary Sector was 7.7%. All industries in this Division recorded employment growth, the highest being in Financing, Insurance, Real Estate and Business Services (18.1%). Details of employment in the organised sector by Industry Divisions under Public and Private Sectors as on the 31st March of 1990 and 1995 are shown in Annexure-VI.

EMPLOYMENT IN PUBLIC SECTOR BY MAJOR INDUSTRY DIVISIONS

- The data on employment classified by Industry Divisions and branches of Public Sector as on the 31st March of 1990 and 1995 are contained in Annexure-V. Branch-wise distribution of employment in Public Sector shows that under Central Government, all Industry Divisions recorded increase in employment excepting marginal decreases noticed under Manufacturing (Division 2 & 3),(-2.7%); Electricity, Gas & Water (Division 4) (-7.3%), Construction (Division 5) (-0.7%); and in the Transport, Storage & Communication (Division 7) (-2.6%).
- Under the State Govt. Major industry divisions which suffered decrease in employment included Divisions 0,1,2 & 3 and 8 viz Agriculture (-3.3%), Mining(-11.9%), Manufacturing(-11.2%) and Financing Insurance & Business Services(-0.6%). Appreciable increase of 80.2% was noticed during 1990-95 in the State Government under Wholesale & Retail Trade and Restaurants & Hotels division, followed by 13.7% increase in the employment under Electricity, Gas and Water division and 7.4% growth in employment under Community, Social & Personal Services Sector.
- 6.6 In the case of establishments of Central Govt (Quasi), employment-growth of 21% each during 1990-95 was recorded in Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry and Fishing(Division 0) and in the Electricity, Gas and Water(Division 4) and 26.2% in Transport, Storage and Communications (Division 7) and 18.4% in the Financing, Insurance, Real Estate & Business Services (Division 8). The Industry Divisions under Central Govt. (Quasi) which recorded decline in employment during 1990-95 were Manufacturing (-2.2%), Construction (-10%) and Community, Social and Personal Services (-5.8%).
- 6.7 In State Govt. (Quasi) Sector, the increase in employment was universally observed in all industry divisions, except a decrease of 1.5% and 9.8% noticed in the two Mining & Quarrying and Manufacturing Divisions.

6.8 Under Local Bodies, employment during 1990-95 registered a decrease of 4.7% each in the Electricity, Gas & Water (Division 4) and in the Community, Social and Personal Services (Division 9). All other Industry Divisions registered significant gains in employment, particularly 64.7% increase in Manufacturing Division, 20.4% increase in Construction Division and 31.3% increase in Transport, Storage & Communications Division, as may be seen from the contents of data in Annexure-V.

EMPLOYMENT IN PRIVATE SECTOR BY MAJOR INDUSTRY DIVISIONS:

by Act and Non-Act Establishments, by Industries/ Services Divisions, shows that amongst Act Establishments only two Industry Division (4 & 5) viz Electricity Gas & Water and Construction Division suffered fall in employment. An increase in employment was recorded in all other Industry Division, maximum (24.5%) recorded in Financing, Insurance, Real Estates & Business Services, followed by 251.5% in the case of Transport, Storage & Communications and 21.3% in Community Social & Personal Services. In so far as Industry-wise composition of employment under Non-Act Establishments in the Private Sector is concerned, all industry divisions registered gains, except fall noticed in the case of Divisions 1,5 and 6 (namely Mining & Quarrying (-8.6%), Construction (-14.6%) and Wholesale & Retail Trade and Hotels & Restaurants(-3.8%).

EMPLOYMENT IN KEY INDUSTRIES

6.10 The Organised sector employment in four key industries comprising Coal, Cement, Iron & Steel and Generation and Transmission of Electric Energy during 1990-95 is analysed on the basis of the data contained in the following Table-12:

The above data reveals that growth of employment in the manufacture of Iron & Steel in primary & semi finished forms was relatively appreciable being 20.9%, which in the case of generation & transmission of electric energy registered only an increase of 8.6% in 1995 over 1990.

6.11 Transport industry is an important constituent of employment in the organised sector. The following Table-13 shows the growth of employment in Transport Sector as was observed on the 31st March of 1995 over 1990.

