EMPLOYMENT GENERATION PROGRAMMES

1343. SHRI KODIKUNNIL SURESH:

Will the Minister of LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has implemented programmes and schemes for employment generation and if so, the details thereof, State wise;**
- (b) the funds allocated and utilised for such programmes during the last five years and the current year;**
- (c) whether the Government is seized of the percentage of employment generation and unemployment through studies of CMIE, NSSO, and periodic labour force participation survey in the country during the last five years and the current year; and**
- (d) if so, the details thereof?**

ANSWER

**MINISTER OF STATE FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT

(a) & (b): Employment generation coupled with improving employability is the priority of the Government. Government has taken various steps for generating employment in the country like encouraging various projects involving substantial investment and increasing public expenditure on schemes like Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP), Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS), Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY) and Deendayal Antodaya Yojana-National Urban Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NULM) run by Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises, Ministry of Rural Development and Ministry of Housing & Urban Affairs, respectively. State/UT-wise detail of the progress of the schemes is at Annexure-I-IV.

Aatmanirbhar Bharat Rojgar Yojana (ABRY) was launched with effect from 1st October, 2020 as part of Atmanirbhar Bharat package 3.0 to incentivize employers for creation of new employment along with social security benefits and restoration of loss of employment during Covid-19 pandemic. This scheme being implemented through Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO), seeks to reduce the financial burden of the employers and encourages them to hire more workers. The terminal date for registration of beneficiaries has been extended from 30.06.2021 to 31.03.2022. As on 27.11.2021, benefit has been provided to 39.59 lakh beneficiaries through 1.16 lakh establishments. State-wise detail of the progress of the scheme is at Annexure-V.

The margin money subsidy disbursed under PMEGP for the last five year and current year (2016-17 to 2020-21 (till 15.11.2021) is Rs. 994649.69 lakh.

Under Mahatma Gandhi NREGA, no State/UT-wise financial allocation is made. The central fund released in the last five year (2017-18 to 2021-22 (as on 02.11.2021)) under the scheme is Rs. 368494.68 crore.

The budget allocation and funds released under DDU-GKY for the last five years and current year as on 31.10.2021 is Rs. 776884.1 lakh and utilized is Rs. 576683 lakh.

The Central fund released under DAY-NULM during last five years and the current year (2016-17 to 2021-22 ((till 15.11.2021) is Rs. 3,295.94 crore.

(c) & (d): As per the results of Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) conducted by National Statistical Office (NSO), Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation during 2018-19 and 2019-20, the estimated Unemployment Rate (UR) and Worker Population Ratio (WPR) on usual status basis for 15 years and above during 2017-18, 2018-19 and 2019-20 is as follow:

Recently Government has launched All-India Quarterly Establishment Based Employment Survey (AQEES) in April, 2021. As per the result of the first round of Quarterly Employment Survey for the period April to June 2021, employment increased to 3.8 crore in the nine selected sectors of the economy against a total of 2.37 crores in these sectors taken collectively, as reported in the sixth Economic Census (2013-14) reflecting a growth rate of 29%. The most impressive growth of 152 percent has been recorded in the IT/BPO sector, while growth rate in Health is 77 percent, in Education it is 39 percent, in Manufacturing it is 22 percent, in Transport it is 68 percent and in Construction it is 42 percent.
