DECLINE IN LABOUR FORCE PARTICIPATION RATE

557. SHRI MALLIKARJUN KHARGE:

Will the Minister of LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that as per the data of the Centre for Monitoring Indian Economy (CMIE), the labour force participation rate has dropped from 47% in the year 2016 to less than 40% in the year 2022;
- (b) if so, the reason for such a large number of people dropping out of the labour force;
- (c) the difference in methodology of CMIE and the Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) survey;
- (d) whether the data for PLFS survey for 2020-21 has been prepared; and if so, reason for data not yet made public and by when it will be published?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI RAMESWAR TELI)

- (a) & (b): The authentic data on Employment and Unemployment is collected through Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) conducted by the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) since 2017-18. The survey period is July to June of next year. As per the available annual reports of PLFS 2020-21, the estimated Labour Force Participation Rate (LFPR) on usual status for persons of age 15 years and above has increased to 54.9% in 2020-21 as compared to 49.8% in 2017-18.
- (c): Many private companies/bodies/research organizations conduct different surveys based on their own methodology. CMIE is one amongst them.
- (d) & (e): PLFS Report for the year 2020-21 has been released and available in public domain.