It may be observed further from the data contained in the above Table-13, that employment in Passenger transport by bus and in Air Transport Carriers (of passengers and freight) registered respective increases of 9.7% and 4.6%, but contrarily employment growth was registered as negative in Inland water transport, Ocean & coastal water transport as also in the Rail Transportation.

6.12 The growth of employment in Banking and Financial Institutions during 1990 & 1995 is indicated in Table-14 below:

The above data shows that employment in Banking and Financial institutions registered lowest growth of 14.1% in deposit activities (Banking) and highest growth of 38.4% in Insurance Carriers (other than life) and 36.8% in Life insurance carriers. Even the employment in other credit activities reflected an increase of 32.1% during 1990-95.

6.13 Educational services, Research and Scientific services and Health and Medical services mainly comprise the Services Sector. Data in Table-15 below indicates growth of employment in the Services Sector during 1990-1995.

It is interesting to observe that while employment in Health and Medical Services contributed a substantial increase of 11.8%, the Educational Services rendered by Non Technical Colleges, Schools etc and those rendered by Technical or Vocational Colleges/Schools and other institutions registered a growth of 8.6% and 2.8% respectively in 1995 over 1990.

CHAPTER - VII

WOMEN'S EMPLOYMENT

7.1 Employment of women constitutes an important component of the organised sector employment in the country. The employment of women in the organised sector has continuously been rising over the last several years. At the end of the 31st March 1995 the employment of women constituted 15.4% to the total employment in the organised sector in the country. An overview of women's employment is given in the following Table-16.

It may be observed from the above Table that women's employment in the organised sector went up from 27.93 lakh in 1980-81 to 43.04 lakh in 1994-95.

- 7.2 The increase in women employment during the year under review (1994-95) was of the order of 3.6% as compared to 3.2% during the preceding year (1993-94). It may be further seen from Table-16 that the percentage of women's employment to total employment in the organised sector has risen steadily from 12.2 in 1980-81 to 15.4 in 1994-95.
- 7.3 The employment of women in public and private sectors as on the 31st March of 1990 to 1995 and percentage changes between these years are presented in the following Table-17.

It may be observed from data in the above Table that out of a total of 43.04 lakh women employees in the organised sector at the end of March, 1995, 26.16 lakh were in the Public Sector and the remaining 16.88 lakh in the Private Sectors registering a growth of 21.5% and 18.1% respectively in 1995 over 1990.

BRANCH-WISE AND SIZE-WISE COMPOSITION OF WOMEN'S EMPLOYMENT

7.4 The distribution of women's employment by different branches of public sector and by size of establishments in the private sector is presented in Table-18 below.

It is interesting to note that the growth of women's employment was relatively as higher as 21.5% in the relate sector, as compared to only 16.0% in the Public Scales during 1990-1995. Branch-wise distribution of women's employment in the public sector further shows that the maximum increase was recorded in State Govt. (Quasi) (29.2%), followed by Central Govt. (Quasi) (27.7%), State Govt. (18.6%), Central Govt (11.7%) and Local Bodies (2.2%). In the private sector, women's employment also registered an appreciable & substantial growth of 17.6% in "Smaller Establishments" and 22.1% in "Larger Establishments" during 1990-95.

ZONEWISE GROWTH OF WOMEN'S EMPLOYMENT (1990-95)

7.5 The women's employment in the organised sector by different zones (including their dispersal in various States/Union Territories) is presented in Annexure - IX. Based on data, the following Table - 19 shows zones-wise growth of women's employment during 1990-95.

It is equally satisfying to observe that women's employment has been reflecting an increasing trend in all six Zones of the country (excluding Andaman and Nicobar Islands). Highest increase of 25.1% was recorded in the Southern Zone followed by 20.2% in the Western Zone, 14.8% in the Northern Zone, 9.8% in the Central Zone and 9.5% in the North-Eastern Zone. Even Andaman & Nicobar Islands registered 6.5% increase in 1995 over 1990.

- 7.6 The distribution of women employees by States/U.Ts cross-classified by public and private sectors as on the 31st March, 1990 and 1995 is contained in Annexure IX. It may be observed from data in Annexure IX that the employment of women showed an upward trend in all the States/UTs of the country (during 1994-95) barring exception of Kerala and Madhya Pradesh.
- 7.7 The distribution of women's employment by major industries as on the 31st March of 1990 to 1995 is given below in Table-20:

An analysis of data on women's employment contained in the Table 20 above reveals that there was increase in women's employment in all Industry Divisions, barring Mining & Quarrying, which alone registered a slight fall of 0.1%. An analysis of the growth of women's employment reflects that Financing, Insurance, Real Estates & Business Services (Division 8) registered highest growth of 37.6% in 1995 over 1990 followed by Manufacturing (29.1%), Electricity, Gas & Water (28.3%), Wholesale & Retail Trading including Hotels & Restaurants (22.9%), Transport, Storage & Communications Services (22.3%) and Community, Social & Personal Services (17.3%).

CHAPTER-VIII

LABOUR MARKET

- 8.1 Generally, Labour Market is termed as an area where workers in search of employment and employers in need of workers come in contact with each other or meet. This may be local, regional, provincial, national or even inter-national. The proper appraisal of the Labour Market envisages a regular study of the various economic, social, institutional and cultural factors such as quantum and composition of the labour force, level of education, training and skills, behavioral aspects of job-seekers and employers, mobility, recruitment practices, prevailing wage levels, traditions and institutional barriers, etc.
- In this Chapter, an attempt has been made to bring together data flowing from day-to-day operations of the National Employment Service relating to work-seekers, vacancies notified, etc. and the Employment Market Information (EMI) Programme of the D.G.E.&T., Ministry of Labour, Government of India regarding the number of persons employed, as both these sets of data taken together have a close bearing on the labour market situation prevailing in our country.
- 8.3 The Employment Exchange statistics provide only a broad indication of the unemployment situation in the organised labour market. Before drawing any conclusions the following limitations of the Employment Exchange statistics as indicators of unemployment in the country must be kept in mind:-
 - (i) All persons registered with the Employment Exchanges are not necessarily unemployed. Quite a number of them are already in employment and have registered their names for better and more suitable jobs.
 - (ii) Registration being voluntary, all unemployed persons do not register themselves with the Employment Exchanges.
 - (iii) Some work-seekers registered at the Employment Exchanges who secure employment subsequently through sources other than the Exchanges do not get their names de-registered.
 - (iv) Many persons residing in rural areas also register themselves with Employment Exchanges, but as the Employment Exchanges are located in urban areas, the rural registrants are not likely to get properly represented in the live Register.
 - (v) Many students, who normally are not considered a part of the labour force, also register themselves for employment assistance primarily with a view to gaining seniority in registration.
 - (vi) Some work-seekers register their names with more than one Employment Exchange.

GENERAL LEVEL OF UNEMPLOYMENT

On the basis of the data available from the 50th Round of the NSS (1993-94), unemployment was estimated to be 11.53 million according to Usual Principal Status (UPS), 14.35 million according to Weekly Status (WS) and 6508 million person days according to Daily Status(DS). As a percentage of the Labour Force, unemployment according to the three concepts works out to 2.56, 4.28 and 6.03 respectively (Table 21). The unemployment rates are much higher for the urban, than for the rural areas, and for women than for men. For example, unemployment rate according to UPS was 5.21 percent for the urban and 1.79 percent for the rural areas, and 8.21% for females and 4.54% for males in the urban areas. The unemployment rates in the rural area, according to UPS for male, is more than females i.e unemployment rate according to UPS was 1.96 percent for males and 1.40 percent for females

<u>UPS</u>-Usual Principal Status. A person is considered unemployed according to this concept if he/she was available for work but without work for a major part of the year.

WS- Weekly Status. A person is considered unemployed according to this concept if he/she though being available for work did not have work even for one hour during the reference week.

<u>DS</u>- Daily Status. It is a measure of unemployment in terms of person days of unemployment of all the persons in the Labour force during the reference week.

The absolute magnitude of unemployment has, of course, been increasing over the years; but open unemployment rates have also been rising ir recent years. Unemployment rates according to UPS criterion decreased from 3.77 percent in 1987-88 to 2.56 percent in 1993-94 and according to WS from 4.80 percent to 4.28 percent. Unemployment rate by

daily status criterion has also shown a decline from 6.09 percent to 6.03 percent over this period. These trends suggest that while the total unemployed labour (in person days as measured by daily status concept) has shown a decline as a percentage of the Labour Force, the percentage of unemployed has increased. In other words, the structure of unemployment seems to be shifting from the predominance of underemployment towards rise in open unemployment.

- 8.6 Within the broad trends towards an increasingly open and chronic character of unemployment the following features may be considered of special significance. For one, this trend is seen to be particularly strong in the case of rural areas, where Usual Status unemployment has decreased from 3.07 percent of Labour Force in 1987-88 to 1.79 percent in 1993-94, and Daily Status unemployment has increased from 5.25 percent to 5.61 percent. In urban areas, only a small change in the open (usual status) unemployment rate was observed from 6.56 to 5.21, so also in the Daily Status unemployment rate from 9.26 to 7.43 percent. Secondly, the trend in the increased incidence of open unemployment was stronger in the case of women than men. The usual status rate of unemployment decreased from 3.52 in 1987-88 to 1.40 percent in 1993-94 among rural women workers but the decrease in the case of rural male workers was from 2.87 to 1.96 percent. In the urban areas also, the open unemployment rate decreased in the case of women and men. Thirdly, the differences between the usual status and daily status unemployment rates were almost same in the case of women and in the case of men, which implies that underemployment is in same proportion of overall unemployment in the case of women as in case of men.
- 8.7 The most comprehensive measure of incidence of the unemployment is the one based on the daily status concept, as it includes all the person days of unemployment of those openly unemployed as well as of the underemployed. According to this measure, the unemployment rate in the country during 1993-94 was 6.03% of the labour force as against 6.09% in 1987-88. The unemployment rates (DS), among the major states, was highest in Kerala during 1993-94; the rates were 14.7% and 17.7% in its rural and urban areas respectively, the corresponding all India rates being 5.6% and 7.4% in rural and urban areas respectively. In this state the rates among males and females were 13.1% and 19.0% in rural and 14.1% and 27.8% respectively, in urban areas. The states followed by Kerala were Tamil Nadu, West Bengal, Orissa and Andhra Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh had the lowest unemployment rate (3.1% and 4.8% in rural and urban areas respectively). Next lowest was in Madhya Pradesh, 2.6% and 6.8% in rural and urban areas respectively.

WORK-SEEKERS

8.8 The number of work-seekers on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges in the country has gone up from 270.34 lakh at the end of March, 1986 to 366.35 lakh at the end of March, 1995. The number of men and women on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges and the percentage changes over the years are presented in the following Table:-

It will be observed from the above Table-22 that there has been an increase in the number of job seekers registered with the Employment Exchanges over the years from 1986 to 1995. However, during the period under review (1994-95), the number of work-seekers registered with the Employment Exchanges has gone up from 360.39 lakh at the end of March,1994 to 366.35 lakh at the end of March,1995, recording an increase of 1.7%. In the case of male registrants there was an increase of 1.4%, whereas female registrants increased by 2.7% during the period under review. The number of work seekers at the end of March,1994 and 1995 by States/U.Ts. is contained in Annexure.XI

DISTRIBUTION OF EDUCATED JOB-SEEKERS

8.9' All types of persons approaching Employment Exchanges for seeking employment assistance are registered by the Employment Exchanges in accordance with their educational qualifications and skills. Educated job-seekers i.e. those who are matriculates and above form a significant segment on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges. Providing employment to educated job seekers poses relatively a more intricate problem than to those in the uneducated category as educated people are generally desirous of seeking mostly white-collar jobs. The following Table 23.presents the number of educated job-seekers classified by sex and educational qualifications:

It will be seen from above data that as on 31.12.93 out of 3958.3 thousand graduate and post-graduate job seekers, 3479.1 thousand were graduate and 479.1 thousand post-graduate. As regards women work seekers, out of 1203.0 thousand graduate and post-graduate, 1018.9 thousand were graduate and the remaining 184.1 thousand were post-graduate. Faculty-wise analysis of graduate job-seekers reveals that 1376 thousand were degree holders in Arts, followed by 676 thousand in Science, 607 thousand in Commerce and 522 thousand in Education. The number of registrants holding degree in Engineering, Agriculture, Medicine and other faculties was much less as compared to registrants holding degrees in Arts, Science, Commerce and Education. Faculty-wise composition of women job-seekers reveals that the number of women job-seekers holding degrees in almost all the disciplines except science had gone up considerably during 1993. Out of 479 thousand post-graduate registrants, 237 thousand were post-graduates in Arts, 100 thousand in Science, 66 thousand in Commerce and 37 thousand in Education. The number of post-graduate job-seekers in the remaining faculties was less as compared to above faculties. Faculty-wise distribution of women post-graduate job-seekers reveals increase in favour of all the disciplines.

DISTRIBUTION OF JOB-SEEKERS BY ZONES/REGIONS

- 8.11 There were approximately 366 lakh work-seekers on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges as on 31st March, 1995. The total number of educated job seekers as on 31st Dec. 1993 was around 236 lakh.

Analysis of data contained in the above Table shows that during 1994-95 the total number of work-seekers registered highest increase of 7.7% in the Eastern Zone followed by Central Zone (5.3%), Western Zone(1.7%). However, their number recorded significant decrease in the North Eastern Zone (-7.7%), Southern Zone (1.9%) and Northern Zone (-0.5%). Among the stock of educated work seekers during 1992-93 the Southern Zone reflected highest increase (7.6%) followed by 3% in the North Eastern Zone. A decrease of 2.8% in the case of educated work seekers on Live Register in the Employment Exchanges of States in Central Zone is a special feature.

Data in the preceding Table shows that about 58.6 lakh work-seekers got themselves registered with the Employment Exchanges in the year 1995. A continuing fall in the number of vacancies notified to the Employment Exchanges by various employers over the last ten years from 1986 to 1995 appear to be an alarming feature reflecting dis-popularity of their services in its placement activities. The number of registrants placed in suitable employment has also shown a declining trend year after year.

It will be seen from the above data that out of 490.9 thousand vacancies notified to the Employment Exchanges, 148.5 thousand (30.3%) were meant for Professional & Technical workers 148.0 thousand (30.1%) for Production and Related Workers and Transport Equipment Operators, 110.1 thousand (22.4%) for Clerical and Sales Workers (excluding Typists),49.3 thousand(10.1%) for Service Workers. Around (6.8%) 33 thousand vacancies belonged to other occupational categories.

VACANCIES OPEN TO FRESHERS

Though the job-seekers classified as freshers (say in-experienced or untrained) comprise a high proportion in the Live Registers of Employment Exchanges, not all vacancies notified to various Employment Exchanges and other recruitment agencies such as Staff Selection Commission, Railway Recruitment Board, Banking Services Recruitment Board, U.P.S.C., State-Public Service Commissions etc. are open to freshers (i.e. without work experience and training). The job opportunities in various fields of economic activity which are open to freshers, especially those having professional and technical qualifications and notified to the recruiting agencies mentioned above is another important aspect of the labour market situation.

8.17 Table-29 gives the total number of vacancies notified to the Employment Exchanges during 1990-91 by Faculty, those open to freshers (Degree and Diploma holders) and their percentage. These include not only the vacancies which were notified to the various Employment Exchanges in the country but also those falling under the jurisdictions of the U.P.S.C., State Public Service Commissions, Railway Service Commission and Subordinate Service Commission, etc.

It will be observed from the data contained in the above Table- 29 that the proportion of vacancies open to freshers decreased from 79.3% during 1990 to 67.5% during 1991.

Among the Faculties, the proportion of vacancies open to freshers to the total vacancies notified was the highest in Social Science (90.2%), followed by 'Natural Science (78.0%), Agriculture (63.4%), Technology (42.4%), Medicine (40.1%), and Engineering (19.2%).

It will be noticed from data in the above Table that at the end of June, 1993, there were 49.7 lakh Scheduled caste job-seekers and 13.3 lakh Scheduled tribe job-seekers on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges. The number of S.C. job-seekers recorded an increase of 3.6% and the number of S.T. job-seekers increased by 6.1% in 1993 over 1992. The large chunk of such work-seekers were below matriculates (including illiterates), followed by matriculates. It would be seen from above data that the percentage placement of women to the total female registrants during 1986-1995 was in the range of 3.2% to 5.4%. In fact the data in
